NATIONAL COMMANDER'S REPORT

District Men's Fellowship Directors' Seminar

August 1969

This past year, Royal Rangers has received widespread recognition as an outstanding program for boys. Such events as Royal Rangers Day at the Hemisfair, at Disneyland and at Candlestick Park in San Francisco have put Royal Rangers in the spotlight.

The spiritual results of Royal Rangers are tremendous and thrilling. Our annual reports indicated over 10,000 boys were won for Christ and over 4,000 were filled with the Holy Spirit. In addition, the boys who have developed spiritually through the Bible Study Courses and those who have been challenged to deeper commitment through outpost devotions further demonstrates the spiritual impact the Royal Rangers program is having on thousands of boys.

The enrollment of men and boys climbed to 47,678, with approximately 47,678 unregistered boys and men. This would make an estimated enrollment of 95,356.

District Pow Wows are proving an ideal means of providing an outstanding camping experience, an opportunity for fellowship, camperaft training, interoutpost competition and a fruitful evangelistic outreach. Thirty districts conducted pow wows this past year and reported over 600 boys won for Christ.

A new Trail Ranger program has been launched. The program geared for boys 15 to 17 places emphasis on advanced camping, outdoor lore, and survival techniques. A handbook containing the new Trail Ranger program and the revised Air and Sea Ranger program is now available.

Fourteen districts have organized district chapters in the rapidly expanding Frontiersmen Camping Fraternity program. To aid in the promotion of this program, two territorial representatives have been appointed.

Highlights of the Royal Ranger National Aide-De-Camp Council, which met in Springfield, March 14-15, 1969, was the adoption of a Constitution and Bylaws for the council and the election of officers.

The enrollment in the Leadership Training Course continues to grow with a present enrollment of 9,075; 212 leaders have completed the entire course and earned the Leader's Medal of Achievement. A new Advanced Training Course designed to train instructors is now available for leaders.

In 1968, four National Training Camps for Royal Rangers leaders were conducted. The camps were located in Missouri, Colorado, California, and New York and were attended by 119 men representing 25 districts. These camps provided leaders with topnotch training, outstanding fellowship, a real spiritual refreshing and a rugged outdoor adventure. Five more camps will be held in 1969.



o MAINTAIN THE INTEREST OF older Royal Rangers and encourage them to continue in the Royal Rangers Advancement Program, revisions are being made in the program for boys ages 15 to 17.

We believe these revisions and additions will encourage greater participation among older boys and will help us keep them involved in Royal Rangers.

AIR-SEA RANGERS

In the present Air-Sea Rangers advancement program, the boys earn four ratings—second class, first class, advanced, and master rating. Under the revised program, the boys will work their way through master rating in Trailblazers and then proceed to earn three additional ratings as listed at left.

These changes will be listed in future revised issues of the Air-Sea Rangers Handbook. Changes will be implemented gradually so they will not handicap boys engaged in the present Air-Sea Rangers program. However, new members in this age division may adopt the program as soon as the materials and revised handbook are available

The basic Air-Sea Rangers program will continue unchanged with the boys using the same ties and name tabs.

TRAIL RANGERS

Boys who do not wish to become Air or Sea Rangers may, at the age of 15 become Trail Rangers. They will wear a special maroon tie and name tab. The emphasis will be on advanced camping, outdoor lore, and survival techniques. To earn the "Gold Medal of Achievement," a Trail Ranger will be required to earn the master rating as a Trailblazer, and three additional stations in the program. Badges for these stations will be worn in the center space of the master rating patch. These suggested ratings are illustrated at left

ONE KIND OF ADVANCED AWARD

Instead of both Trailblazer and Air-Sea Rangers awards, there will be only one type of advanced award. The award will be blue, and the requirements will be the same as present Air-Sea Rangers awards. Boys holding present Trailblazer awards (red) can upgrade these by completing that portion of the award requirement not listed in Trailblazer awards. Boys should wear additional awards on the vest after placing four rows of awards (16) on the uniform.
