

WHERE IT ALL STARTED MILES AWAY IN THE USA

Ever wondered how the Royal Rangers ministry started? We celebrate 20 years of Royal Rangers in Sel 7, but did you know that Royal Rangers has been around for the world for 40 years. Let's look at history.

The founder, an American by the name of Johnnie Barnes was born on August 1927, in Texas. His life was is a great inspiration. Let me tell you why. He was a...

DREAMER - His love for books and vivid imagination got him in trouble. He made ridiculous statements like "Someday, when I grow up, I'm gonna' get on an airplane and fly around the world, or paddle a canoe down the Amazon, or hike the Alps in Switzerland..."

WORLD CHANGER – His friend remembered him as a young man with a burning desire to change the world. What a great way to be remembered!

MINISTER - At college, , he became a Christian, and "received a call" to become a minister.

FIGHTER - Because of his dream to develop a program to meet the needs of Christian boys, he fought through social norms, discouragement and doubts and made it happen.

PRAYER WARRIOR – He sought God every step of the way. "Sometimes the job before me was so enormous I was frightened... because the ministry could affect the life of thousands of boys, I felt that everything had to be right. Too much was at stake to make a mistake." So he prayed!

When Royal Rangers was officially launched in Arkansas, USA in October 1962, the response was outstanding. Everybody was eager and excited. Today the Royal Rangers ministry is reaching out to boys and girls in over 65 countries around the world.

Rev. Johnnie Barnes passed away in 1989 leaving behind a legacy of 27 years in the ministry. Then Rev. Richard Marriot continued this legacy of impacting and changing lives for Christ. Today Doug Marsh continues to blaze the trail for raising leaders for the future.

Johnnie once said, "I have a dream of an army of youth around the world... lifting high the banner of Jesus Christ... making an impact on their generation for God. That dream is now a reality."

DAWN OF ROYAL RANGERS MALAYSIA

The Royal Rangers program of Malaysia had a very early beginning. The seed of thought was planted by Pastor Henry K. Pillai in 1975 but his desire did not come through to have a boys and girls program for the church until 1980. In that year, bro. Rajandran and bro. Albert Ong approached Pastor Henry and he willingly gave them his full cooperation support and encouragement to start Royal Rangers Malaysia.

Contact was made with Singapore rangers, Senior Commander Steven Teo from Bethel Assembly. Contact was also made with the Australian and USA Royal Rangers department in 1981. Rev. Johnnie Barnes replied on 15 March 1982 and so did Will Thorne on 6 March 1982.

22 enrolled in the leadership training course in Australia on 23 March 1982 and there was no stopping after that as the leaders found it important to be trained. On 31 August 1982, Selangor 1 (Grace Klang) became the first Royal Rangers outpost in Malaysia, followed by Kuala Lumpur 1 (Calvary Church Damansara). 27-28 August 1982, 5 leaders attended the leadership seminar held in Singapore by Bethel Assembly. Johnnie Barnes was there to speak.


The first Selangor Pow Wow was held on 12-15 April 1984 and the first National leaders Rendezvous was held on 13-15 April 1985. After ten successful years, the first Camporama was held in 1992 at Ayer Keroh, Melaka.

From then on, the ministry continued to grow and at the recent 6th Camporama in June 2012, we had more than 800 participants from all over Malaysia.

Royal Rangers Malaysia has also attracted the eyes of the Ministry of Youth and Sports, with the then deputy minister, Datuk Ong Tee Keat commenting that he believes the Royal Rangers program will develop future leaders for our nation.

Indeed it has.


GRACE ASSEMBLY, KLANG OUTPOST SELANGOR #1

The seed of thought was planted by our Senior Pastor Henry K. Pillai in 1975. However, it only began to grow in 1982. Commander Rajendran and Commander Albert Ong approached Pastor Henry to establish contact with the Royal Rangers founder, USA National Commander Rev. Johnnie Barnes and Commanwealth Commander, Will Thorne. In August 1982, 5 leaders attended the Royal Rangers Leadership Seminar held in Singapore where Rev. Johnie Barnes spoke. On 31st August 1982, a decision to go state chartering was made and Selangor #1 was established as the first outpost in Malaysia. Senior Commander Albert Ong was elected to lead the outpost.

What started as a seed of thought has now bloomed and is bearing fruit. The Royal Rangers ministry caught the fire and spread throughout Malaysia. Many people got to know about the ministry and more importantly, the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ through the Royal Rangers ministry.

In 2007, Selangor #1 celebrated our Silver Jubilee Anniversary. The greatest testament of the ministry is rangers grow up to be men and women for God. Throughout the years we have produced GMA holders, Pastors, Youth Leaders and more. We have grown leaps and bounds with God's strength.

Royal Rangers Outpost Selangor # 6 was started by Pastor Roy Tan and Commander Alvin Tan, then under the leadership of Senior Pastor Rev. Dominic Chan, on 9th September 1987. The inception of this ministry into the church presented the start of an exciting phase and providing the church an opportunity and means to reach out to the youths and children through an exciting and structured mentoring-biblical teaching-leadership training- and outdoor based activity program.

25 years down the road, we have seen this ministry grow in numbers and strength. Through God's blessings, Selangor # 6, today is one of the main Royal Rangers outpost in the Central District with some of its leaders serving in Royal Rangers Malaysia National Committee and taking up leadership positions at various National / District Royal Rangers events. Our leaders have been recognized by Royal Rangers Malaysia and have earned their Leaders Medal of Achievement (LMA), Leaders Service Award (LSA), Outpost Commanders Award (OCA), Oustanding Service Award & Medal of Merit. Throughout our history, Selangor # 6 has produced a total of 14 top notch rangers who have earned the highest award in the Royal Rangers ministry the Gold Medal of Achievement (GMA). We are proud to have in the history of Royal Rangers Malaysia the 1st girl GMA recipient (Carol Lim Lay Geok) and also the youngest GMA recipient at age 15 (Reuben Ponniah) with their names written in the Royal Rangers Malaysia Hall of Fame.

