I really liked the changes that were made to some of the paperwork and I will attempt to share that with you. The biggest change is the workbooks that have been created for the Frontier Adventure, Buckskin Challenge, and Wilderness Vigil. You can view these on the national FCF website (www.nationalfcf.com) and the first thing you notice is the wonderful format and vivid colors. These workbooks are first class and anyone can go to the national website and print them. These books have been created by the national staff to help you on the advancement trail within FCF. You will need to print the workbook regarding the advancement you are working on, complete it, and turn it in at your testing. Please go to the website and look at them... they are worth looking at!

Also new in FCF is a term of 'mentor,' which is a person that has mentored you through your Ranger trail and has helped you get through the hard times. This mentor is welcome to join you at the Frontier Adventure, Buckskin Challenge, and Wilderness Vigil camps. This mentor can be a ranger or non-ranger and be there to give you prayer and moral support at your camp.

The Trail of the Grizzly has not gone away, but rather these changes have been created by the national staff to enhance your advancement challenges within the FCF ranks.

The Brush Poppin' Trace was a great camp and we even had the last of the winter weather! Brrrrr it was cold, but we had a grand time! We had about 26 people attend with 11 shelters. The trail went

well and we only had one survivor make it through the trace... all the others fell off mountains, got snake bit, caught pneumonia, drowned, starved, and suffered hostile attack. Everyone enjoyed the trail walk and as you can see, there were plenty of challenges along the way. Next year we are going to have a total primitive archery camp that will help you earn the Frontier Archer Arrowhead Merit. So, make plans now to get ready for earning the Arrowhead Merits!

In April we have the Pow Wow work day (Apr 16) where we need to come and get the 'new village site' ready for Pow Wow. I am so excited about our new digs... there is so much we can do here!

Please come and help us look our best at Pow Wow.

Don't forget about the May Fête Family Camp May 28 at Lakeview Camp in the FCF Village area. It will be great fun for the whole family, with all type of old country fair activities and picnics! Make sure you get the whole family excited about this and come have fun!!

Camporama is coming up in July and if you want to stay in the village you will have to fill out a "FCF Village Online Application" on the national FCF website (www.nationalfcf.com). The deadline for the applications to be sent is June 15, so make sure you do it soon. In order to camp in the FCF Village at Camporama you are encouraged to help with Territorial events and activities. You will also be required to wear FCF outfits while in the village. The class is 12 hours long so we have to START ON TIME!!! Please do not be late to class because you must be there for the 12 hours to pass the class.


DEADLINE FOR SIGN-UP IS: April 30 at Pow-Wow. No exceptions, we have to order class material and buy food.

From Lead2016




During Lead2016, the national FCF Staff released the new FCF Experience Workbooks. These workbooks are designed to help prepare you for FCF advancement.





"Then the angel of the Lord told her, "Go back to your mistress and submit to her." The angel added, "I will increase your descendants so much that they will be too numerous to count." Genesis 16: 9-10

This passage of scripture tells the amazing story of Sarah's servant girl Hagar. Sarah gave Hagar to Abraham in an ill-conceived plan for Abraham to get a son to fulfill God's promise. By so doing, Sarah and Abraham utterly failed in their walk with God. Abraham and Hagar's union produced a child named Ishmael. After Ismael was born, Sarah became jealous and abused Hagar - so much so that Hagar became very discouraged and ran off. This is where the angel of God found Hagar in Genesis chapter 16.

But notice that the angel had a very different plan for Hagar. He told her to go back and to submit to Sarah. If Hagar went back and submitted to Sarah, then there was a promise for Hagar - her descendants would be too numerous to count. In other words, Hagar's submission and obedience to God would result in a tremendous blessing.

Each of us make decisions every day about whether or not we will submit to God and to His written word. We also make decisions regarding our willingness to submit to God's servants - that is, our human leaders. Human leaders come in all kinds of forms. In our jobs we might have a human boss who is our leader. As a member of society we have governmental leaders and a system of laws that we abide by. If we are in Royal Rangers, then we are a part of the North Texas District of the Assemblies of God which has leaders and a system of rules and guidelines.

Submit means to yield. That is, to surrender the right-of-way to another. As Christians, Romans 13:5 orders that we all "submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also as a matter of conscience." Ephesians 5:21 states that we are all to, "Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ."

In our human nature we do not like to yield to anybody - whether to leaders, governments, bosses - anybody. This is the human condition. Each of us always has a better plan - that is, our own plan.


But let's go back to Hagar. The angel told her to submit - and then she would receive the blessing.

Take a look at Jesus. He submitted and was crucified - but now He is "the name above every other name."

Men of God, we must all take note of these words and yield ourselves to the authority that has been placed over us in the North Texas District. The leader of the District Royal Rangers is Jonathan Trower. Jonathan and his staff organize two major camps every year in our district - Pow Wow and Winter Camp. Each camp comes along with a set of rules and guidelines. We must obey the published rules to maintain good order, safety and discipline in camp. If you have had trouble in the past submitting to the rules, then please meditate on Romans 13:5 and Ephesians 5:21. I'm sure that God will make it very plain to you that submitting to the camp rules is a must for every camp attendee.

