One of the most important duties of a Royal Ranger is to be "READY" to worship. We worship God by singing hymns and listening to His Word in church. We worship God, also, when we pray and read the Bible.

The Bible tells us about a young man named Daniel who always was "READY" to worship God. He did not have a church to worship in, however, everyday he took time to pray in his room and worship God. Evil men, who hated Daniel, plotted to have him killed. God delivered Daniel because he was "READY" to worship God, even if it meant death.

SUBJECT:

"READY" TO DIE LESSON 5: As we continue our study of the Royal Ranger Motto, we come face to face with a subject not too pleasant to think about, but which each of us must face sometime. This subject is death. Our motto says a Royal Ranger is "READY" for anything, so as Rangers we need to be "READY" to die. Let us see what the Bible teaches about death and how we can be "READY" for it. THE BIBLE TELLS US THAT ALL WILL DIE. Heb. 9:27, "It is ______ unto men once _____,..." Here the Bible tells us all men, whether great or small, must die. It also tells us something else will happen to everyone after death. THE BIBLE TELLS US AFTER DEATH WE WILL BE JUDGED. Heb. 9:27, "...but after this the _____." We can see from this scripture that we will all die and be called before God to be judged. For many of us it will be a long time until we stand before God, but for some of us it may be tomorrow or even today. Since none of us know how long we will live, we need to be "READY" at all times. LESSON 8: A ROYAL RANGER IS HONEST. HE DOES NOT CHEAT.

In lesson 7, we started a series of lessons on honesty by studying about lying. In this lesson we continue our study of honesty by seeing what the Bible says about cheating.

The temptation to cheat is often present. You may be tempted to cheat while taking a test in school. A temptation may come as you are playing a game. You may be tempted to copy someone's home work and turn it in as your own. As you grow older, the temptation to cheat will take other forms. It may come when you are filling out a tax report or as you are making some business deal. Whatever form the temptation may take, remember, a Royal Ranger never cheats.

In the New Testament, a prominent way of cheating was done by the tax collectors. These tax collectors were known as publicans. The Roman government would set a certain tax to be collected and tell the publicans what it was. The publicans would then charge the people more than this and put the difference in their pockets. These publicans became quite rich by cheating the people.

The Bible tells of two publicans who were saved and followed Jesus. They were Matthew and Zacchaeus. You will remember in the story of Zacchaeus (read Luke 19:1-10) how he repented of his cheating when he met Jesus. He promised to return any money that he had made by cheating fourfold.

As Zacchaeus did long ago, let us bow our heads and ask the Lord to help us never to cheat in any form.

SUBJECT: THE BIBLE AND THE RANGER CODE

LESSON 9: A ROYAL RANGER IS HONEST. HE DOES NOT STEAL.

In this lesson, the last in the series on honesty, we will study the Bible to see what it has to say about stealing. Let us define stealing before we go further. Stealing is taking the property of another without permission. The Bible declares in Exodus 20:15; "Thou shall not steal".

We all know that someone steals when they rob a bank. There is no doubt stealing is involved when a person breaks into a store and takes merchandise or money. We know it is stealing when someone enters a home and takes things. But, did you know there are other ways to steal than these?

Let us turn to our Bibles and discover some of the other ways of stealing.

Read Leviticus 6:3.

In this type of stealing, a person finds a lost item and although he knows who the owner is, he does not return it. He just says, "finders keepers." At times, he may even lie about it to cover up his action.

Read Psalms 37:21.

In this form of stealing the person will say, "May I borrow this" I will return it later." Then they keep it, never returning it to its proper owner.

Read Jeremiah 22:13.

This verse shows that a person who owes someone something, such as a just wage, and refuses to pay them is also guilty of stealing.

In God's sight, all forms of stealing are sinful and therefore we should not steal in any way.
 I Corinthians 6:10 tells us that thieves will not go to Heaven.
 If we have stolen anything, the first thing we should do is ask God for forgiveness.

