From our FCF President

Well it is already time to look at Family Days, Winter Camp and Brush Poppin. We are all preparing for National Rendezvous in July and by the time you read this we have 25 more new members of FCF from the FBC adventure camp at JLTA. We have been very busy and YOUR staff and I have been working very hard. Please pray for us.

Having said that and talking to another young man, it occurs to me that too many men and young men are declining their calling. God has called all of us. Some wear multiple hats. This is O.K., but it is not because they want too many times, it is because someone who should have listened to the call of leadership did not. Someone whom God called said "NO." Look in your churches, your communities, and your workplace. Many times effective leaders are over—worked, over—burdened, and there is very little support. It is not that God has called them to such a life but that someone else would not answer the call. It is very easy to say no. Sometimes there are those who do need to say no. Yet I see more times than not men just not stepping up and letting God lead through them. I see this in churches all over our great nation. Less than 20% do over 80% of the work. In my own church I teach Rangers, I am the outpost coordinator, the children's pastor, and am on the worship team as the only drummer. And on top of that, I serve as the district FCF president.

This is not to say that I want all this but I refuse to leave my pastor in the lurch because someone shirked their responsibility to answer the call. What many are slowly realizing is in our communities the lack of godly leaders stepping up in politics has caused a void in the leaders who are even available to be voted for, and instead of it being about what it should be, it is a vote for the lesser of 2 evils. We need godly men to step up and lead in every area of life. We need mentors who mentor the attributes of a godly man allowing God to lead others thru him. I believe this Royal Ranger ministry can help. First, we need some good men and young men to answer the call and step up take the mantel and know it is not about them and their desires but about God and Him leading thru them for the good of all God's people. Pray if you have said no and you find in your heart that God wants you to step up, repent, and do as God asks. Your boys need you...your pastor needs you...our churches need you...our communities need you...other men need your example to following God.... It will mean sacrifice, it will mean your family sacrifices, but they become part of the ministry that God has laid on you as they share your time with others. I am grateful for the staff that helps me. Without them answering the call I would struggle more than I already do; they are a blessing to me as well as to you. They are all men chasing after God and I am especially grateful for the young men who stepped up and answered the call of leadership and tested for scout....Thank you, one and all.

Many of you are seeing exactly what I am talking about in all the areas and more that I have mentioned. We need to inspire others to step up and lead.

A several of years ago a young man I was mentoring was struggling very hard in several areas of his life. He was always angry and easily set off. Small things were made big. You get the idea. This young man was actually not wanting to do what God was asking of him. He was saying no but his spirit was troubling him; he was being convicted! When I asked "are you running from God over something?" He broke down, confessed and I was able to mentor him.

He went on to successfully make his wilderness advancement. Later he was struggling again more due to being tired and just wanting to rest. He stepped up and was again successful in his trying time and had victory over the enemy who did not want him in a place of leadership. Not because he was great but because God did it thru him and he submitted to God's calling. Men keep your eyes open and stay prayed up that you might have discernment into the lives of those God has given you to mentor. Let's help this next generation do better than this one at stepping up and leading our families, churches, communities and

Prospector's Gold Nugget



The Ollie Henley Lodge

The Ollie Henley Lodge has been the central focus at The Royal Rangers Camp at Lakeview since its dedication in 1998. It has served as a headquarters building for many district camps and training events, and also several national training events. Thousands of leaders and boys have been served meals cooked in the kitchen, and many have been housed in the building during bad weather. Most Royal Rangers who have attended a camp at Lakeview have been inside the Ollie Henley Lodge at one time or another – to register for a camp, pick up t-shirts, eat a meal, or to spend the night. What many people do not know, however, is who Ollie Henley was and why the lodge is dedicated in his honor. The Ollie Henley Lodge has been the central focus at The Royal Rangers Camp at Lakeview since its dedication in 1998. It has served as a headquarters building for many district camps and training events, and also several national training events. Thousands of leaders and boys have been served meals cooked in the kitchen, and many have been housed in the building during bad weather. Most Royal Rangers who have attended a camp at Lakeview have been inside the Ollie Henley

Lodge at one time or another – to register for a camp, pick up t-shirts, eat a meal, or to spend the night. What many people do not know, however, is who Ollie Henley was and why the lodge is dedicated in his honor.

The Ollie Henley Lodge is named for Ollie Henley, our second district director. He served in that position for 20 years, from 1972 to 1992. Before that, he was one of the first three Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship members in North Texas, and he served as one of the first chapter officers (scribe) from the founding of our chapter in 1968 until his appointment as district director in 1972.





