

CAMPORAMA CODE

A Royal Ranger lives by the Golden Rule. In fact, it's our daily rule. So pay others the respect you wish to receive.

The Golden Rule teaches us to pay it forward to others with kindness, a smile, or encouraging words. Pick up your own trash. and the rubbish someone else dropped. Treat the property and space of others better than your own. Be honest and courteous. Have fun!

Get the most out of your Camporama experience:

- Be safe: Follow the Camp Rules and observe the Health and Safety guidelines found in this notebook.
- Have fun: Don't play checkers all day in your campsite. Enjoy the activities.
- Make friends: People from all over the country and from around the world have gathered. It's a great time to meet them and share your Rangers experiences.
- Be helpful: After each meal, clean up around the food station and tent; daily participate in the service project assigned to your group; and perform random acts of kindness whenever you have the chance.
- Meet with God: That's why we are here. Do your morning devotions. Attend the regional assembly. Enjoy the evening rally and hit the altar to seek God.

CAMP RULES **AND INFORMATION**

Security: Professional security personnel (in black) will be available before, during, and after Camporama as needed. Follow their instructions.

ID badge: You are expected to wear your ID badge and lanyard all day, everyday. The ID badge is your pass to the camp, to participate in the activities, to receive your meals, and to enter the amphitheater.

Meals: Your Camporama ID badge is one of three colors—red, green, or blue. Eat all of your meals at the food pavilion that is the same color as your ID badge.

Amphitheater: Enter and exit the amphitheater each evening through the gates that matchs the color of your ID badge.

Banned items: Use of tobacco, alcohol, illegal drugs, fireworks, laser penlights, and carry and conceal weapons is forbidden. Any outpost participating in a shooting competition and transporting any firearm for this reason must keep the firearm in a case that can be locked. The firearm should only be accessible for the competition and not outside the storage case or handled anywhere but at the range. Any firearm seen handled in campsites or transported improperly will be confiscated by security and held in safekeeping until that outpost/ individual checks out to return home.

Prohibited sale of firearms and knives: Firearms (including black powder firearms) and knives (including folding knives) may not be sold, awarded, traded, or conveyed as personal property by anyone at Camporama. Possessing knives that open by spring action or centrifugal force (switch blades, butterfly knives, etc.) is expressly prohibited at any Royal Rangers activity.

Product sales: To protect campers and the Camporama experience, the sale of products (including pins, shirts, etc.) is forbidden except by approved vendors. Please report violations to security.

Off-site travel: Campers traveling off-site must be under adult supervision. Adults must complete a Release and Hold Harmless Form for accompanying minors before leaving the campground. This form

may be obtained at registration, regional headquarters, or the main security checkpoint. The form is turned in to security as you leave the premises.

Spiritual formation: To fully experience what Camporama is all about. campers are requested to do the following each day: 1) Have personal devotions around breakfast time; 2) Attend the morning devotions held at the regional/denominational/international assembly; 3) Participate in the evening services in the amphitheater; and 4) Complete the "Making it Personal" section in this notebook on pages 31, 33, and 35. If you have questions or need prayer, a chaplain is available at each regional headquarters and at the main first aid station throughout the day, and altar workers are available following the evening message in the amphitheater.

Registration: Everyone must register (at the Eagles Resort Lodge) before entering the campground. At registration, every camper will receive an ID badge, lanyard, and the Camporama Notebook. The remaining registration items, including your campstool, are given to each camper individually at the Camporama Store.

Dress: Monday-Thursday dress in Camporama t-shirt, ball cap, and shorts or pants.

Roads and footpaths: Pedestrians walk on footpaths; however, if walking on a roadway, walk facing traffic (with a flashlight at night). Some roads may be temporarily closed to vehicles due to weather.

