ACTIVITIES AND OPPORTUNITIES

FCF VILLAGE

In conjunction with the village, there will be demonstrations on: firing a muzzle loading rifle, tomahawk throwing, frontier style cooking, making frontier clothing, tanning, scrimshawing, knife making, flint and steel, etc.

ADVANCED AWARDS MIDWAY

In the large circus type tent, you will have the opportunity to get information on various advanced awards. Leaders with expertise and knowledge will answer your questions on each award. Plus, you will receive resource materials to help you earn these awards. Don't miss this golden opportunity.

DISPLAYS

A number of outstanding displays for various organizations such as: the Forest Service, Wildlife Service, National Parks, and Department of Agriculture will be available. You will be surprised at what they have to offer.

HOT AIR BALLOON

A privileged number will have the opportunity to ride in the giant hot air balloon tethered in the campsite. Reservations are made in advance on a first come, first served basis. If you're interested, have your District Commander to make arrangements for you. There will be a nominal fee for rides.

RIFLE RANGE

There will be a 22 rifle range, and a BB rifle range available for your use. Use of the ranges are on a reservation basis. If you would like to try your skill, have your group leader to arrange this for you.

ARCHERY RANGE

This event is also on a reservation basis. If you would like to try your hand at archery, ask your group leader to make arrangements for you.