Commander Henley was a leader

in many other ways too. He was part of a group of leaders from North Texas who attended the very first National Training Camp (NTC) in 1968, and then served on the staff of the very first one in Texas in 1969 at Ft. Hood. He oversaw the development of junior training in our district with the Junior Training Camps, and he stayed active in the Sarge Training Academy and national training camps well past his retirement as our district director. He served as a commander on the local level as well for a total of 45 years before his death in December, 2013.

The Ollie Henley Lodge stands today as a tribute to Commander Henley and the legacy he left all of us: one of dedicated service and commitment to God, his family, his church, and the thousands of Royal Rangers and leaders who were involved in the

Royal Rangers ministry during his 45-year involvement.

The commemorative patch was given to each participant in the 2014 NTX Pow Wow. It will serve as a reminder to you not only about who Ollie Henley was but also the legacy he left for all of us. Let us all strive to leave a similar legacy of outstanding dedicated service and commitment to God, wherever He calls us to serve.





The Trappers Brigade is a service aspect of FCF that promotes the active and ongoing involvement of FCF members in service to their outpost, church, community and world.

REQUIREMENTS

To participate in the Trappers Brigade program an FCF member must meet the following qualifications: Be an FCF member in good standing with your chapter and district. "Member in good standing" is defined as having participated in at least one FCF event or activity during the last 12 months and being actively involved in a charted Royal Rangers outpost.

Be actively involved in your local church, faithful in church attendance, tithing, missions giving; and honoring to church leadership.

Any FCF member who meets the above qualifications is encouraged to participate in Trappers Brigade.

The FCF member need not have received his Buckskin or Wilderness status to qualify.

LEVELS OF RECOGNITION

The Trappers Brigade provides three sequential levels of recognition to reward members for their service hours. Members attain each level as they accumulate the required number of hours in each of four categories – outpost, church, community, and missions.

Company Trapper

To attain Company Trapper status a member must accumulate a minimum of 60 hours of service, dividing the hours into these categories:

- Outpost 20 hours
- Church 20 hrs.
- Community 10 hrs.
- Missions 10 hrs.

Bourgeois Trapper

To attain Bourgeois (pronounced boohz-wah') Trapper status, a member must accumulate a minimum of 120 hours of service, dividing the hours into these categories:

- Outpost 40 hours
- Church 40 hrs.
- Community 20 hrs.
- Missions 20 hrs.

Free Trapper

To attain Free Trapper status a member must accumulate a minimum of 180 hours of service, dividing the hours into these categories:

- Outpost 60 hours
- Church 60 hrs.
- Community 30 hrs.
- World Missions 30 hrs.

For each additional sixty hours earned according to the above distribution, a Free Trapper receives a numeral to be placed on his Free Trapper insignia. This numeral represents the number of times he has reached Free Trapper status. For example, when he has accumulated a total of 240 hours he would receive a numeral 2. At 300 hours he would receive a numeral 3, etc.

Qualifying Activities

Qualifying service hours are those where a member volunteers his time (excluding travel time) with no consideration for wages, in the categories of outpost, church, community, or missions. Service hours must be reported to your chapter each year to qualify. Young Bucks must complete the service under the supervision of an adult leader.

- Outpost (20 hours): Service hours beyond weekly meetings, regular outings, and training. The outpost coordinator preapproves the efforts of the member to insure the service helps the outpost accomplish its "evangelize-equip-empower" mission.
- Church (20 hours): Service hours beyond the outpost. The pastor responsible for overseeing Royal Rangers in the local church preapproves the efforts of the member to insure the service helps the church accomplish the pastoral vision.
- Community (10 hours): Service hours beyond the outpost and the church. These efforts will represent
 the church in the community. The service rendered must be coordinated with the pastoral leadership
 in advance to best represent the church in the community. Involving as many Royal Rangers as
 possible is encouraged, especially when done in conjunction with earning leadership merits of any
 color.
- Missions (10 hours): Service hours that specifically benefit Royal Rangers' priority missions initiatives Royal Rangers International, Pathfinder Missions, BGMC Master's Toolbox, and Speed the Light. Visit the national Royal Rangers ministry Web sites for links to these ministry Web sites and for ways to get involved. While hours devoted to the other ministries is worthwhile, only hours devoted to one or more of these four ministries may be counted as missions hours for Trappers Brigade. (Note: In a non-AG outpost, members should support the middle and high school-age missions programs of their denomination.)

