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#### Lesson 1: Knowing Jesus Christ as Your Master Ranger

One day a Royal Rangers commander asked a young boy named Caleb, "Could you tell me how to get to heaven?" Caleb thought a moment and then replied, "Yes, I know the way." "Could you tell me so I will know?" asked the commander. "Well...uh... the only way I know of is to be good and to go to church every Sunday," stammered Caleb. The motto of the Royal Rangers is "Ready"—which means that Rangers must be ready for anything. One of the major things a Ranger should be ready to do is to explain the doctrines and fundamental truths of the church.

Every Ranger should be able to back up the teachings of the church with the Word of God. Knowing the fundamental truths and being able to back them up with the Word of God will give each Ranger a solid foundation on which to build his life for the Master Ranger, Jesus Christ. There are 16 fundamental truths that form this foundation.

Before beginning the lesson, bow your head and ask the Lord to help you as you study His Word. Go to a quiet part of the house to work on the lesson, which should be completed in one sitting. Be sure to return it to your commander at the very next meeting.

#### Lesson 2: The One True God

There are hundreds of religions throughout the world, and every religion has its own God or gods. We, as Royal Rangers, should have a true, personal experience with the one true God. This lesson will help you learn about the one true God and how He reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

We use terms to understand this teaching. The term *Trinity* (three-in-one) refers to the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The word *Trinity* is not found in the Bible, but it

agrees with the Bible.

Trinity to the Christian means that even though God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit are separate personalities, they are united as the one true God. When the word

Godhead is used it simply means the unity of the Trinity.

The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are like a ball team. They are of one team. They have different functions, characters, and personalities. They make up the Godhead—one team. Jesus Christ, the Son, is in the Father, and the Father is in Jesus as to relationship. Jesus is with the Father, and the Father is with Jesus as to fellowship. The Father is not from Jesus, but Jesus is from the Father as to authority. The Holy Spirit is from the Father and Jesus as to nature, relationship, cooperation, and authority. Therefore, we can say that none of the persons in the Godhead (Trinity) work apart or alone.

#### Lesson 4: The Fall of Man

The first book of the Bible tells us, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1). On the sixth and last day of creation "God said, 'Let the land produce living creatures according to their kinds: livestock, creatures that move along the ground, and wild animals, each according to its kind.' And it was so" (Genesis 1:24).

The greatest creation on the sixth day was that of man. Genesis 1:26–28,31 tells us that man was created by God:

"Then God said, 'Let us make man in our image, in our likeness.' . . . So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. . . . God saw all that he had made, and it was very good."

Man was made in the likeness of God, and after the image of God. This does not mean in a body like God—for God is a Spirit and has no physical body. What *is* meant is that man was created with a will, personality, and intelligence. The creation of man was called "good" by God. In this creation man was good and without sin.

Starting from the creation of man, let's explore the Word of God to see the conditions and circumstances surrounding the fall of man, and the original sin that separated him from God.

#### Lesson 5: The Salvation of Man

In the last lesson you studied God's Word concerning the fall of man, which was the introduction of sin upon the earth. You will remember that God placed a curse upon the serpent and upon the earth. As a result of his sin, man separated himself from fellowship with God. Adam was sent from the Garden of Eden, away from the tree of life which God had provided. Disobedience brought physical death, which is the separation of the spirit from the body, and also spiritual death, which is separation from God.

God wants to have fellowship with man. He has provided a plan by which man can be forgiven of his sins and not suffer spiritual death. This plan is very important to each of us. Ask the Lord to help you as you study the Bible to find out about God's plan for the salva-

tion of man.

#### Lesson 6: The Ordinances of the Church

Two ordinances (sacraments) that Christ gave the Church are the Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) and baptism in water. These two sacred commands are recorded in the New Testament, and every Royal Ranger should be ready to explain them to others and to locate the scriptural basis for them in the Bible.

You must remember that there is no saving power in these ordinances. Only after an individual is saved should he take part in the Lord's Supper or be baptized in water. Nothing but the blood of Jesus Christ can save a person and only through Jesus can we see

the kingdom of God.

The Lord has commanded us to be baptized in water. The apostle Paul teaches us that water baptism is a symbol of our death, burial, and resurrection with Christ. Jesus further expects us to remember Him by taking part in Communion regularly.

Prepare your heart for this lesson by bowing your head, closing your eyes, and asking

Jesus to make this study a part of your spiritual growth in Him.

#### Lesson 7: The Baptism in the Holy Spirit

Every born-again believer has the privilege of expecting and earnestly seeking the promise of the Father, which is the baptism in the Holy Spirit. This is a command of the Lord Jesus Christ. We find that being baptized in the Holy Spirit was a normal experience in the Early Church, as recorded by the Book of Acts.

In reading our favorite Old Testament Bible stories we find that many godly men were given power by the Holy Spirit at different times. However, we find no record of Old Testament men being baptized in the Holy Spirit. We do find that the baptism in the Holy Spirit was prophesied in the Old Testament.

#### Lesson 9: Sanctification

What does sanctification mean? It means to be holy. The Old Testament meaning was the consecration or dedication of a person to God. It also means to be set apart for God. It is an act of separation from that which is evil and dedication to that which is holy.

As born-again Christians we can know that we are being sanctified (set apart) from evil by our identification with Christ in His death and resurrection. Each day we must remember this union with Christ and give our body, spirit, and mind to the Holy Spirit for His control and guidance.

#### Lesson 12: Divine Healing

The four red points on the Royal Rangers emblem stand for the four major doctrines (teachings) of the Church. These four points are salvation, the baptism in the Holy Spirit, divine healing, and the second coming of Christ (Rapture).

In lesson 4 you studied the fall of man. Because of Adam and Eve's sin, God put a curse upon the world. Death was a result of disobedience to God's command. However, God is not the author of sickness and death, Satan is. God is the author of life and health. God allowed these things (sickness and death) to happen to man because of man's sin.

In this lesson you will study the Scripture verses covering divine healing. First you will find out the cause of sin and sickness in the world, then you will discover how God provided healing for His people. Finally, you will see how it is possible to have physical healing today.
