It was discovered that the land had many walled cities, and there were also giants living there. Most of the people felt it would be too great a task to conquer Canaan.

Joshua and Caleb stood up and pleaded with the people. They reasoned that if the people would not be afraid, and would really try, God would be with them. Joshua and Caleb became great leaders in Israel because they were ready and willing to accept any task God gave them to do.

when we pray and read the Bible.

Subject: The Bible and the Ranger Motto Lesson 5: Ready To Die As we continue our study of the Royal Ranger Motto, we come face-to-face with a subject that is not too pleasant to think about, but each of us must face sometime. This subject is death. Our motto says a Royal Ranger is ready for anything, so as Rangers we need to be ready to die. Let us see what the Bible teaches about death and how we can be ready for it. In the next three lessons we will see how God used men who were willing to obey Him. In this lesson we will study the Bible and see how God used Gideon, who was ready to obey and accomplish the impossible.

### Lesson 8: A Royal Ranger Is Honest: He Does Not Cheat

In lesson 7 we started a series of lessons on honesty by studying about lying. In this lesson we continue our study of honesty by seeing what the Bible says about cheating.

The temptation to cheat is often present. You may be tempted to cheat while taking a test in school. A temptation may come as you are playing a game. You may be tempted to copy someone's homework and turn it in as your own. As you grow older, the temptation to cheat will take other forms. It may come when you are filling out a tax report or as you are making some business deal. Whatever form the temptation may take, remember, a Royal Ranger never cheats.

One of the ways people cheated in Bible times was through the use of false weights and measures. In fact, they would often have two or more sets of weights and measures, each one a little different in size. They would then use the set that would permit them to cheat the other person the most. God warned against this practice in Deuteronomy 25:13,14:

In the New Testament, frequent cheating was done by the tax collectors. The Roman government would set a certain tax to be collected and tell their local tax collectors what it was. These collectors, often local citizens, would then charge the people more than this and put the difference in their pockets. They became quite rich by cheating their own people.

The Bible tells of two tax collectors who were saved and followed Jesus. They were Matthew and Zacchaeus. You will remember in the story of Zacchaeus (read Luke 19:1–10), how he repented of his cheating when he met Jesus. He promised to return four times the amount of money he had made by cheating.

As Zacchaeus did long ago, let us bow our heads and ask the Lord to help us never to cheat in any form.

### Lesson 9: A Royal Ranger Is Honest: He Does Not Steal

In this lesson, the last in the series on honesty, we will study the Bible to see what it has to say about stealing. Let us define stealing before we go further. Stealing is taking the property of another without permission. The Bible declares in Exodus 20:15, "'You shall not steal.'"

We all know that someone steals when he robs a bank. There is no doubt stealing is involved when a person breaks into a store and takes merchandise or money. We know it is stealing when someone enters a home and takes things. But did you know there are other ways to steal than these?

Let us turn to our Bible and discover some of the other ways of stealing.

#### Read Leviticus 6:3.

In this type of stealing, a person finds a lost item and although he knows who the owner is, he does not return it. He just says, "Finders, keepers." At times, he may even lie about it to cover up his action.

#### Read Psalm 37:21.

In this form of stealing the person will say, "May I borrow this? I will return it later." Then they keep it, never returning it to its proper owner.

#### Read Jeremiah 22:13.

This verse shows that a person who owes someone something, such as a just wage, and refuses to pay is also guilty of stealing.

Courage is that which helps you do what you should in spite of danger. A person doesn't know for sure if he is courageous until he is called on to perform a duty in the face of difficulty. To show courage, three things must be present. First, there must be a duty that should be performed. Second, there must be some kind of opposition involved in doing this duty. The opposition may be in the form of actual physical danger. It may be disapproval or criticism from those around us. Or the opposition may take the form of a threat to you or to someone you love. Third, the duty must be completed in spite of the dangers, criticism, or threats.

#### Lesson 16: A Royal Ranger Is Courteous: He Is Polite

In this lesson we are continuing the study of the Bible and the Ranger Code. "A Royal Ranger is courteous" is the next point of the Code. The Bible tells us to be courteous in 1 Peter 3:8, "Finally, be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another; love as brethren, be pitiful, be courteous" (KJV).

Being courteous is showing respect or consideration. This can be done through our speech and through our actions. Quite often both speaking and action are required in order to be courteous.

#### Being Courteous in Our Speech

In Luke 17:11–19 there is the story of 10 men who asked Jesus to heal them. Jesus sent them to see the priest and as they were going, God healed them. One of the men showed by his actions and words that he was courteous and thoughtful. Turn to Luke 17:15,16 and see what he did that was courteous.

This man showed courtesy by saying thank you.

#### Being Courteous in Our Actions

As Moses was resting by a well, Reuel's seven daughters came to the well to water their father's flock of sheep. As the daughters were drawing water for the sheep, some shepherds drove them away. Let us see how Moses was courteous.

When we say *please* and *thank you*, we are being polite. When we say *yes, sir* and *no, sir* to our leaders or *yes, ma'am* and *no, ma'am* to our teachers, we are showing respect. When we hold a door open for a lady, we are showing consideration. If we make a habit of doing what is polite, thoughtful, and respectful, we will become a courteous person.

It is not a sign of weakness to be a gentleman. Some of the greatest he-men of all times knew how to be courteous. In fact, a real top-notch Royal Ranger will be a gentleman at all times.

### Lesson 17: A Royal Ranger Is Courteous: He Is Kind

Last week we studied about a Royal Ranger being polite. This week we continue the study of courtesy by seeing what the Bible teaches about being kind. To start this study, read Luke 10:30–37.

#### Lesson 19: A Royal Ranger Is Obedient: He Obeys His Parents

Our studies of the Royal Ranger Code and the Bible now bring us to the seventh point of the Code, "A Royal Ranger is obedient: He obeys his parents, leaders, and those in authority."

In this lesson we will see what the Bible teaches about being obedient to our parents. In the next lesson we will study the Bible and see what it teaches concerning obedience to leaders and those in authority. In the final lesson of this series we will study the important lesson of being obedient to God.

In studying the Bible we find several Scripture verses that tell us we should obey our parents. One of the first Scripture verses that comes to mind concerns Jesus. Since Jesus is our example, let us turn to this Scripture verse and see what Jesus did. Luke 2:51 says, "He [Jesus] went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them." As we can see from this verse, Jesus obeyed His parents.

We need to thank God for our government and do our best to keep it strong by obeying our leaders.

# The Bible and the Four Gold Points of the Rangers Emblem

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Subject: The Bible and the Four Gold Points of the Rangers Emblem

#### Lesson 1: Physical Growth

This series of lessons covers the four gold points of the Rangers Emblem. As you know, these points represent the four ways that a boy grows. The four ways that a boy grows are physically, spiritually, mentally, and socially. Luke 2:52 records these four points concerning the growth of Jesus. Luke states: "Jesus grew in wisdom [mentally] and stature [physically], and in favor with God [spiritually] and men [socially]."

The first lesson covers the physical growth of a boy. The Bible does not give detailed information on the need of keeping physically fit because the main purpose of the Bible is to tell sinful people that God loves them and has provided a means by which they can be saved. However, we know that the men of the Bible had strong, healthy bodies because of the feats of physical strength that they performed.
