#### **50 YEARS OF RANGERS MINISTRY IN AUSTRALIA**

From small beginnings in 1965 at Petersham Assembly of God, the Rangers ministry in Australia has had an amazing impact on the lives of children, young people and their families across every state and territory of the Australian continent.

In 1965, Ps John Woodham (from Petersham AOG) and his family ventured on an overseas holiday which included England and the U.S.A. While in the U.S.A., Ps John heard about and saw a new ministry for boys called Royal Rangers. He immediately recognised its potential for Australia.

After the initial start of Royal Rangers in Petersham, a second group started in Newcastle. It was in November 1965 where Royal Rangers was officially approved as a recognised ministry for boys at the N.S.W. State Pastors Conference. It would be another year before girls would be included due to many girls also wanting to be involved.

1971 was a big year of firsts for the Rangers ministry here in Australia which included the first Gold Medal of Achievement, the first woman in the world to receive a Leaders Medal of Achievement, and the first National Training Camp for leaders held in Pennant Hills, Sydney.

The Gold Medal of Achievement (GMA) is the highest award that a Ranger can achieve. A little over 400 of these awards have been achieved. The first in Australia was presented to Bruce Thompson N.S.W. in 1971. Other first GMA's presented were Queensland (1973), South Australia (1973) and Victoria (1977).

Ranger leaders from Australia have also played an integral part of establishing the Rangers ministry in other countries such as Singapore, Papua New Guinea, Malaysia, New Zealand, Fiji and Kazakhstan.

The Rangers ministry in Australia has had highly dedicated national directors over the years who have been passionate about the children and young people of Australia. With a desire to see churches use the Rangers ministry as a way to evangelise, equip and empower children, young people and their families; Ps Will Thorne, Warren Billson and current national director Ps Liz Robinson have all played a part in the continuing development of Rangers in Australia.

Much has changed in the Rangers ministry over the years however one thing is certain, the core values of the Rangers ministry (our Pledge, Code, Motto, Golden Rule, our emblem and what it stands for) along with its aims and goals will never change. Our commitment to developing children and young people mentally, physically, spiritually and socially in accordance to Luke 2.52 will continue to be our focus as we continue to develop our children and young people to become active disciples of Jesus Christ.

The true history of the Rangers ministry is not the leadership training, Gold Medal of Achievements, Field Days, state camps, Camporamas and so on. The true history is the lives of individuals and families changed because Jesus was shared with others through the use of the Rangers ministry in a way that is best expressed by the local church to their local community.

On Wednesday, 7<sup>th</sup> January 2015, 27 special guests arrived on site at Camporama. They travelled from Victoria, Queensland, South Australia and other parts of New South Wales to be a part of celebrating 50 years of the Rangers ministry in Australia.