New Advancement Updates

The recently completed 2014 LEAD conference proved to be a momentous event in the history of the FCF as new requirements were established for gaining membership in the FCF. The requirements to advance in the FCF (Buckskin, Wilderness, Trappers Brigade) were also unveiled. The statement below outlines the transition period for which existing membership and advancement requirements are still applicable as well as the timeframe for using the new requirements solely.

"A Royal Rangers member may join the Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship (FCF) using the existing requirements of the Trail of the Grizzly (2011 requirements) or the new membership requirements until December 31, 2014. Current FCF members may advance using the existing or new requirements until December 31, 2014. As of January 1, 2015, all new memberships and advancements will be made using the new Trail of the Grizzly requirements outlined and described in the 2014 edition of the FCF Handbook."

The new Trail of the Grizzly requirements are listed below, and applications for both the 2011 and the 2014 requirements can be found on the district website (www.ntxrr.org/fcf/).

Arrowhead Merits and Awards

FCF members (Old Timers and Young Bucks) who choose to develop their knowledge and skills in specialized frontier-related subjects may earn a special series of Royal Rangers silver skill merits known as Arrowheads. These merits and awards provide additional opportunities to develop outdoor and frontier-related skills. A Royal Rangers boy can complete the merit requirements and earn the merit whereas an adult can complete the merit requirements and earn an arrowhead award (certificate). The Arrowhead Merit and Award requirements will be listed in TRaClub in July 2014.



Royal Rangers boys and adults who complete the requirements for four arrowhead merits will be eligible to earn the Pilgrim Arrowhead Medallion. Completing the requirements for eight arrowhead merits will earn the participant the Pioneer Arrowhead Medallion. Twelve completed merits will represent the Trailblazer Medallion and 16 completed arrowhead merits will earn the participant the Patriot Arrowhead Medallion.

2014 Buckskin Results from Pow Wow



The FCF guys just get to count their hours for both awards. Sometimes it is easier for me to do it and send you a temporary password.

FCF Lifetime Dues Update

At our annual national meetings -- LEAD2014 -- a new national policy was announced regarding lifetime dues in Royal Rangers. It is now the policy of our national Royal Rangers office that there be no lifetime dues in Royal Rangers.

Our district leadership realizes that there may still be FCF members who were intending to pay lifetime dues but who had not yet done so. Thus, our existing lifetime dues plan will be available for the rest of 2014, but effective January 1, 2015 lifetime dues will no longer be available in the North Texas district.

What this means is if you want to pay your dues once for the rest of your life, you have until December 31 to pay the current lifetime dues of \$300. These funds are deposited with the district in the church loan fund where the principal goes to help build churches and the interest comes back to Royal Rangers to help support the FCF in our district. The Seneca Run will take place in the small valley west of the barn, and contrary to the name, it does not involve running. Teams of four will compete in the Seneca run, and scores for females will count double that of the scores for males. Available 10-12 and 1-5 on Saturday.
- Necklace making (using your Family Days medallion; there will be a prize for the best necklace that is made at camp)
- Frontier Craft Competition (see more information later in this info packet)
- Round Robin trade blanket approximately 15 minutes after the evening services ends on Saturday night. Everyone has the opportunity to bring their trade items and one by one you place an item or items you would like to trade on the blanket. 
- Registration will begin at 5:00 pm on Friday; you must register before you can spend the night at camp

Coming from Dallas

Take I-35E south to the Maypearl exit (exit 399-A). Turn right on FM 66. The Royal Rangers Camp at Lakeview is 7 miles ahead on the right (about ½ mile past the Lakeview Camp and Conference entrance).

Coming from Fort Worth

Take I-35W south exiting onto Highway 67 in Alvarado. Turn left on Highway 67. In Venus, turn right on 157. In Maypearl, turn left on FM 66. The Royal Rangers Camp at Lakeview is 2.5 miles ahead on the left.

Coming from Waco

- O How well is the item made? What is the quality of the craftsmanship?
- Is the design of the item balanced? Everything straight and/or centered that needs to be? Decoration evenly distributed?
- Is the item functional or is it an artistic item? If functional, score how functional you think the item is. If
 Artistic, how artistic is the item?

Documentation Provided

- Examine the paper attached to the item, and decide for yourself how the documentation explains the item by answering the three items on the score sheet.
- Maker's Mark and Judges Choice Points
 - o Add 1 point for the inclusion of a maker's mark, or totem on the item.
 - Add 1 point for no other reason that you want to!

Most importantly, be honest and have fun! There is a space provided for judge's comments. Please use this section to add comments on how to improve the item, or whatever else you want to add, but make sure that the comments are positive in nature! We want to lift up, not tear down!
