INFORMATION BOOKLET

WELCOME

Welcome to the first international Camporama! We are happy you are a participant in this historical event here at the National Royal Rangers Training Center.

To fully enjoy this opportunity, it is important that you carefully read the entire contents of this booklet.

GET ORIENTED

One of the first things to do after you have set up camp is to get oriented to the campsite. The Camporama map (see pages 5 and 6) gives you the location of all major facilities and activities. There are signs identifying these major areas.

PERSONNEL

Camp supervisors will be located at various events and activities of the Camporama. They will be glad to assist you in any way they can—particularly in the area they are assigned to. An information booth is also located near the lodge. So if you need help, just ask.

Clothing

The official dress of the Camporama is the Royal Rangers Class B uniform. It is to be worn during special ceremonies and evening services. Because of warm climate, however, you may wear the Camporama T-shirt you received upon registration. The T-shirt may be worn with Royal Rangers khaki trousers or jeans during field activities.

Equipment

A variety of equipment and other items will be used for each event. Please do not move, rearrange, or use these items unless you are invited to do so. These items have been placed here at great effort and expense.

Food Service

All meals, beginning with breakfast Wednesday morning, will be served in the large food tent (see map). Meals will be served during three shifts. Below is a meal schedule. See your group leader to learn to which group encampment you belong. Since there are no tables and chairs available, please bring your camp stool to each meal. (Please write your name and district or foreign delegation on your camp stool.)

CAMPGROUND RULES

1. Rappelling tower, low ropes course, and water front areas are off limits except for designated activity periods.
2. Do not cut trees. Be careful not to damage small seedling trees (marked by stakes and red tap).
3. Remain on existing pathways and roads at all times. Do not take shortcuts.
4. Every individual must notify security officers when entering and exiting the campground. Each district and foreign delegation will be responsible for the care and liability of the boys and leaders in its group.
5. Use only biodegradable soaps and shampoos.
6. Open fires **are prohibited**.
7. Every boy or girl must remain with another individual at all times.
8. No smoking. No drinking of alcoholic beverages. No illegal drugs. No firearms. No fireworks.
9. Do have lots and lots of fun!

ACTIVITIES AND OPPORTUNITIES

A number of exciting activities and opportunities are available to you here at the Camporama. We hope you will take advantage of them all.

Activities Requiring a Charge

Hot Air Balloon

Take advantage of the grand opportunity to ride in the giant hot air balloon. (Tickets for this and other rides can be purchased at all snack bars.) See the bird's eye view of the beautiful campsite for only \$3. A treat you won't want to miss!

Rifle Range

Both a .22 rifle range and a BB rifle range are available for your use. Shoot a .22 rifle five times for only 50 cents. There is no charge at the BB rifle range. If you wish to try your skill, have your group leader make arrangements for you to attend this activity.

BMX Bike Races and Go-Cart Rides

A BMX bike course will be available to those who like a little competition. Go-cart rides will also be provided for those who enjoy this fun sport. Both rides are \$2 each.

Trading Post

A well-stocked post of Royal Rangers items is available at the Trading Post for your convenience. Some of the items available at the post are patches, Royal Rangers mugs, and novelties.

Individual Vendors

Numberous items will be available to you to purchase from individual vendors. Each person selling items must acquire a vendor's license from the national Royal Rangers office. (Every item vendors sell must be pre-approved.)

Activities Free of Charge

Friendship Trail

The Friendship Trail will afford you various Camporama-related activities, crafts, and demonstrations displayed by each district and foreign delegation. Use the Friendship Trail card enclosed in the information packet to participate in this fun activity. Those who visit enough sites on the Friendship Trail to gain 29 of the possible 36 points can receive a free Friendship Trail patch. Your card must be validated at each site you visit. Once you've accumulated enough points, present the card at the trading post or regional snack bar (see map) to receive your patch.

Archery

Test your skill with the bow and arrow. It's lots of fun.

Low Ropes and Rappelling Courses

Just the thing for rugged Rangers who want to test their limits and abilities (14 years or older). Ask your leader how to participate in these challenging activities.

Radio Control Model Airplane Demonstration

Larry Burns, an employee of the General Council of the Assemblies of God, will demonstrate his skills at flying an RC model airplane Thursday, June 28, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.

Water Activities

Want to get wet? Here's your chance to cool down: Canoeing, water slide, bronco ride, the preacher's dunk, and more. A limited number will have the opportunity to canoe on the Table Rock Lake inlet (first come first serve basis, age 14 or older, **must be accompanied by an adult leader**).

Walk About

This hiking event will give you the chance to see about 6 miles of beautiful Ozark Mountains. The hike will be contained within the campground (more than 1,500 acres of land). You will cross creeks, climb hills, view the meadows, and breathe the clean air—a great "back-to-nature" treat.

Funorama

Fun and exciting games will be available at each station of the Funorama. Ask your group leader for details.

Bible Quiz

This competition will be interesting and challenging to all who are involved. Participants can earn six points for entering the Bible Quiz. These points, in turn, can help you accumulate enough points to receive a free Friendship Trail patch (see Friendship Trail above). Each district and foreign delegation will provide a judge for the quiz.

Chi Omega Rho Camp

Chi Omega Rho will be sponsoring a medieval camp. Special medieval activities and games will be presented. For those interested: A Chi Omega Rho "Quest" will be held after one of the evening services. More information can be obtained at Camp Stronghold.

Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship Village

One of the outstanding features of the Camporama will be FCF Village. The village will be styled after a Plains Indian village. FCF members dressed in authentic frontiersmen clothing will be manning the village.