No one in the District Staff should need to go around the camp to ensure that all vehicles are out of camp. No one on the District Staff should need to go around camp to ensure that fires are out and that everyone is at the evening service. The fact that the District Staff continues to find campers missing evening services and that vehicles are left in camp says quite a lot about how we as humans "Are like sheep that have

gone astray, each to his own way." Isaiah 53:6. That means that we are sinful and in need of a Savior. There is no better place to encounter the Savior than at evening services - for you and your boys.

Again, back to Hagar, back to Jesus. Submission is our key to victory, blessing and fulfillment. I encourage all of us to die to ourselves, to our own plans, and let's all submit to the plan as set forth each day by our God in Heaven. Philippians 2:13 says, "...for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose."

As we approach the Pow Wow this year, let's all determine in our hearts to obey the rules and to be where we are supposed to be. There is so much power when we are all together in one accord. Don't miss out on what God has in store for you and your boys.

Shawnee Trail Frontier Adventure October 7-9, 2016 - REGISTRATION DEADLINE SEPTEMBER 10

It's time again to fill the ranks with new members of the Shawnee Trail Fur Trading Company. If you are an Old Timer or Young Buck, then you need to identify those men and boys who show exceptional interest and outstanding achievement in Royal Rangers and begin to help them prepare for the next Frontier Adventure by stepping up to mentor them into our chapter. The company recently published a new guide book for all greenhorn trappers that is an excellent guide for you to use in getting your candidates ready for employment with the Shawnee Trail. You can find the new guide, called the Frontiersman Workbook, on-line at the District website, ntxrr.org. Sponsors/mentors, you need to read and use the new workbook because changes were made - primarily regarding which scripture verses need to be memorized. Although it is not a requirement for candidates to complete the Frontiersman Workbook prior to the Adventure, it will be extremely advantageous for them to do so.

In order to aid the staff in preparation a pre-registration deadline of September 10 will be strictly enforced. Cost for all camp volunteers, to include sponsors/mentors, will be \$30. The \$30 fee will pay for your food from Friday night dinner to Sunday morning breakfast. The applicant fee is \$40 and should be paid by the sponsor/mentor at the same time as registration.

Requirements:

Both boys and leaders

You must be an active member in a chartered outpost

Boys only

- Graduate of the 5th grade
- At least 11 years old
- Have completed either the Discovery Rangers Gold Eagle, the Adventure Rangers Bronze Medal, or the Expedition Rangers E1 medal.

Leaders only

- Must have completed Ready and Safety levels
- Must be a member in good standing in your church with a completed background check

Shawnee Trail - Don't delay. Be aggressive in identifying candidates and then let's all work together to aid our Greenhorns into becoming all that God wants them to be.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS SEPTEMBER 10. You have six months to get ready. Let's make this the biggest Frontier Adventure ever.

Please come out with your chain saws, pole saws, flat bed trailers and young bucks to assist in this job. I know that with all of us working together we can accomplish this daunting challenge in just a few hours. Remember that many hands make for light labor. After the thickets are cleared out, you will then be afforded the opportunity to go and clear your personal outpost camp site.

In other news, the burn pile will also be moved to the western hay field in order to make room for the FCF village area and the proposed chapel/blacksmith shop.

To all young bucks,

Are you aware that in 2016 we will be having the FCF Scout selection process for the Shawnee Trail Chapter? What does this mean? For those who are interested in becoming a Scout or Assistant Scout for the North Texas District, start planning now so you can be ready for testing at this year's Pow Wow (April 29-May 1). However, we really need you to start planning now and getting all the required paperwork submitted by our Pow Wow workday (April 16) so there is enough time for everything to be reviewed and prepared.

Here are the requirements:

- 1. Must submit a scout application.
- 2. Must submit thee Personal Reference forms.
- 3. The application and reference forms must be postmarked by April 16th (they can be turned in at Pow Wow workday too).
- 4. Come with your full outfit to Pow Wow to compete for Scout / Asst. Scout positions.

At Pow Wow, Scout candidates will be evaluated in seven areas: flint & steel, black powder shoot or primitive bow shoot, hawk, knife, outfit, FCF advancement, and Royal Rangers advancement. After all evaluations are completed, the young buck with the highest score will be the district scout, the young buck with the next highest score will be the first assistant scout and the third highest score will be the second assistant scout. All scores will be kept on file in the event that any of the young bucks are unable to fulfill their entire two-year term. A new appointment will be made based on the next highest score.

We look forward to everyone who will decide to test to become the NTX FCF Scout / Assistant Scouts for April 2016 thru April 2018.

