

CAMPORAMA CODE

A Royal Ranger lives by the Ranger Code and the Golden Rule.

The Golden Rule teaches us to pay it forward to others with kindness, a smile, or encouraging words. Pick up your own trash and the rubbish someone else dropped. Treat the property and space of others better than your own. Be honest and courteous. Have fun!

To get the most out of your Camporama experience, we encourage all campers to follow what we call the "Camporama Code":

- **BE SAFE:** Follow the Camp Rules and observe the Health and Safety guidelines found in this notebook.
- **HAVE FUN:** Don't play checkers all day in your campsite. Enjoy the activities.
- **MAKE FRIENDS:** People from all over the country and from around the world have gathered. It's a great time to meet them and share your Rangers experiences.
- **BE HELPFUL:** After each meal, clean up around the food station and tent; daily participate in the service project assigned to your group; and perform random acts of kindness whenever you have the chance.
- **MEET WITH GOD:** That's why we are here. Do your morning devotions. Attend the regional assembly. Enjoy the evening rally and hit the altar to seek God.

CAMP RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

Security: Professional security personnel will be available before, during, and after Camporama as needed. Follow their instructions.

ID badge: You are expected to wear your ID badge and lanyard all day, everyday. The ID badge is your pass to the camp, to participate in the activities, to receive your meals, and to enter the amphitheater.

Meals: Your Camporama ID badge is one of three colors—red, green, or blue. Eat all of your meals at the food pavilion that is the same color as your ID badge. See page 11 for your district's mealtime.

Amphitheater: Enter and exit the amphitheater each evening through the gates that match the color of your ID badge.

Banned items: Use of tobacco, alcohol, illegal drugs, fireworks, laser penlights, and carry and conceal weapons is forbidden. Any outpost participating in a shooting competition and transporting any firearm for this reason must keep the firearm in a case that can be locked. The firearm should only be accessible for the competition and not outside the storage case or handled anywhere but at the range. Any firearm seen handled in campsites or transported improperly will be confiscated by security and held in safekeeping until that outpost/individual checks out to return home.

Prohibited sale of firearms and knives: Firearms (including black powder firearms) and knives (including folding knives) may not be sold, awarded, traded, or conveyed as personal property by anyone at Camporama. Possessing knives that open by spring action or centrifugal force (switch blades, butterfly knives, etc.) is expressly prohibited at any Royal Rangers activity.

Product sales: To protect campers and the Camporama experience, the sale of products (including pins, shirts, etc.) is forbidden except by approved vendors. Please report violations to security.

Off-site travel: Campers traveling off-site must be under adult supervision. Adults must complete a Release and Hold Harmless Form for accompanying minors before leaving the campground. This form may be obtained at registration, regional headquarters, or the main security checkpoint. The form is turned in to security as you leave the premises.

Spiritual formation: To fully experience what Camporama is all about, campers are requested to do the following **each day**: 1) Have personal devotions around breakfast time; 2) Attend the morning devotions held at the regional/international assembly; and 3) Participate in the evening services in the amphitheater.

If you have questions or need prayer, a chaplain is available at each regional headquarters and at the main first aid station throughout the day. Altar workers are available following the evening message in the amphitheater.

Registration: Everyone must register (at Eagles Resort) before entering the campground. At registration, every camper will receive an ID badge, lanyard, and the Camporama Notebook. The remaining registration items, including your camp stool, are given to each camper individually at the Camporama Store.

Dress: Monday–Thursday dress in Camporama T-shirt, ball cap, and shorts or pants. Please wear your Camporama T-shirt to the Monday evening service for the group photo.

Roads and footpaths: Pedestrians walk on footpaths; however, if walking on a roadway, walk facing traffic (with a flashlight at night). Some roads may be temporarily closed to vehicles due to weather.

Vehicles: Most roads inside Camp Eagle Rock are one way. Please obey posted signs, including speed limit (which is **10 miles/hour or less**). Buckle up! **No riding on tailgates!** Yield to emergency vehicles, trams, carts, and pedestrians. Vehicles are allowed in campsites to unload for no more than two hours on Sunday or Monday immediately following registration and to pack on Friday morning after 6:00 a.m.*

Trailers cannot be left in campsites. Park vehicles in the designated parking areas only. Anyone wishing to use their vehicle off-site during Camporama should use the designated parking area outside the secure campground gates. Displaying parking permit, issued at registration, is mandatory at all times. **A tow truck will move illegally parked vehicles at owner's expense.** The road near the amphitheater is closed one hour before the evening rally and remains closed until the end of the altar service. Some roads may be temporarily closed to vehicles due to weather; follow staff instructions. (*Regional staff will clear exceptions.)

