





Jeremiah's involvement in the Ranger program is as follows. Jeremiah entered Straight Arrows at the age of 6 in September of 1983. Royal Rangers played a major role in his salvation on January 11, 1984. After earning his first pin, he advanced to Buckaroos where he earned the Greenhorn, Wrangler & Range Rider pins. He remembers Commander Johnson having scripture memorizing contests that he participated in and won.

In Pioneers, Jeremiah earned all ratings through Master Rating and participated in his first Pow Wow. In Trailblazers, he was on the District Honor Guard. He advanced through Recruit, Second Class, First Class and Master Rating.

As an AST Sea Ranger, Jeremiah earned all of the merit awards qualifying him for the GMA which is the highest award in Royal Rangers. He also recalls going on the best backpack hike that he's ever been on. That was to Mt. Kinsman with Commander Pettersen, Commander Poirier, and Shawn Noonan.



From Where I Sit...

The words royal and ranger are full and rich in meaning of what a commander's life and ministry is all about. Other words for royal are majestic, noble, regal, stately, kingly, and princely. The word ranger carries with it the idea of keeper, custodian, protector, guardian, explorer, traveler, wanderer, adventurer, pilgrim, and scout. Wow! What responsibilities and what possibilities are before you. How exciting and how challenging!

BUT NEVER EVER FORGET THIS; YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES AND POSSIBILITIES BEGIN FIRST AT HOME WITH YOUR WIFE AND CHILDREN. Effective Royal Ranger ministry begins and ends in the home. Your effectiveness as a commander will in a large part be influenced by how successful a husband and father you are at home. Make the following six basic principles a lifetime priority and commitment.

(1) Be the leader and head of your family. For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. (Ephesians 5:23) Male leadership should be respected by all members of the family. The husband is a servant-leader, just as Christ is Head of the Church. It is a leadership of love.

(2) Be an ideal lover. Ephesians 5:25 states, that the husband is to love his wife as Christ loved the Church. We are commanded to, "love your neighbor as yourself". (Matthew 19:19) It is a sacrificial kind of love that the Bible speaks of. Love that is given shall be happily returned. Love is more than a feeling. It is a command and can be learned. Study I Corinthians 13:4-8 for the characteristics of Biblical love.

(3) Be the primary breadwinner for the family. God laid down this principle in Genesis 3:19, "By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food

...." Man has been accountable for both the financial provision and the psychological and physical protection of his family throughout the Scriptures. Paul clearly states our responsibility in 1 Timothy 5:8, "If anyone does not provide for . . . his immediate family, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever."

(4) Be the family provider. You are the protector not only from physical evils but also from emotional and spiritual hurts. You are a father-teacher. Psalm 127:3 teaches, "Sons are a heritage from the LORD, children a reward from him." If God has given you children, you will be held accountable for them. Being a good father takes work, sacrifice, and time, but there are built-in blessings from being faithful in this area.

(5) Love your children. "Fathers, do not exasperate your children." (Ephesians 6:4) Children need love from their father, as well as teaching: "bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord." We are to train them by example and precept in the ways of our God. Children are to be disciplined, for self-discipline, self-control, and self-denial are essential in maturing to adulthood.

(6) Be the priest of the home. Teach your children love for the Word of God, the importance of prayer, and faithfulness to the house of God and the things of God. Teach your children stewardship by the example of your own life.

Yes, at times it may seem like a difficult task or even an overwhelming responsibility, however, **NEVER EVER FORGET THIS; IN CHRIST WE CAN DO ALL THINGS AND BECOME ALL THAT HE WANTS US TO BE.** Be a Royal Ranger!


