

REGISTRATION FEE

Because of the limited size and the advanced cost of setting up the Camporama, the \$95.00 Camporama registration fee must accompany this application. These fees cover the cost of food, two Camporama patches, a Camporama cap, two Camporama T-shirts, and a Camporama packet and other Camporama expenses.

An additional travel fee to cover the expenses of food, lodging, and transportation to and from the Camporama must also be paid to your District Commander prior to the trip.

To be eligible, this application must be received by your District Commander before May 1, 1986. All applicants must be registered Royal Rangers, or registered leaders.

PARTICIPATION

1. Because of the nature of the Camporama, only boys age 12-17 may participate.
2. To maintain a proper balance of participation, the ratio of adult leaders should be no more than one for each four boys.
3. Each district will inform the national office of the number of boys and leaders they plan to bring.
4. Each participant must be a registered, up-to-date Royal Ranger or Royal Ranger leader.
5. Districts will develop their own system for determining who will attend from their district.
6. Due to advanced costs and other preparation, each participant must pre-register with their district before May 1.
7. There is no limit to the number attending as long as the pre-registration deadline is met.

DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITIES

In addition to developing a system to determine who will attend from his district, each District Commander will also be responsible for the following:

1. Transportation to and from the Camporama for those attending from his district. We suggest a bus or auto caravan.
2. Camporama camping equipment for his district group. Tents should be the type that you can stand up in. Pup-type tents not acceptable. Tents that are too large and also impractical. The ideal size is a 4 - 6 man tent.
3. Meals and lodging for his group while enroute to and from the Camporama. We suggest that the group camp out enroute on some of the many state campgrounds. This will also save in cost as well as provide an exciting additional camping experience. The most practical way of covering the expense is to tabulate a "package" cost of food, lodging, and transportation, and charge each person a set amount.
4. Make sure that his group is covered with proper insurance during the trip. (This is a must.)
5. Collect pre-registration fees from each participant in his district. Fill out pre-registration form and send form and fees to the national office by May 15.
6. During Camporama, the District Commander will continue to supervise his group and will generally be responsible for each individual from his district.
7. The district commander will attend a orientation session at the headquarters area with the national commander at 6:00 p.m., July 22.

PLEASE NOTE: If a district commander is unable to attend the Camporama, or should he have another staff responsibility, he may assign another district leader such as the deputy district commander to fill his place and assume these Camporama responsibilities.

C O S T

The Camporama cost per person will be \$95.00. This will include camp use fee, two Camporama patches, Camporama cap, two Camporama T-shirts. (This does not cover any expenses to and from the Camporama.

M E A L S E R V I C E

Camporama fees will cover the cost for all Camporama meals. Meals will be served in a tent food pavilion. Meals will be in three (3) shifts. When you check in at the Camporama, your group will be assigned a time period for meals. Meal tickets will be in each Camporama packet. The first meal will be breakfast Wednesday, July 23.

C L O T H I N G

1. UNIFORMS: Each participant must have at least one (1) class B uniform. Class B uniforms will be the official Camporama dress, and will be worn during evening sessions. Those without proper dress will not be permitted to participate.
2. WORK TROUSERS: At least one pair of fatigue trousers and jeans. These may be worn with T-shirt at patrol site for campsite duties.
3. T-SHIRTS: Each person will be issued two (2) Camporama T-shirts. (Additional T-Shirts may be purchased at the trading post.) These are worn with khaki trousers during the day and for field activities.
4. SHOES: One pair of sturdy shoes or boots will be needed. (Be sure shoes are broken in.)
5. HEADGEAR: A special National Camporama cap will be issued and worn during the Camporama.
6. PONCHO OR RAINCOAT

Heritage Trail

To emphasize our pioneer heritage, individuals are encouraged to complete the Heritage Trail. At the various stations on the trail skilled persons will demonstrate the type of skills boys were required to know in pioneer days. Boys will be given an opportunity to try their ability at mastering the skills. All boys who visit all the stations and have their card checked, will receive a beautiful Heritage Trail Award patch.

Pioneer Heritage Fun-a-rama

Exciting and fascinating games played by boys in pioneer days will be featured at each station of the Heritage Fun-a-rama. Boys will be given an opportunity to participate in these games. Special recognition will be given each boy who participates in all these events.

Demonstrations

A number of demonstrations and displays of interest to Royal Rangers will be presented each day.

