11. JR. LEADER'S SERVICE AWARD

PROPOSAL: Establish a service award for boys who serve as junior leaders. (Similar to the Leader's Service Award.) Suggest ribbon color would be red; with a red Jr. Commander bar on a gold medallion.

12. OUTPOST COMMANDER'S AWARD

LOST

PROPOSAL: That this award not be worn in the subsequent year, when a leader fails to meet the standard. RE: if a leader failed to earn the necessary points in 1984, he could not wear the medal in 1985. (Submitted by Will Thorne, commonwealth commander of Australia.)

13. INTERNATIONAL CAMPORAMA

PROPOSAL: That the 1990 U. S. Camporama become an International Camporama. (Submitted by Will Thorne.)

DISCUSSION: The U. S. has always welcomed international visitors. However, this plan would probably cause countries to send large delegations/contingents rather than a few visitors.

Also, by declaring this well in advance, each country can start planning and advertising now, (about 5 years) for such a function.

Each country would have an individual campsite (such as district) and would fully enter into all activities the same as U. S. districts.