SUBJECT:

LESSON 12: A ROYAL RANGER IS COURAGEOUS. HE IS BRAVE IN SPITE OF THREATS.
In the two preceding lessons we have seen how Paul had the courage to serve God even in the face of danger. Then we saw the courage of Nehemiah as he completed the building of the walls of Jerusalem in spite of criticism and ridicule. In this lesson, we shall see the courage that Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego displayed in the face of a threat to their lives.
Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were captives in the land of Babylon. They had been taken captive when Nebuchadnezzar conquered the nation of Israel. At the very first of their captivity they decided that they would serve God (Daniel 1). Now they are faced with a test. Nebuchadnezzar has given an order which was in conflict with God's command. Will they continue to serve God? Let us see how they show courage in spite of threats.

They had the courage to serve God in the face of a threat to their lives. Do you have the courage to serve God if someone threatens you?
Let us close this Bible lesson with a prayer. "Dear Lord, give us the courage to serve you always. Help us to be faithful to you even

though dangers, criticisms, or threats may come our way."

SUBJECT: THE BIBLE AND THE RANGER CODE

LESSON 13: A ROYAL RANGER IS LOYAL. HE IS FAITHFUL TO HIS CHURCH.

In the past 12 lessons we have studied what the Bible teaches about a Royal Ranger being alert, clean, honest, and courageous. A boy can be loyal to his family in many other ways. He is loyal to his home by obeying his parents. He is loyal by showing kindness and consideration to other members of his family. A boy who is loyal does all he can to make a family's home life what it should be by being cheerful and good-natured. He is faithful to his home when he prays for all the members of his family each day. A Royal Ranger also shows loyalty by speaking well of his home and the members of his family. These are some of the ways that a top-notch Royal Ranger shows loyalty to his family.

Being courteous is showing respect or consideration. This can be done through our speech and through our actions. Quite often both speaking and action are required in order to be courteous.

Being Courteous in our Speech

In Luke 17:11-19 there is the story of ten men who asked Jesus to heal them. Jesus sent them to see the priest and as they were going, God healed them. One of the men showed by his actions and words that he was courteous and thoughtful. Turn to Luke 17:15 & 16 and see what he did that was courteous.

"And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, _______, and with a loud voice glorified God, And fell down on his face at his feet, _____ him _____." This man showed courtesy by saying "thank you".

Being Courteous in our Actions

As Moses was resting by a well, Reuel's seven daughters came to the well to water their father's flock. As they were drawing water for the sheep some shepherds drove them away. Let us see how Moses was courteous.

"And the shepherds came and drove them away: but Moses stood up and them, and their flock." Exodus 2:14. Moses showed courtesy by helping.

When we say "please" and "thank you", we are being polite. When we say "yes, sir" and "no, sir" to our leaders, or "yes, ma'am" and "no, ma'am" to our teachers, we are showing respect. When we hold a door open for a lady, we are showing consideration. If we make a habit of doing what is polite, thoughtful, and respectful, we will become a courteous person.

It is not a sign of weakness to be a gentleman. Some of the greatest he-men of all times knew how to be courteous. In fact, a real top-notch Royal Ranger will be a gentleman at all times.

Our studies of the Royal Ranger Code and the Bible now bring us to the seventh point of the Code, "A Royal Ranger is obedient. He obeys his parents, leaders, and those in authority."

In this lesson we will see what the Bible teaches about being obedient to our parents. In the next lesson we will study the Bible and see what it teaches concerning obedience to leaders and those in authority. In the final lesson of this series we will study the important lesson of being obedient to God.

In studying the Bible we find several scriptures which tell us we should obey our parents. One of the first scriptures which comes to our mind concerns Jesus. Since Jesus is our example, let us turn to this scripture and see what Jesus did. Luke 2:51, "And he (Jesus) went down with them, and came to Nazareth, and was ______ unto them." As we can see from this verse, Jesus obeyed His parents.

SUBJECT: THE BIBLE AND THE FOUR GOLD POINTS OF THE RANGER EMBLEM

The first lesson covers the physical growth of a boy. The Bible does not give detailed information on the need of keeping physically fit because the main purpose of the Bible is to tell sinful man that God loves him and has provided a means whereby he can be saved.