Inner Campsite Visits

To encourage boys to visit the other district campsites, we encourage each district to give these visitors an inexpensive item from their district to commemorate their visit.

Swap Area

An area in which boys and leaders may swap items of interest with each other will be available. This will be one of the most popular spots during the Camporama. Each participant should bring trade items such as patches, novelty items, craft items, state or area souvenirs.

Special Events

There will be a number of field events such as rifle range, archery range, BB rifle range, an obstacle course, boat rides, and horseback riding. (Some of these events will be on a reservation basis. More details will be in the Camporama packet.)

Frontier Encampment

The Frontiersmen Camping Fraternity will be on hand with a special delegation and their own frontiersmen village. Flintlock rifle shooting, knife and tomahawk throwing and other FCF skills will be demonstrated each day. It will be patterned after an old-time frontiersmen rendezvous.

Contests

Each district is encouraged to build an archway at the entrance of their area. A prize will be awarded for the best archway. We are also encouraging each district to prepare and display a standard or banner to identify their delegation. An award will be given for the best district standard or banner. We also encourage each district to build some type of campcraft item such as a Chippewa kitchen, signal tower, work table, etc. and display it in their campsite. Recognition will also be given for the best overall district present, and an award for the best campcraft project.

Treasure Hunt

To emphasize our twenty-fifth anniversary, we have prepared three pouches containing 25 silver dollars which will be hidden on the Camporama site. All boy participants are eligible to hunt. Clues will be given each day. Whoever finds the treasure, it's theirs to keep.

TRADING POST

An area where a variety of items may be purchased will be available. Items such as Royal Rangers uniform items, T-shirts, extra Camporama patches, handbooks, Camporama mugs, and limited camp supplies will be available.

REFRESHMENT CENTER

Several areas where cold drinks, coffee, candy bars and other refreshment items may be purchased, will be available.

FIELD HOSPITAL

A first aid area and a field hospital will be manned by a physician and first aid specialist (we hope it won't be needed).

OPENING CEREMONIES

On the opening morning a gigantic ceremony is planned with bands, flag raising, speeches, and other features to start the Camporama with a bang.

PRE-EVENING RALLIES

Special pre-evening rallies featuring elaborate presentations, ceremonies and pageants will be conducted.

EVENING SERVICE

Each evening a religious service in the amphitheater is planned. Among the features will be outstanding music and special speakers.

MORNING ASSEMBLIES

A morning session for presentations, stunts, etc. will be conducted each morning.

S E R V I C E P A T R O L

Outstanding older Royal Rangers will be selected to serve on the Camporama Service Patrol. They will assist the staff in various ways, throughout the Camporama. Each member of the Service Patrol will have his Camporama fees paid in appreciation for his services. Selection will be mainly those Rangers; who have earned the Gold Medal of Achievement, and those who were selected as District Ranger of the Year. Each District Commander should submit to the national office the names of boys in these categories who plan to attend the Camporama so they may be considered. They must be 14 or older.

P U B L I C I T Y

Each District Aide-de-Camp should provide a publicity release for the news media giving full details of the Camporama. These new releases should be sent to the hometown newspaper or TV station of each person who will be attending the Camporama. A follow-up release after the Camporama should be prepared with publicity photos.

P R E - R E G I S T R A T I O N

Because it will be necessary to buy Camporama patches, T-shirts, and Camporama caps well in advance, (cap size and T-shirt size is needed before buying); and since other arrangements must be made prior to the Camporama; pre-registration forms should be filled out by the district commander and mailed to the national office by May 15, 1986. (See pre-registration forms.)

Camporama patches will be mailed out in advance to district commanders for distribution.

A P P L I C A T I O N F O R M S

Individual application forms are not sent to the national office, but are kept in the district files. However, a copy of each individual application should be brought to the Camporama by the district commander/or his representative. These forms should be available in the event the doctor may need the medical information on the forms or in the event the telephone numbers are needed in an emergency.

T E L E P H O N E N U M B E R S

A special phone will be assigned to our headquarters area. We will share this number when available.

O R I E N T A T I O N M E E T I N G

A special orientation session between the Camporama Director and the district commanders or their representative will convene on Tuesday, July 22 at 6:00 p.m.

A review of the Camporama, emphasis on the duties of the district commander and last minute important information will be given. This meeting will give each district commander an opportunity to ask needed questions, and to be oriented on the location of sites and events. It is therefore, very important for the district commander or his representative to attend this meeting. This meeting will be in the headquarters area.