Qualifications

A candidate must be under 18 years of age at the time of a scout competition. National and Territorial scout competitions require candidates to be the selected Scout of their Chapter. In the event the Chapter Scout is unable to attend, the Assistant Chapter Scout may be added as a substitution. In each case, he must be an active FCF member of a chartered Royal Rangers outpost, and have the approval of his Outpost Commander, Outpost Coordinator, and Pastor in order to be eligible to compete for the position of Scout.

Candidates for scout must submit the Scout Application and three Personal Reference forms. The application and reference forms should be postmarked no less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the scout competition in order to be eligible for participation. Both the scout application and the personal reference form are available on www.nationalfcf.org. All forms should be sent to the Chapter President or Territorial Representative respectively.

Scout candidates will be evaluated in eight areas of scoring. In a Chapter Scout competition, the highest scoring candidate will become the Chapter Scout and the second highest scoring candidate will become the Assistant Chapter Scout. In a National Scout completion, the Chapter Scout candidate achieving the highest score will be selected as a National Scout and the second highest scoring chapter scout will be selected as the Territorial Scout. The selected National Scout and Territorial Scout will serve two year terms.

Chapter / Territory Administration

It will be the responsibility of the Chapter President and Territorial Representative to send the completed Scout applications and personal reference forms for the selected scouts to the National Royal Rangers office within 30 days of the competition. The scout applications and personal reference forms for the candidates who did not become scout should be retained by the Chapter or Territory until the next scout competition.

Scores will be kept on file in the event that either boy becomes unable to fulfill their obligation. A new appointment will be made based on next highest score, at which time that boy's application and personal reference forms will be forwarded to the National Royal Rangers office.

The Chapter President should designate a member of their staff to coordinate the Scout competition process. The Scout competition coordinator should enlist an appropriate number of chapter members to assist in the facilitation of the competition. The Territorial Representative should designate a member of the respective territory to conduct the competition for National/Territorial Scout. It would be preferable to have a representative from each chapter with a scout candidate participate in the testing process. However, a chapter member should not judge the frontier outfit category for a scout candidate from their own chapter.

A scout candidate will be evaluated in the following eight areas:

10 points Flint & Steel

10 points Black Powder Shoot or Primitive Bow Shoot

10 points Hawk Throwing
10 points Knife Throwing
10 points Frontier Outfit
10 points FCF Advancement

10 points Trappers Brigade Advancement10 points Royal Rangers Advancement

Flint and Steel

Event Description: A candidate must use his own flint and steel. Tinder will be supplied. All tinder given to the candidates must be the same material.

Scoring: scoring will be based on the following time intervals:

10 points under 10 seconds 8 points 10-30 seconds

6 points 30 seconds to 1 minute 4 points 1 minute to 2 minutes 2 points Greater than 2 minutes

Black Powder or Primitive Bow Shoot

Event Description: Candidates using a black powder muzzleloader must use black powder, a round ball and cloth patch for this scoring section. Black powder shooters must shoot standing off hand at 25 yards. Those shooting black powder must have a Black Powder shooters card issued by the NRA or NMLRA. Primitive bow shooters must shoot standing at 15 yards. Bows must be a primitive wood long bow, laminate long bow, or a laminate recurve bow with no sighting devices. All shooters must use the Official FCF Target included in the scout testing guidelines.

Scoring: Points are scored by the numbers indicated on the target. An arrow/shot will be scored according to the position of the shaft/hole on the target face. If the shaft/hole touches two colors or touches any dividing line between two scoring zones, the arrow/shot will score the higher value of the two zones involved.

10 points	Bull's eye
8 points	first ring
6 points	second ring
4 points	third ring
2 points	fourth ring

Tomahawk Throwing

Event Description: Candidate must use his own primitive style tomahawk. He will be given 10 tries to stick his tomahawk. Pacing off is allowed only once. Each throw must stay lodged in the target for at least 5 seconds to count for a point. A traditional 18-24 inch target round will be used. The target must be properly secured by a tripod or other method to prevent falling or excessive movement.

Scoring: One point for every successful stick of the tomahawk – max 10 points.

Knife Throwing

Event Description: Candidate must use his own primitive style knife. He will be given 10 tries to stick his knife. Pacing off is allowed only once. Each throw must stay lodged in the target for at least 5 seconds to count for a point. A traditional 18-24 inch target round will be used. The target must be properly secured by a tripod or other method to prevent falling off or excessive movement.

Scoring: One point for every successful stick of the knife – max 10 points.

Frontier Outfit

Evaluation Description: Candidate must wear his own frontier outfit items to the evaluation and cannot borrow items from other FCF members.

Scoring: Frontier outfit scoring form below – max 10 points.

Score each item on a scale from 2 to 10 with 10 being the best score. Each item should be evaluated on the following criteria; hand made by competitor, workmanship, and period authentic. Higher scores should be given for items that are hand-made by the scout candidate.

Hand-made by candidate: The candidate should be the primary person to do the work on the item however, it is acceptable to have help in making the item.