Vehicles: Most roads inside Camp Eagle Rock are one way. Please obey posted signs, including speed limit (which is 10 miles/hour or less). Buckle up! No riding on tailgates! Yield to emergency vehicles, trams, carts, and pedestrians. Vehicles are allowed in campsites to unload for no more than two hours on Sunday or Monday immediately following registration and to pack on Friday morning after 6:00 a.m.* Trailers cannot be left in campsites. Park vehicles in the designated parking areas only. Anyone wishing to use their vehicle off-site during Camporama should use the designated parking area outside the secure campground gates. Displaying parking permit, issued at registration, is mandatory at all times. A tow truck will move illegally parked vehicles at owner's expense. The road near the amphitheater is closed one hour before the evening rally and remains closed until the end of the altar service. Some roads may be temporarily closed to vehicles due to weather; follow staff instructions. (*Regional staff will clear exceptions.)

Activities: There are dozens of exciting activities available to you at Camporama. They are only open during the designated times listed on the schedule and are available exclusively to registered campers. Visitors may only participate in the following activities: The Muse, the

Museum, the Heritage Trail, and the Thursday evening service and concert. All other activities are for registered campers only.

Hat pin trading: This is a fun Camporama tradition. Hat pins are for trade and should not be sold or bought! Trade only when a responsible adult is present to witness the trade. Keep it fun and fair.

Trams: Trams are available each day from 8:45 a.m.-11:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.-5:30 p.m. Tram service will be available to international guests 15 minutes after close of evening service, departing from the Trading Post. Trams will also be available for guests on Thursday evening.

There are 3 tram routes with multiple stops at popular locations:

- Green Route runs from the Eagles Resort parking area to the Chapel on the Lower Turkey Loop.
- Blue Route runs in a loop from JBL, passing the Mathews Archery Range to the Brownells Rifle Range, turning south to Deaverton, with a final stop at the main concession stand and back up to JBL.
- Red Route runs from the Chapel, servicing the south end of the camp, including stops at the swimming pool and the red concession stand.

Personal privacy: Respect another person's privacy while they are showering or dressing. Shower and restroom facilities have separate boys' and men's designations. Male campers 18+ years old should use the men's facilities.

Power: Electricity is available at shower houses and snack bars. Outlets are limited to the use of electric razors and battery chargers for cell phones and cameras. The National Royal Rangers Ministries is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Flashlights: Use a flashlight while walking on roads and trails at night. Replacement batteries are available at the Camporama Store. Flashlights should remain off during evening service. Use of laser lights is forbidden.

Visitors: All visitors must check in/out at the registration office (located at the Eagles Resort Lodge) and will receive an ID badge that needs to be returned as they leave the campground. Visitors may rest at or around the main snack bar, located near the Johnnie Barnes Lodge, and may purchase food, snacks, and refreshments there. To protect campers' privacy, female visitors are kindly requested not to visit district campsites. Visitors may only participate in the following

activities: The Muse, the Museum, the Heritage Trail, and the Thursday evening service and concert. To protect the Camporama experience, all other activities are for registered campers only.

Visiting hours: Monday-Wednesday: 9:15 a.m.-5:00 p.m.; Thursday: 9:15 a.m.-end of service/concert. Thursday evening visitors are invited to enjoy the evening service and concert and are kindly asked to depart immediately following.

International encampment: US campers and guests are prohibited from entering the international encampment. You can meet international delegates at the Royal Rangers International tent, located in the MissionsPlex during activity times.

Daily service project: Every day each outpost will be assigned a short service project. The group leaders should check in each morning at the regional headquarters to find out what their assignment is and when it should be completed. In addition, every camper is expected to follow the Camporama Code.

Adult volunteers: All able-bodied adults are expected to volunteer at least (1) 4-hour shift during Camporama. Please check in at the volunteer office (east of the Johnnie Barnes Lodge) for your assignment. Volunteers will receive exclusive memorabilia for each 4-hour shift: one 4-hour shift is a patch; two 4-hour shifts (total 8 hours) is a coin; and three 4-hour shifts (total 12hours) is a hat.

Camporama merit: Every camper ages 9-17 is encouraged to complete the Camporama merit. (Requirements and full information are found on page 36.)

District/denominational competition: Within each region, districts/ denominations will compete for largest attendance, best entryway. camp, flag, and spirit. Do your part to make your district/denomination shine! (Check with your district director for details.) Awards will be presented Thursday morning.

