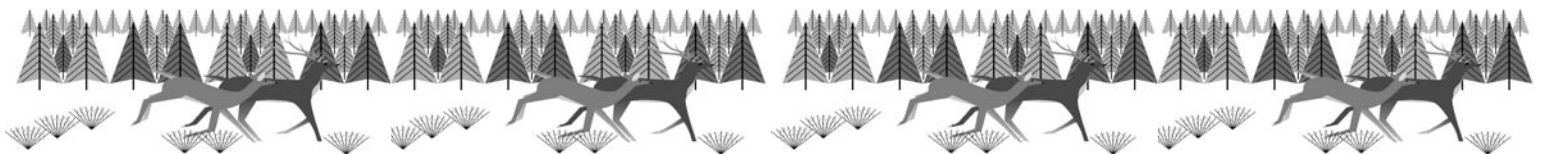

Milk and Cheese on the Frontier

Every trading post had a dairy herd, and milk, butter, and cheese were available at these outposts. In the 1850's, Gail Borden perfected the canning of condensed, sweetened milk. A Russian scientist named Kirkoff developed the process of powdering milk, and by the time of the Civil War, recipe books told how to reduce milk to a dry powder. Cheese is an ancient way of preserving milk. The New Mexicans produced it in great quantity from sheep, goat, and cow's milk.

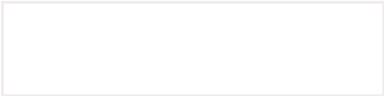
Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship SCOUT ELECTED
