In an historic development – National Royal Rangers has been approved to offer a nation-wide RR charter for PCCNA (Pentecostal Charismatic Churches of North America) denominations.

This is BIG! Royal Rangers has the ability to grow within the Assemblies of God churches and through over twenty PCCNA denominations.

This will be a tremendous help to churches desiring to have the Royal Rangers ministry available for their boys. As a denomination grows in membership, they will have the opportunity to become a self-chartering region. This is a “win-win” announcement for boys across the United States, who will have more opportunities than ever to become Royal Rangers. Churches have the opportunity to build “Future Champions for Christ!”

What denominations are approved?

CHARTERING PCCNA DENOMINATIONAL CHURCHES – October 25, 2004

These standard set forth by the BOA September, 2004 – The General Council of the Assemblies of God

1. The National RR Ministries office is the PCCNA chartering steward.
2. A/G district(s), which are self-chartering district(s), have the option to become the chartering steward for the PCCNA churches within their A/G district boundaries. The district superintendent's approval is required to become a chartering steward for the PCCNA.
3. A/G districts, both self-chartering and non self-chartering, are encouraged to allow PCCNA churches to participate in district and section activities/training.
4. Royal Rangers leaders who are not members of affiliated Assemblies of God churches are not permitted to become district executive committee officers or national Royal Rangers Executive Committee officers. (The district superintendent may waive this stipulation for district RR executive committee officers.)
5. District(s) approved for self-chartering and as PCCNA charter stewards are approved to add additional district charter fees, not to exceed the fees charged to Assemblies of God churches.

PROCESS FOR CHARTERING PCCNA CHURCHES

1. Churches who are affiliated with a denomination/association who are members of the PCCNA (Pentecostal Charismatic Churches of North America) are to use Charter Form B.
 - a. PCCNA churches' leadership, as it relates to Royal Rangers, shall maintain an exemplary Christian lifestyle, being evangelistic and Pentecostal.
 - b. The PCCNA church agrees to use the Royal Rangers program unaltered, including its organizational structure and its written materials. (Modifications to merit requirements must be requested from the national Royal Rangers office when merits are specifically designed for the A/G churches and may not apply to the denomination/association.)
 - c. Chartering the outpost is to be done annually.
 - d. Please contact Royal Rangers International office (RRI) at 1445 N. Boonville Ave., Springfield, Missouri 65802 or (417) 862-2781 ext. 4195 before chartering any overseas churches affiliated with a denomination/association.
 - e. PCCNA chartered churches will receive charter certificates, boys and leaders membership cards, *High Adventure* and *High Adventure Leader* magazines, and other promotional materials.
 - f. PCCNA chartered churches are encouraged to attend national training camps and to participate in national and regional camps and events, e.g., National Camporama, National Rendezvous, and territorial rendezvous.
2. Once the application is completed, send the application and check to: National Royal Rangers Ministries – charter, 1445 N. Boonville Ave., Springfield, Missouri 65802 for non self-chartering A/G district(s). If your church is in a self-chartered/PCCNA district, forward it to the district for processing. If unsure, contact the national RR office at (417) 862-2781 ext. 4177.
3. It is requested that district(s) support and encourage their district presbytery, churches, and Royal Rangers to welcome these new PCCNA outposts and allow them to attend the district RR functions, activities, training, and camps.

Description of the Three Different Charter Forms for Chartering Royal Rangers

1. RR Charter Form A: This is the current charter for use by Assemblies of God churches.
 - Form A is for Assemblies of God churches only.
 - This chartering process provides chartering through the district for self-chartering districts or chartering through the national office for non self-chartering districts.
 - Districts are encouraged to become self-chartering districts.
 - See RR Charter Form A.
2. **RR Charter Form B: This application is to be used by PCCNA denomination(s)/associations churches.**
 - **Form B is for PCCNA denominational/associations churches.**
 - **The national RR office is the PCCNA denominations/associations chartering steward.**
 - **A/G district(s) have the option to apply and become the chartering steward for the PCCNA churches within their A/G district boundaries. The district must be approved as a district self-chartering district to receive the PCCNA chartering option.**
 - **Districts who become PCCNA chartering stewards would receive a rebate. The district superintendent's approval is required to become the PCCNA chartering steward.**
 - **See RR Charter Form B.**
3. RR Charter Form C: This is the revised charter for use by non-Assemblies of God churches.
 - Form C is for non-Assembly of God churches.
 - It is for churches who do not qualify for Charter Form B.
 - Recommended charter criteria supplied by National RR Ministries to districts.
 - The charter must be approved and signed by the district superintendent. This applies to both self-chartering and non self-chartering districts.
 - See RR Charter Form C.

Chartering

From the beginning of Royal Rangers in 1962, a funding mechanism was needed. Royal Rangers was developed and promoted as a Christian boys' camping program, giving churches an option to Boy Scouts. BSA has an annual charter that applies to boys and leaders. The Royal Rangers chartering system was developed to provide a portion of the funding necessary for the National RR Ministries.

Today the national charter is not the only income for the national Royal Rangers; however, it is an important portion of the annual budget. It's also important to understand that most district Royal Rangers (self-chartering) have addition fees added to help with the Royal Rangers district budget.

The national office provides a number of benefits for chartering an outpost:

- Outpost Charter Certificate
- Boys and Leaders membership cards
- *High Adventure* and *High Adventure Leader* magazines
- RRDM (RR Data Manager) and updates when necessary (Leaders can track the achievements of the boys.)
- Promotional CD for Junior Leaders (Basic DTC and Basic JTC)
- Promotional DVD currently (*The Adventure Begins Here*)
- Camporama promotional DVD
- Missions – Charter provides RR materials to missionaries for their boys to participate in RR while on the mission field overseas.

 - A. The leadership of the applicant, as it relates to Royal Rangers, shall maintain an exemplary Christian lifestyle, being evangelistic and Pentecostal.
 - B. The applicant agrees to use unaltered the Royal Rangers program, including its organization structure and its written materials. (Modifications to merit requirements must be requested from the national Royal Rangers office when merits are specifically designed for the A/G churches and may not apply to your denomination/association.)
 - C. Chartering the outpost is to be done annually.
