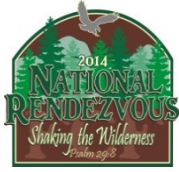

PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN CONSENT

Optional food service at Rendezvous will not be able to meet specific dietary needs (allergies, vegetarian, etc.). If you have specific dietary needs, you must plan on meeting this need on your own. Peanuts and peanut oil will not be used in any optional prepared meals served at Rendezvous. Some food products however, may be produced in a factory where nuts and peanuts are used and therefore contamination of these products may occur.

I understand that participation in National Rendezvous activities involves a certain degree of risk and can be physically, mentally, and emotionally demanding. I have carefully considered the risk involved and have given consent to my child to attend and participate in all National Rendezvous activities, including but not limited to hawk and knife throw, black powder shooting, archery, swimming, frontier games, blacksmithing, frontier crafts, high and low ropes course, and hiking.

I verify that my child is 11 years old by July 14, 2014 and not yet 18 years of age by July 18, 2014, and is a current FCF member of a district chapter. I also understand that participation is entirely voluntary and requires participants to abide by applicable rules and standards of conduct. I release the General Council of the Assemblies of God, national Royal Rangers office, all employees, the activity coordinators, volunteers, and related parties, or other organizations associated with the activity from any and all claims of liability arising out of this participation. In case of emergency involving my child, I authorize the use of emergency medical care at the discretion of the adult event leadership. 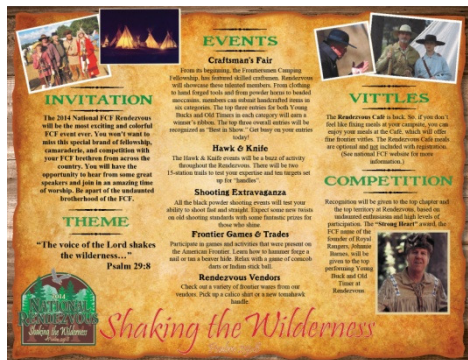

2014 National Rendezvous Events

Scoring Events | Fun Events | Activities

The 2014 National Rendezvous will be the largest gathering of members in the history of the Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship. FCF members will be traveling from all parts of the United States to Camp Eagle Rock for the Rendezvous. One of the unique features of the Rendezvous will be extensive skill and fun events available for registered attendees and visitors. The scoring events will culminate in the awarding of the **Strongheart Award** for the top scoring Old Timer and Young Buck. Territories and chapters will be competing for awards as well.

Scoring Events – The top scoring participants (Old Timer and Young Buck) for the individual scoring events will be awarded prizes for the individual event. The cumulative score from all scoring events will determine the **Strongheart Award** winner. (Old Timer and Young Buck)

Hawk & Knife Throwing – The hawk & knife events will be a buzz of activity throughout the Rendezvous. There will be two 15-station Hawk & Knife trails to test your throwing expertise. (Meadow North of Stanekville)

Black Powder Shooting - All the black powder shooting events will test your ability to shoot straight while being hindered by obstacles. Expect some new twists on old shooting standards with some fantastic prizes for those who shine. There will be a 15 station muzzleloading shooting trail. Long rifles, round balls, open sights. (Road traveling between the BB Gun Range and the Brownells Shotgun Range)

Archery – The 15 station archery trail will also test your ability to release arrows accurately while be hindered by obstacles. The object will be to shoot 3D animal targets in a natural forest setting. Long bows, recurve bows, no sighting devices. (Low Ropes Course)

Fire Starting – Participants will attempt to earn points by completing a variety of fire starting disciplines from standard flint & steel to bow drilling and from ball molding to lighting a candle. (Area behind the Razorback Lodge)

Rendezvous Games – A variety of frontier games will be available for earning points. Look forward to trying your hand at rock throwing, primitive slingshot, colonial baseball, corncob darts, a non-traditional Seneca trail, etc.. (Stanekville)

Outfits – Earn points based on the authenticity, craftsmanship, and appropriateness of your frontier outfit. (Stanekville)

Territorial / Chapter Competitions – Prizes will be awarded to the top performing territories and chapters at Rendezvous. Participation in scoring events by chapter members will figure into the awarding of the territorial and chapter awards.

Fun Events – The fun events will be available to all registered attendees. Prizes will be available for some of the fun events, but scores will not apply to the Strongheart Award.