In conjunction with the village will be demonstrations on tomahawk throwing, frontier-style cooking, making frontier clothing, tanning, scrimshawing, knife making, and more.

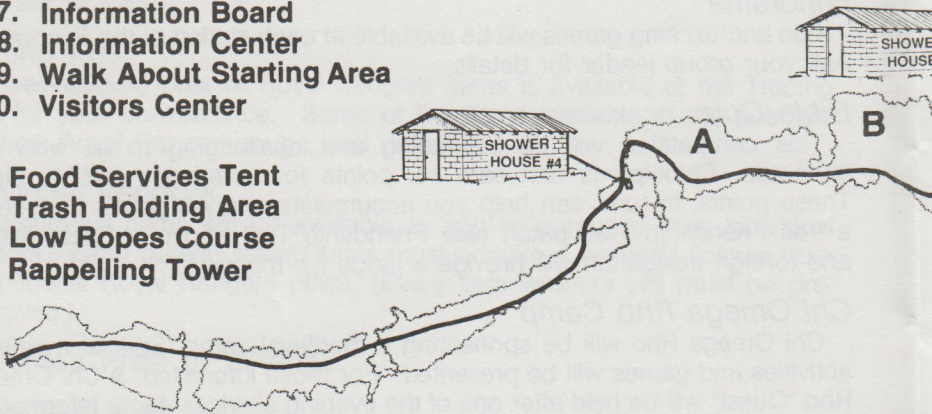

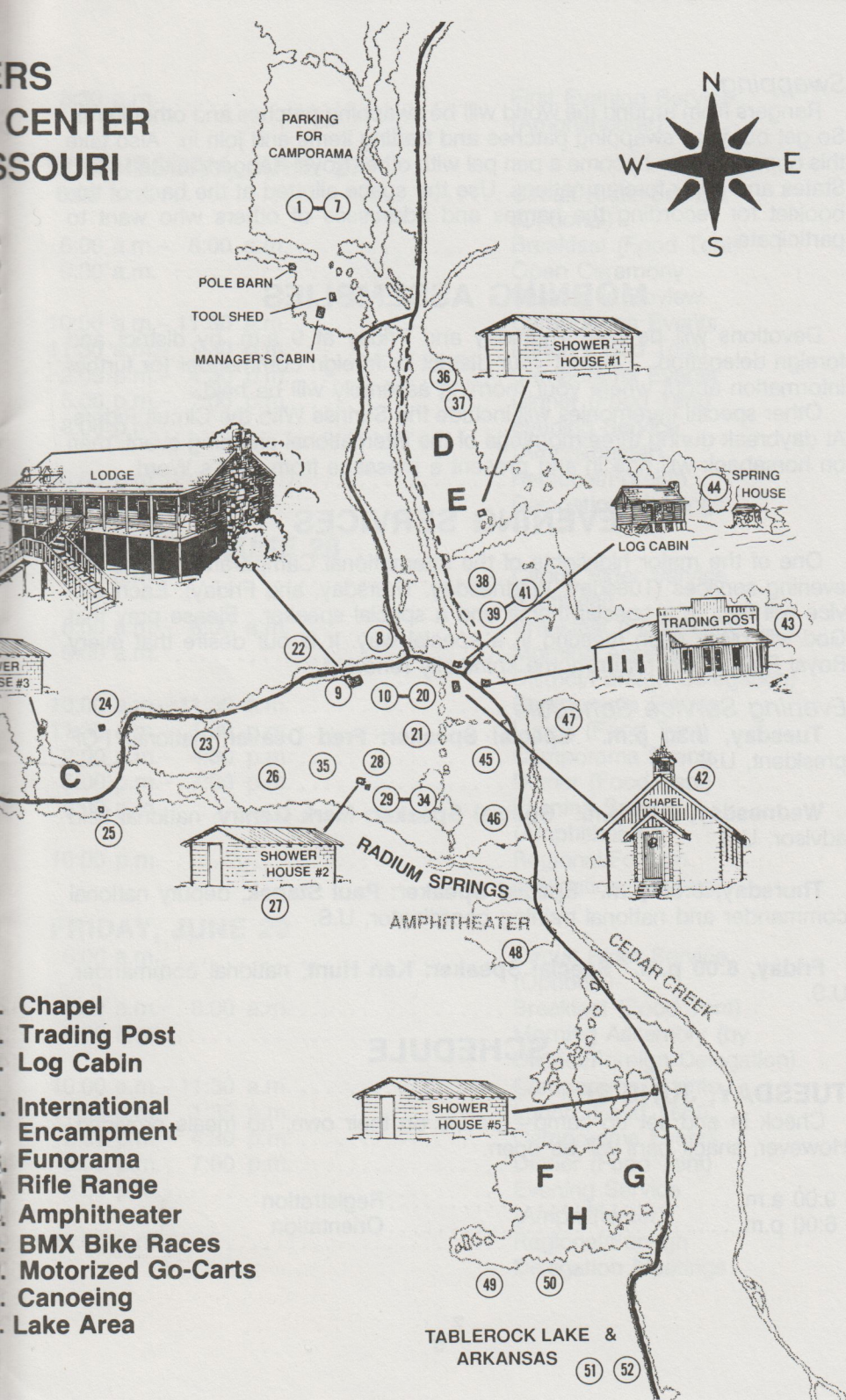
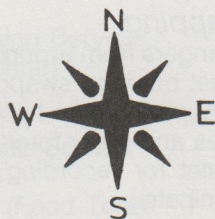