Activities: There are dozens of exciting activities available to you at Camporama. They are only open during the designated times listed on the schedule and are available exclusively to registered campers. See page 17 for details.

Hat pin trading: This is a fun Camporama tradition. Hat pins are for trade and should not be sold or bought! Trade only when a responsible adult is present to witness the trade. Keep it fun and fair.

Trams: Trams are available each day from 8:45 a.m.-11:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.-5:30 p.m. Tram service will be available to international guests 15 minutes after close of evening service, departing from the Trading Post. Trams will also be available for guests on Thursday evening.

There are 3 tram routes with multiple stops at popular locations:

- Green Route runs from the Eagles Resort parking area to the Chapel on the Lower Turkey Loop.
- Blue Route runs in a loop from JBL, passing the Mathews Archery Range to the Brownells Rifle Range, turning south to Deaverton, with a final stop at the main concession stand and back up to JBL.
- Red Route runs from the Chapel, servicing the south end of the camp, including stops at the swimming pool and the red concession stand.

Personal privacy: Respect another person's privacy while they are showering or dressing. Shower and restroom facilities have separate boys' and men's designations. Male campers 18+ years old should use the men's facilities.

Power: Electricity is available at shower houses and snack bars. Outlets are limited to the use of electric razors and battery chargers for cell phones and cameras. The Royal Rangers National Office is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Flashlights: Use a flashlight while walking on roads and trails at night. Replacement batteries are available at the Camporama Store. Flashlights should remain off during evening service. Use of laser lights is forbidden.

Visitors: All visitors must check in/out at the registration office (located at Eagles Resort) and will receive an ID badge that needs to be returned as they leave the campground. Visitors may rest at or around the main snack bar, located near the Johnnie Barnes Lodge, and may purchase food, snacks, and refreshments there. To protect campers' privacy, female visitors are kindly requested not to visit district campsites. Visitors may only participate in the following activities: The Muse, the Museum, and the Thursday evening service and concert. To protect the Camporama experience, all other activities are for registered campers only.

Visiting hours: Monday-Wednesday: 9:15 a.m.-5:00 p.m.; Thursday: 9:15 a.m.-end of service/concert. Thursday evening visitors are invited to enjoy the evening service and concert and are kindly asked to depart immediately following.

International encampment: U.S. campers and guests are prohibited from entering the international encampment. You can meet international delegates at the Royal Rangers International tent, located in the MissionsPlex during activity times.

Daily service project: Every day each outpost will be assigned a short service project. The group leaders should check in each morning at the regional headquarters to find out what their assignment is and when it should be completed. In addition, every camper is expected to follow the Camporama Code.

Adult volunteers: All able-bodied adults are expected to volunteer at least (1) 4-hour shift during Camporama. Please check in at the volunteer office (next to the Camporama Store) for your assignment. Volunteers will receive exclusive memorabilia for each 4-hour shift: one 4-hour shift is a patch; two 4-hour shifts (total 8 hours) is a coin; and three 4-hour shifts (total 12 hours) is a hat.

Camporama merit: Every camper under 18 years of age is encouraged to complete the Camporama merit. (Requirements and full information are found on page 36.)

District competition: Within each region, districts will compete for largest attendance, best entryway, camp, flag, and spirit. Do your part to make your district shine! (Check with your district director for details.) Awards will be presented Thursday morning.

Camp setup and teardown: Following registration, check in with regional headquarters for campsite location. Vehicles are allowed in campsite for no more than two hours immediately following registration on Sunday or Monday. Safety is paramount. Regional staff will inspect campsite before clearance to leave camp is granted.

Lost and found: Lost and found is located at Camporama office in the Johnnie Barnes Lodge.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

First aid stations: Report injuries and illnesses immediately to your regional first aid station. If you are participating in activities, go to the main first aid station, located on the ground level of the Johnnie Barnes Lodge. The medical staff will make an assessment and take appropriate action. *All first aid stations are open 24 hours/day.*

Dehydration: Drink sufficient water to avoid heat-related injuries. Frequent drinks of water and resting in the shade are necessary in high temperatures. Portable water fountains are located throughout the activity field, outside shower houses, and at the amphitheater. Do not drink water from the creek.

Local hazards: Avoid walking through high weeds or wooded areas where ticks, chiggers, snakes, and poison ivy are common. Do not disturb the wildlife unless your safety is directly threatened.

