REGISTRATION FEE

Because of the limited size and the advanced cost of setting up the Camporama, the \$105.00 Camporama registration fee must accompany this application. These fees cover the cost of food, two Camporama patches, a Camporama cap, two Camporama T-shirts, and a Camporama packet and other Camporama expenses.

An additional travel fee to cover the expenses of food, lodging, and transportation to and from the Camporama must also be paid to your District Commander prior to the trip.

This application must be received by your District Commander before April 1, 1990, to be eligible. All applicants must be registered Royal Rangers, or registered leaders. Boys must be a Pioneer, who has earned Master Rating, and the Advanced Camping Award, or a Trailblazer/Air, Sea, Trail Ranger who has earned either First Class Rating or the Advanced Camping Award. Leaders must be approved by their district.

PARTICIPATION

1. To maintain a proper balance of participation, the ratio of adult leaders should be one for each four (4) boys.
2. Each leader must be a registered leader. He should be a qualified, experienced leader. He must be approved by his District Commander.
3. Each participant must be a registered, up-to-date Royal Ranger. He must be a Pioneer who has earned Master Rating, and the Advanced Camping Award, or a Trailblazer/Air, Sea, Trail Ranger who has earned either First Class Rating, or the Advanced Camping Award.
4. Districts will develop their own system for determining who will attend from their district.
5. Due to advanced costs and other preparation, each participant must pre-register with their district before April 1.
6. Each district will inform the national office of the number of boys and leaders they plan to bring.
7. There is no limit to the number attending as long as the pre-registration deadline is met.

DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITIES

In addition to developing a system to determine who will attend from his district, each District Commander will also be responsible for the following:

1. Screen each leader and boy to make sure they are qualified to attend.
2. Transportation to and from the Camporama for those attending from his district. We suggest a bus or auto caravan.
3. Camporama camping equipment for his district group. Tents should be the type that you can stand up in. Pup-type tents are not acceptable. Tents that are too large and also impractical. The ideal size is a 4 - 6 man tent.
4. Meals and lodging for his group while enroute to and from the Camporama. We suggest that the group camp out enroute on some of the many state campgrounds. This will also save in cost as well as provide an exciting additional camping experience. The most practical way of covering the expense is to tabulate a "package" cost of food, lodging, and transportation, and charge each person a set amount.
5. Make sure that his group is covered with proper insurance during the trip. (This is a must.)
6. Collect pre-registration fees from each participant in his district. Fill out pre-registration form and send form and fees to the national office by April 15.
7. During Camporama, the District Commander will continue to supervise his group, and will be responsible for each individual from his district.
8. The District Commander will attend a orientation session at the headquarters area with the National Commander at 6:00 p.m., June 26.

PLEASE NOTE: If a District Commander is unable to attend the Camporama, or should he have another staff responsibility, he may assign another district leader such as the Deputy District Commander to fill his place and assume these Camporama responsibilities.

COST

The Camporama cost per person will be \$105.00. This will include camp use fee, two Camporama patches, Camporama cap, two Camporama T-shirts, and a camp stool. (This does not cover any expenses to and from the Camporama.)

MEAL SERVICE

Camporama fees will cover the cost for all Camporama meals. Meals will be served in a tent food pavilion. Meals will be in shifts. When you check in at the Camporama, your group will be assigned a time period for meals. Meal tickets will be in each Camporama packet. The first meal will be breakfast Wednesday, June 27.

CLOTHING

1. **UNIFORMS:** Each participant must have at least one (1) class B uniform. Class B uniforms will be the official dress, and will be worn during evening sessions, and other special events.
2. **CASUAL TROUSERS:** At least one pair of casual trousers or jeans. These may be worn with T-shirt at patrol site for campsite duties.
3. **T-SHIRTS:** Each person will be issued two (2) Camporama T-shirts. (Additional T-shirts may be purchased at the trading post.) These may be worn with khaki trousers or jeans during the day for field activities.
4. **SHOES:** One pair of sturdy shoes or boots will be needed. (Be sure shoes are broken in.)
5. **HEADGEAR:** A special National Camporama cap will be issued and worn during the Camporama.

INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP TRAIL

To emphasize international friendship and culture awareness, individuals are encouraged to complete the International Friendship Trail. At the various stations on the trail skilled persons will demonstrate the type of skills, crafts, etc., unique to their country or culture. Participants will be given an opportunity to try their ability at mastering the skills. All individuals who visit all the stations, and have their card checked, will be eligible to purchase a beautiful International Friendship Patch at the Trading Post.

***STRONGLY RECOMMENDED**

INTERNATIONAL FUN-A-RAMA

Exciting and fascinating games played by Rangers from around the world will be featured at each station of the International Fun-a-rama. Individuals will be given an opportunity to participate in these games. Super enjoyment is in store for those Rangers who participate in these events.

DEMONSTRATIONS

A number of demonstrations and displays of outstanding interest to Royal Rangers will be presented each day.

INNER CAMPSITE VISITS

To encourage Rangers to visit the other district/country campsites, we encourage each district/country to give these visitors an inexpensive item to commemorate their visit.