Hawk & Knife Throwing – Ten to 15 hawk & knife targets will be available for practice as well as “handles.” (Area between the vendors and the portable swimming pools)

Black Powder Shooting - Expect some new twists on old shooting standards with some fantastic prizes for those who shine. Long rifles, round balls, open sights. (BB Gun Range)

Black Powder Shotgun Competition – A competition designed specifically for smoothbore enthusiasts. Prizes will be awarded to the top competitor. (Brownells Shotgun Range)

Archery – From standard bullseye foam targets to one of a kind trick shots, (ie. William Tell shot) participants will be able to practice or earn prizes at the archery range. Long bows, recurve bows, no sighting devices. (Archery Range)

Rendezvous Games – Frontier games will be available to all attendees. Look forward to trying your hand at rock throwing, primitive slingshot, colonial baseball, a non-traditional Seneca trail, etc.. (Stanekville)

Stump Preaching – Participants will be able to give a spiritual message. (FCF arbor behind the chapel)

Activities

Craftsman’s Fair - The Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship, from its beginning, has featured skilled craftsmen within its membership. The 2014 National Rendezvous will be a showcase for the talented craftsmen in the FCF. Members will be able to submit handmade items to be judged in one of 6 categories. The top three submissions, for both Old Timers and Young Bucks, in each category will earn a winner’s ribbon. The top three overall craft submissions will be recognized as ‘Best of Show.’ From handmade clothing to hand forged tools and possible pouches to powder horns, start working on high quality craft and trade items for the Craftsman’s Fair. (Johnnie Barnes Lodge)

Skill Demonstrators - There are a number of skilled craftsmen in the ranks of the FCF. A number of these craftsmen will be invited to demonstrate their specific frontier related skill while attending the Rendezvous. Beading, scrimshaw, leathercraft, tinsmithing, and tailoring are examples of frontier skill demonstrations that will be available at the rendezvous. (Directly behind the Blacksmith Shop)

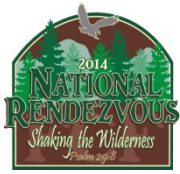
Frontier Vendors - One of the unique features of the Rendezvous will be the availability of high quality handmade frontier related items for purchase. Springfield Leather, Buckskinner’s Supply, and Fred Deaver will make rendezvous wares available as Frontier Vendors

Possible pouches, powder horns, belts, woven straps, quivers, lanterns, tin and copper items, necklaces, beading, quill work, etc.

Hooks, knives, hawks, flint strikers, trekking kits, squirrel roasters, etc.

2014 National Rendezvous Vendor Program

Commercial Vendors | Skill Demonstrators | Territorial Stores | Member Sales

The 2014 National Rendezvous will be the largest gathering of members in the history of the Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship. FCF members will be traveling from all parts of the United States to Camp Eagle Rock for the Rendezvous. One of the unique features of the Rendezvous will be the availability of high quality handmade frontier related items for purchase. The skilled craftsmen of the FCF will be on display at the Rendezvous.

Commercial Vendors – The commercial vendors will be invited to setup a store that provides specific frontier related wares. The commercial vendor fee will be \$200 (per 20' x 20' shelter) and the vendor will need to arrange for an insurance policy. Commercial vendors will be asked to setup their stores in and around Stanekville. Commercial vendors will be able to setup their vendor space starting on Saturday morning (7/12/2014). Commercial vendors will need to provide their own meals or purchase volunteer meals from the time they setup until the Rendezvous Café opens.

Skill Demonstrating Vendors – There are a number of skilled craftsmen in the ranks of the FCF. A number of these craftsmen will be invited to demonstrate their specific frontier related skill while attending the Rendezvous. They will be allowed to sell items that have been produced or created through the demonstration. The vendor fee for skill demonstrators will be \$100 per craftsman. The insurance requirement will be covered under a group policy for all skill demonstrators. The insurance policy covering skill demonstrators will be arranged by the National FCF organization.

Territorial Stores - Each territory will be able to set up a Territorial Store at the Rendezvous. The purpose of the Territorial Store is to allow the various craftsmen in each territory who may not be able to set up a full store an outlet to sell the frontier wares that they produce. The fee to setup a Territorial Store will be \$200 (per 20' x 20' shelter) and the individual territories will need to arrange for the necessary vendor insurance. There will be no limit to the number of items an FCF member displays in the Territorial Store and there will be no monetary limitations on the items sold.

FCF Members Sales – The sale of items by FCF members outside of a Territorial Store will not be allowed. The sale of items by individual FCF members will be facilitated through the Territorial Stores and by the respective Territorial Representative.