Camp setup and teardown: Following registration, check in with regional headquarters for campsite location. Vehicles are allowed in campsite for no more than two hours immediately following registration on Sunday or Monday. Safety is paramount. Regional staff will inspect campsite before clearance to leave camp is granted.

Lost and found: Lost and found is located at Camporama office immediately east of the Johnnie Barnes Lodge.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

First aid stations: Report injuries and illnesses immediately to your regional first aid station. If you are participating in activities, go to the main first aid station, located on the ground level of the Johnnie Barnes Lodge. The medical staff (in light blue) will make an assessment and take appropriate action. All first aid stations are open 24 hours/day.

Dehydration: Drink sufficient water to avoid heat-related injuries. Frequent drinks of water and resting in the shade are necessary in high temperatures. Potable water fountains are located throughout the activity field, outside shower houses, and at the amphitheater. Do not drink water from the creek.

Local hazards: Avoid walking through high weeds or wooded areas where ticks, chiggers, snakes, and poison ivy are common. Do not disturb the wildlife unless your safety is directly threatened.

Insect repellent and sunscreen: For your protection and comfort, wear both at all times. For your convenience, both are available at the Camporama Store.

Prescription drugs: All prescriptions must be registered with the medical staff at the main first aid station, located on the ground level of the Johnnie Barnes Lodge, upon check-in. Depending on the prescription or situation involved, some medications may be required to be kept there while a camper's leader or legal guardian may be permitted to keep others in their campsites.

Camp emergency: Several Emergency Alert Systems (EAS) have been installed around the camp. In the event of a camp emergency, such as a severe thunderstorm, tornado, or fire, the EAS will be activated. The EAS will sound a siren and broadcast a voice announcement stating the nature of the emergency and any additional information or instructions.

In the event of severe thunderstorm or a tornado, please take the following actions:

- Try to get inside the lowest floor of a building or small protected space that has no windows.
- If a building or protected space is not available, lie in a ditch, ravine, culvert, or other low lying area, which is not prone to flooding.
- Use your arms or a piece of clothing to protect your head and neck.
- Stay away from trees as they are more easily hit by lightning.
- Do not seek shelter under a tent or food pavilion.

In the event of a non-weather emergency, please follow the instructions that are broadcast over the EAS. Once the emergency is over, an "All Clear"

message with any additional information or instructions will be broadcast over the EAS.

Hand washing: Keep hands clean to avoid sickness. Wash hands before and after eating and before and after using the restroom.

Trash: Keep the campgrounds clean and sanitary by disposing of all trash in designated areas.

Portable toilets: To promote good sanitation, please do not use the woods or nearby trees as a bathroom. Toilets are serviced daily. Do not discard trash or bottles in toilets.

Shower houses: Keep them clean. Use biodegradable soaps and shampoos. As a courtesy to other campers, shower quickly. Men (18+ years old) and boys use separate facilities. All shower houses will be closed one hour each afternoon for cleaning; times are posted on each facility.

Buddy system: For safety, campers ages 9-17 should be accompanied by another individual at all times.

Fire safety: Open fires are prohibited.

Swimming: Swim in pools only during scheduled times when lifeguards are on duty. Do not swim in the creeks.

Emergency phone calls: In the event of an emergency, calls will be received at 417-271-3900. A message will be taken to the appropriate regional headquarters for delivery to the Camporama attendee. Calls should be strictly limited to significant emergencies.

ACTIVITIES

Here's a quick overview of all the Camporama activities you can participate in. There are over 75 unique events. Think you can do them all?

The Muse: Let's get this party started with some talent shows, Junior Bible Quiz competitions, still life artisans, and others. It will also host special VIP guests at various times each day. Check the posted schedule at The Muse each day for specific events and activities.

MissionsPlex: Learn about rugged Pathfinder Missions and help build an African tabernacle, sponsored by Builders' International. Play soccer with international guests at the Royal Rangers International soccer field and get wet discovering what Boys and Girls Missionary Challenge is all about.

