This focus on our family members prevents me from giving FCF the time and attention it needs for me to be an effective leader. I do plan to attend FCF events when at all possible, just not in a leadership capacity. FCF has been an important part of my life for many years and I love each and every one of you like brothers.

Sheri and I covet your prayers for strength, courage, and peace for all our family as we face difficult days ahead. We believe the Lord is our healer and our comfort, an ever-present help in times of trouble. We trust Him and know He has a plan.

He-Man Chili Beans

As our year comes to an end I hope you had a great time with family and friends celebrating the birth of our Savior. Wishing all a blessed and prosperous New Year. As the New Year comes in we have lots of exciting camps to look forward to so get out your gear, dust it off and plan on being in attendance to help us make these camps great for the boys. Great camps are only great if you are there, so plan on coming. With the cool weather season upon us I would like to leave you with this easy Recipe to warm up your insides. Until next time keep your fires hot.

Ingredients

6 slices bacon

1 pound ground beef

1 green bell pepper chopped

1 hot jalapeño pepper diced

1 teaspoon dry mustard

2 tablespoon chili powder

1 tablespoon cayenne pepper

2 15 ounce cans kidney beans

1 pound hot smoked sausage

1 large onion chopped

2 garlic cloves minced

1/4 cup Worcestershire sauce

1 teaspoon celery seed

3 cups Italian pear tomatoes

1 15 ounce can pinto beans

Directions:

Brown bacon in a large Dutch oven. Remove bacon and crumble, and set aside. Slice the sausage into 1 inch pieces and fry in bacon fat until brown. Remove and set aside with bacon. Pour off excess fat from the pot. Brown the beef and drain, and set aside. Cook the onion, bell pepper, garlic, and jalapeño over low heat for five minutes. Stir in the Worcestershire sauce, mustard, celery seed, and chili powder. Simmer for ten minutes. Mash tomatoes, and add with liquid and meats to onion mixture. Stir in cayenne pepper. Heat to boiling, reduce heat and simmer for thirty minutes, stirring occasionally. Add beans and let simmer for about one hour, stirring occasionally. Make about ten servings. Enjoy.

Just a little side note my new property is over run with wild hogs so if y'all are interested in a hog killing let Wild Wind know and we will try and schedule one up before it gets to hot.