SWAP AREA

Areas in which boys and leaders may swap items of interest with each other will be available. These will be some of the most popular spots during the Camporama. Each participant should bring trade items such as patches, novelty items, craft items, state or country souvenirs.

SPECIAL EVENTS

There will be a number of field events such as hikes, swimming, archery range, BB rifle range, an obstacle course, canoeing, and horseback riding. (Some of these events will be on a reservation basis. More details will be in the Camporama packet.

FRONTIER ENCAMPMENT

The Frontiersmen Camping Fraternity (U.S.) will be on hand with a special delegation and their own frontiersmen village. Flintlock rifle shooting, knife and tomahawk throwing, and other FCF skills will be demonstrated each day. It will be patterned after an old-time frontiersmen rendezvous. Other countries who have FCF groups will also have encampments.

CONTESTS

Each district/country is encouraged to build an archway at the entrance of their area. A prize will be awarded for the best archway. We are also encouraging each district/country to prepare and display a standard or banner to identify their delegation. An award will be given for the best district/country standard or banner. We also encourage each district/country to build some type of campcraft item and display it in their campsite. Recognition will also be given for the best overall district/country present, and an award for the best campcraft project.

TRADING POST

An area where a variety of items may be purchased will be available. Items such as Royal Rangers uniform items, T-shirts, extra Camporama patches, National Royal Rangers Training Center items, handbooks, Camporama mugs, and limited camp supplies will be available.

REFRESHMENT CENTER

Several areas where cold drinks, coffee, tea, candy bars, and other refreshment items may be purchased, will be available.

FIELD HOSPITAL

A first aid area and a field hospital will be manned by qualified physicians and first aid specialists.

OPENING CEREMONIES

On the opening evening (June 26) a gigantic ceremony is planned to start the Camporama with a bang.

PRE-EVENING RALLIES

Special pre-evening rallies featuring elaborate presentations and ceremonies from around the world will be conducted.

EVENING SERVICE

Each evening a religious service in the amphitheater is planned. Among the features will be outstanding music and special speakers.

MORNING ASSEMBLIES

A morning session for presentations, etc., will be conducted each day.

SERVICE PATROL

Outstanding older Royal Rangers will be selected to serve on the Camporama Service Patrol. They will assist the staff in various ways, throughout the Camporama. Selection will be mainly those Rangers; who have earned the Gold Medal of Achievement, and those who were selected as District/Regional Ranger of the Year. Each district/national Commander should submit to the U.S. national office the names of boys in these categories who plan to attend the Camporama so they may be considered. They must be 14 or older.

PUBLICITY

Each District/Country Aide-de-Camp should provide a publicity release for the news media giving full details of the Camporama. These news releases should be sent to the hometown newspaper or TV station of each person who will be attending the Camporama. A follow-up release after the Camporama should be prepared with publicity photos.

PRE-REGISTRATION

Because it will be necessary to buy Camporama patches, camp stools, T-shirts, and Camporama caps well in advance, (cap size and T-shirt size is needed before buying); and since other arrangements must be made prior to the Camporama; pre-registration forms should be filled out by the district/country and mailed to the U.S. national office before April 15, 1990. Non-U.S. groups should be received by March 15, 1990. (See pre-registration forms.)

If possible, Camporama patches will be mailed out in advance to district/countries for distribution.

APPLICATION FORMS

Individual application forms are not sent to the national office, but are kept in the district/country files. However, a copy of each individual application should be brought to the Camporama by the district/country commander/or his representative. These forms should be available in the event the doctor may need the medical information on the forms or in the event the telephone numbers are needed in an emergency.

ORIENTATION MEETING

A special orientation session between the Camporama Director and the district/country commanders or their representatives will convene on Tuesday, June 26, at 6:00 p.m.

A review of the Camporama, emphasis on the duties of the district/country commander and last minute important information will be given. This meeting will give each district/country commander an opportunity to ask needed questions, and to be oriented on the location of sites and events. It is therefore, very important for the district/country commander or his representative to attend this meeting. This meeting will be in the headquarters area.

In addition to developing a system to determine who will attend from his country, each National Commander will also be responsible for the following:

1. Transportation to and from the Camporama for those attending from his country.
2. Camporama camping equipment for his group. Tents should be the type that you can stand up in. Tents that are too large are also impractical. The ideal size is a 4 - 6 man tent. (A package including tents, lights, stove, etc., may be provided for non-U.S. groups at a rental cost. Arrangements must be made four (4) months in advance.)
3. Meals and lodging for his group while enroute to and from the Camporama. The most practical way of covering the expense is to tabulate a "package" cost of food, lodging, and transportation, and charge each person a set amount.
4. Make sure that his group is covered with proper insurance during the trip. (This is a must.)
5. Collect pre-registration fees from each participant in his country. Fill out pre-registration form and send form and fees to the U.S. national office by March 15.
6. During Camporama, the National Commander will continue to supervise his group and will be responsible for each individual from his country. (This includes dress, behavior, decorum, etc.)
7. The National Commander will attend an orientation session at the headquarters area with the U. S. National Commander at 6:00 p.m., June 26.