Eurasia Experience: Thirteen time zones in one hour! That's what you will see at the Eurasia Experience. The Eurasia Experience is a cross-cultural, multi-sensory journey that will bring the sights, smells, and sounds of Eurasian life to Camporama. Step into the shoes of a missionary from half way around the world, blending as best you can into another culture. Hear and feel the commotion of a crowded bazaar.

Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship Village: You won't want to miss seeing an actual working blacksmith shop or compete in one of the events located within the FCF Village, including the 1840's Iron Man Competition and Native American Stickball just to name two. Once you tour the village, make sure to get your complimentary FCF hat pin.

Shooting Sports: Stop by one of the many target sports arenas available at Camporama. From BB gun to archery to black powder, there's something for everyone at the Mathews Archery Range, Daisy Air Rifle Range, Brownells Trap Range, and the Brownells Rifle Range (small bore and black powder).

Royal Rangers Museum: We mark the 50th anniversary of Royal Rangers in 2012. Come and see the history of Royal Rangers, including past uniforms, thousands of patches, and awards.



Royal Rangers Heritage Trail: After you tour the museum, take a visual journey through the history of Royal Rangers. Review the key moments of the past 50 years as you stroll in the shade of the Heritage Trail. Take your picture in front of the banner that includes the three former and the current national directors.

Camporama Midway: This is where most of the action takes place at Camporama. From Gladiator Jousts to Human Slingshots to portable climbing walls and everything in between, this is where you want to be!

RecPlex: Soccer, Kan Jam, Flag Football, and Ultimate Frisbee are the main activities in this popular area. Get your team together to compete against teams from around the world.

Camporama Cove: Complete with sand and water, come enjoy the cool swimming waters located in the cove!

Adventure Course: The centerpiece of Camp Eagle Rock is its Adventure Course. You won't want to miss it. The bouldering wall is open to boys of all ages. The climbing tower, ages 9-12. The high ropes course, ages 13-17. To avoid long lines, the climbing tower and high ropes course require free tickets, available at your regional headquarters.

Also, check out the team challenge course (low ropes course) open to all ages. No tickets required. There are four elements on each side of the Archery Range for a total of eight. The course is one-way, starting on the west side of the Johnnie Barnes Lodge on the upper side of the road.

HELP US NAME THE ADVENTURE COURSE, DROP YOUR IDEAS OFF IN THE JOHNNIE BARNES LODGE.

Speed Ball: Prepare for battle as you take on teams from other outposts, districts, or from around the world. Try to capture the flag in this fast-paced round of paintball (small team entry fee applies).

Ranger Derby: This traditional Camporama event is sure to get those racing juices flowing. Car check-in and racing will take place in the Racing Complex of the Camporama Store, located just to the north of the inground swimming pool. 



ROYAL RANGERS' 50TH ANNIVERSARY

n the 1950's, the Assemblies of God executive leaders saw a trend in boys leaving church and determined to start a ministry focused on boys and young men. In 1962, they invited Rev. Johnnie Barnes to start Royal Rangers to reach, teach, and keep boys for Jesus Christ.



Royal Rangers grew throughout the 60's and 70's as groups for boys grades K-12 were started. Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship was launched in the mid-60's to engage young men and mobilize them for greater Christian service. As the ministry caught on, churches across the nation and around the world began to catch the vision.

In 1974, Royal Rangers held its first National Camporama at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, CO. This year we celebrate our 10th Camporama, which coincides with our 50th anniversary. The very property you stand on, Camp Eagle Rock, was part of our founder's dream for reaching young men. The Johnnie Barnes Lodge is named in his honor. Johnnie passed away unexpectedly in June 1989.

Since Johnnie's home going, only three individuals have led the National Royal Rangers Ministry. This has provided great continuity and stability. Rev. Ken Hunt served from 1989-1999: Rev. Richard Mariott served from 1999-2007; and Rev. Doug Marsh became the director in 2007. Through the years, our culture has changed and so has Royal Rangers. But what has remained the same is the commitment to reach boys for Christ, to guide them to become godly men, and to shape them into servant leaders.

