District Scout Testing

This April at Pow Wow we will be selecting a new chapter scout and assistant scouts. We do this every two years. All current Young Bucks who would be under 18 years of age at the time of the Territorial Rendezvous in 2019 are eligible to test to be our Chapter Scout.

Now I said "testing". I guess you are wondering what exactly these tests will be? Well I can tell you that. There will be tests of your frontier skills. You will need your flint and steel kit to start a fire. You will need your throwing knife and your tomahawk, because you will be throwing those for a score. You will have to have a black powder shooters card if you want to be tested on your black powder rifle shooting. Or you can be tested over your archery abilities. You will also be judged on your complete FCF outfit. Make sure that you bring your best outfit and gear. Bring it all and bring a story to go with it. Because you must have a persona to explain your outfit and a story to explain anything that doesn't go with your outfit. You will also get points for your FCF advancement, whether you are a Frontiersman, Buckskin or Wilderness. So, if you want extra points, make sure that you test for your advancement at Brush Poppin' Trace. Contact Spotted Bull for more information on that. There are also points for your Trapper's Brigade level and your Royal Rangers advancements.

There is an application available for download on the NTX district website that can be found at http://www.ntxrr.org/forms.htm. Please have these filled out and sent to the address on it by March 30, 2018.

Guys I really hope that EVERY Young buck in the Shawnee Trail will come out and test for the Chapter Scout. Generally, we let the second and third place finishers act as Assistant Scouts. Which is still a big honor and a big responsibility. Now get the applications turned in and start practicing. I look forward to watching the testing.

Trappers Brigade points come in four categories: outpost, church, missions, and community. In the past, it was a chore to fill out the form to log your brigade hours. The National FCF office comes to the rescue. They developed a smart phone application to log service hours. The application is available in the Apple and the Play store. Search the store for 'service tracker' and select the FCF Service Tracker Application. Set up your account and start logging hours. No need to enter multiple dates for a single event. The application allows greater than 24 hours on a single day.

The logged hours go to the chapter dashboard to be included in the annual chapter report. No need to send in your hours to the chapter.