Under the guidance of the present leadership and Royal Rangers Council, our prayer is that God will continue to use Royal Rangers Selangor # 6 as a tool in the Master's hand; to Evangelize, Equip and Empower the next generation of Christ-like boys and girls for lifelong servant leaders for Christ. Comdr. Jason Ponniah is our 7th Senior Commander. His service began in 2011. The current active membership of our outpost stands at 100 rangers and 25 leaders.




GRACE ASSEMBLY, PJ OUTPOST SELANGOR #7




CALVARY CHURCH OUTPOST KUALA LUMPUR #1

It all began in August 1982 through the vision of our Senior Pastor Prince Guneratnam and 6 men – Lim Chin Kee, Tony Luk, Peter Goh, Clifford Lee, Robert Kuan and Lim Sew Hok, the Royal Rangers ministry of Calvary Church was birthed. With 25 boys collectively in the Buckaroos, Pioneers and Trailblazer Outpost, they met on Saturday afternoons at the educational block and from its humble beginnings the programme provided both fun and accomplishments for the boys. The following year the Trail Rangers and Straight Arrows were added to the outpost.

As the ministry grew, meetings were held on Sunday evening to coincide with the Worship Service. Under the guidance of our Senior Pastor and the able leadership of the Senior Commander together with the Commanders, the outpost has grown and expanded to include many exciting programmes and events for the boys and for the whole family.









CHARIS CHRISTIAN CENTRE OUTPOST KUALA LUMPUR #3

The Royal Rangers in KL#3 was started in 1982. The first person in charge was Brother Moses Ooi under Pastor Michael Liau. We had 8 leaders and 20 over Rangers. It all started in 1997 with Pastor Gary Ng's blessing and firm leadership, Negeri Sembilan #2 was born. The 1st Senior Commander was Ng Kim Lock and he was given the mission to lead and run this newly added ministry. In line with the church mission of teaching out to the community, the Royal Rangers ministry continued to blossom. With the help and guidance from commanders of Negeri Sembilan #1 outpost, many more rangers were added to the fold.

CALVARY CHARISMATIC CENTRE OUTPOST JOHOR #3 & #5

The Johor #3 outpost started in 1995 under the firm direction of Senior Pastor Benedict Rajan. The first Senior Commander was Commander Joshua Awal. We had our first Camp Out from 28-30th November 1995 at Hutan Bandar Johor Bahru.

The first batch of Commanders include; Erene, Tea, Anna, Andrew, Chew, Christina, Rasa, Darren, Pitney, Bene, Agnes, Andrea, Wee and Daniel. Rachel and Priscilla were assigned to Straight Arrow outpost. Subsequently many other leaders joined.

The Johor #5 outpost was officially launched on 7 July 2001 by Pastor Sunil Abraham. The ministry started with 42 Rangers and 9 leaders, namely commanders Michael Ee, Hema, Deepika, Shan, Stephen, Erang, Melvin, Clarance and Tan Sueanne.

Johor #3 and #5 was merged in October 2003 with relocation of the Johor #5 church office.

Melaka #1 started in 1993 with approximately 11 years after the Royal Rangers program was first started in Malaysia. Melaka #1 is one of the many ministries in Calvary Life Assembly. 






KL *1 MISSION TRIP TO PHILIPPINES OCTOBER 2011

LET'S BUILD!

Nehemiah has just cast a convincing vision and the people responded by saying, "Let us rebuild the wall of Jerusalem!" Nehemiah's vivid description of their preferred future moved them to action. What unfolds over the next 7½ weeks is nothing short of amazing. In just 52 days the security perimeter of the city is re-established. All that in less than two months! But don't be naïve! The 52 days of construction was to Nehemiah what harvest time is to the farmer. Make no mistake, harvest is hard work but it only represents the final relatively short portion of the growth season. If a farmer harvests it is because of disciplined work and patience that goes unnoticed except by a few—that is, until harvest time! For months and months before, the farmer has laboured in anonymity. Such is the case with Nehemiah. He led the people and together they erected the walls in an impressively short period of time.

But I repeat, don't be hoodwinked into thinking all this was microwave fast. Before the first stone was set in place, Nehemiah had been on the job for months, likely even years. He had been observing, learning, planning, praying,...quietly laying the foundations upon which the entire plan now rested securely. Nehemiah had:

- · Heard from God, instructing him to move from cupbearer to builder,
- · He had asked for God's favor and blessing,
- · Received the king's approval and resources to proceed,
- · Planned how to organize the work,
- · Prepared for conflict and braced for the inevitable opposition that would come,
- Presented the vision convincingly,
- · And so much more!

Nehemiah had planned his work in prayer, then at harvest time, he worked God's plan. And that is how wise leaders roll. Jesus spoke of good planning on many occasions, one being in Luke 14:28, "Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Will he not first sit down and estimate the cost to see if he has enough money to complete it?" Success demands forethought.

Management is about today but leadership is about tomorrow. The best Ranger leaders are both good managers and good

leaders. Godly leaders are futurists. They discern what God is about to do, how he is about to do it, and they get themselves and those around them right in the middle of it. That is leadership.

If you want to hear those around you say, "Let's build," as Nehemiah did, that is, if you want to rally those around you to achieve a brighter future for boys and young men, then you too must be prepared to put your heart and soul into the front


Wow! Its 2012! Its 30 years of Royal Rangers Malaysia and Selangor 1!