Over our 50-year history, upwards of 2.5 million boys and young men have been involved in Royal Rangers. The Gold Medal of Achievement has been earned by 6.800, and the

ministry is now active in 86 nations and continues to expand.

We have reason to celebrate! But above all, we have much to be grateful for:

- Boys who want to become the men and leaders God designed them to be
- Mentors who give their lives to shape future men and servant leaders
- Church leaders committed to forging today's boys. tomorrow's godly men
- God's infinite blessings and favor vesterday, today, and

Each day we ask you to do four things:


- 1. Have personal devotions around breakfast time. Read the daily Bible passage, think about what you read, and pray.

CAMPORAMA 2012 EXPERIENCE MERIT

General Overview

At this Camporama, you are gaining new and exciting experiences. This merit is designed to help you get the most from it. At past Camporamas, campers were given an activity patch. However, at this one, you can actually earn a merit. (Adults and visitors may not earn this merit.)

Once you have completed the requirements below, you will qualify to receive a silver Camporama 2012 Experience merit. It may be used to satisfy advancement requirements in the same way as any other silver merit.

As with all other merits, your group leader is the one who determines if you have met the merit requirements.

Requirements

Pre-Camp*

*NOTE: These requirements may be completed during Camporama if not completed previously.

- 1. Read each of the following Bible passages:
 - ✓ David: 1 Samuel 17; Acts 13:22
 - ✓ Gideon: Judges 6-8
 - ✓ Samson: Judges 13:5,24-25; Judges 14-16
- 2. Review with your leader or group the meaning of the sixteen points of the Royal Rangers Emblem (red, blue, and gold).
- 3. Review with your leader or group the Camporama Code of Conduct, Rules, and Safety and First Aid sections in this notebook and discuss the following questions:

- ✓ What can you do to prevent dehydration? Insect and chigger bites? Sunburn?
- ✓ In the event of illness or injury, where should you go? Locate on the map the regional first aid station (which is near your campsite) and the main first aid station (which on the ground level of the Johnnie Barnes Lodge).

In-Camp

- 4. Complete each of the following activities:
 - Tour the Royal Rangers' History Museum and complete the Heritage Trail walk.
 - √ Visit the FCF Village and participate in the activities.
 - ✓ Visit the MissionsPlex and participate in the activities.
 - Visit and participate in at least one of the following activities: Eurasia Experience or PathFinder Missions African Tabernacle, sponsored by Builder's International.
- 5. Earn a total of 25 points from any combination of the following activities:
 - √ 1 point for each activity you participate in other than those already listed above (max 10 points)
 - √ 1 point for each Stamp-O-Rama stamp collected in your Camporama Notebook (max 10 points)
 - √ 1 point for each hat pin collected and displayed on your Camporama hat (max 10 points)
 - √ 1 point for each new person you meet, getting the following information from each: name, age, outpost number, district/nation, favorite merit or activity in Royal Rangers, favorite activity at Camporama (max 10 points)

- 6. Do the daily Bible reading, thinking, and praying each morning, using the space provided in the Camporama Notebook.
- 7. Complete the "Making it Personal" sections in the Camporama Notebook, related to each evening rally.
- 8. Memorize the Salvation Poem and be able to recite it to your leaders.
- Assist in cleaning up around your food pavilion after each meal. Help keep your district camping area clean and safe. Pick up after yourself all day wherever you go.
- 10. Participate in service projects every day as assigned by your regional coordinator. (Ask your group leader what was assigned to your group each day.)
- 11. Live by the Golden Rule by performing "random acts of kindness" each day of Camporama, finding ways to serve or assist others with a cheerful attitude and a helpful spirit.

Post-Camp

- 12. Read and complete the "Taking it Home" daily devotional materials after returning home. The content is free and will be found on the event web site immediately following Camporama.
- 13. Have a follow-up meeting with the leaders and guys who went to Camporama within 1-4 weeks to review what you experienced and learned. How can you use what you learned at Camporama to live as a godly man at school this next year?
- 14. Share with your parent, leader, or group what you enjoyed most about Camporama and what you learned from the morning devotionals and evening services.