Insect repellent and sunscreen: For your protection and comfort, wear both at all times. For your convenience, both are available at the Camporama Store.

Prescription drugs: All prescriptions must be registered with the medical staff at the main first aid station, located on the ground level of the Johnnie Barnes Lodge, upon check in. Depending on the prescription or situation involved, some medications may be required to be kept there while a camper's leader or legal guardian may be permitted to keep others in their campsites.

Camp emergency: Several Emergency Alert Systems (EAS) have been installed around the camp. In the event of a camp emergency, such as a severe thunderstorm, tornado, or fire, the EAS will be activated. The EAS will sound a siren and broadcast a voice announcement stating the nature of the emergency and any additional information or instructions.

In the event of severe thunderstorm or a tornado, please take the following actions:

- Try to get inside the lowest floor of a building or small protected space that has no windows.
- If a building or protected space is not available, lie in a ditch, ravine, culvert, or other low lying area, which is not prone to flooding.
- Use your arms or a piece of clothing to protect your head and neck.
- Stay away from trees as they are more easily hit by lightning.
- Do not seek shelter under a tent or food pavilion.

In the event of a non-weather emergency, please follow the instructions that are broadcast over the EAS. Once the emergency is over, an "All

"Clear" message with any additional information or instructions will be broadcast over the EAS.

Hand washing: Keep hands clean to avoid sickness. Wash hands before and after eating and before and after using the restroom.

Trash: Keep the campgrounds clean and sanitary by disposing of all trash in designated areas.

Portable toilets: To promote good sanitation, please do not use the woods or nearby trees as a bathroom. Toilets are serviced daily. Do not discard trash or bottles in toilets.

Shower houses: Keep them clean. Use biodegradable soaps and shampoos. As a courtesy to other campers, shower quickly. Men (18+ years old) and boys use separate facilities. All shower houses will be closed one hour each afternoon for cleaning; times are posted on each facility.

Buddy system: For safety, campers under 18 years of age should be accompanied by another individual at all times.

Fire safety: See text from leader guide.

Swimming: Swim in pools only during scheduled times when lifeguards are on duty. Do not swim in the creeks. See Camporama Cove on page 19 for details.

Emergency phone calls: In the event of an emergency, calls will be received at 417-271-3900. A message will be taken to the appropriate regional headquarters for delivery to the Camporama attendee. Calls should be strictly limited to significant emergencies.

ACTIVITIES

Team Competition: NEW at Camporama, help your team win the overall championship. Every activity you participate in scores points in an overall team competition. The winning team will enjoy a free ice cream party after the evening service on Thursday night! Teams will be announced at the Tuesday morning regional devotions and will be comprised of 45-50 boys from multiple outposts with their leaders serving as team coaches (all boys from the same outpost will be on the same team). You can earn points by participating in the following activities:

- Bible Quiz Challenge
- RecPlex – Copa Rama, Super Rama Bowl, and Tug-O-War
- Individual Activities – like Ranger Derby and Shooting Sports
- Daily Treasure Hunt
- Team Spirit and Team Flag Design
- Team Games

Team Games will take place on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday on the "Field of Champions" in front of the Johnnie Barnes Lodge. Each team will be assigned a time to compete according to a schedule posted at your regional headquarters and the Awards Center. Check the schedule every morning and make sure your team is there on time to earn extra points!

The Muse: Show off your talents at The Muse! Bring your Fine Arts Festival submissions to display in the exhibit. Or submit your photos from Camporama to be displayed for all to see. On the main stage, you can participate in the Open Mic Session (sign up required on Monday). Drum set, keyboard, and amps will be provided. Hopefully you brought your instruments! Group performances, such as Christian band, worship team, human videos, and dramas, are allowed as well as solo performances such as instrumentals, vocals, drama, and human video solos. Awards will be presented to the top 3 in each category.

You can also participate in the Ultimate Lip Sync Battle! Bring your favorite Christian song or rap on your music device and battle head-to-head against your friends. Who is the best lip sync artist?

Bible Quiz Challenge: We're excited to journey with you in the Bible Quiz Challenge in Ephesians chapter 6. Each quiz match will consist of 10 questions. Questions may be interrupted; however, you must finish the questions in essence before giving the answer. Questions interrupted incorrectly will be reread to the opposing team. All incorrect answers are a minus half value of the questions value. After answering two correct answers, the Ranger has "quizzed out" and will be awarded 10 bonus points. There is no challenging or contesting the ruling by quizmasters. Each boy can participate in the Bible Quiz Challenge once per day. The following sections will be quizzed on each day:

- Tuesday – Ephesians 6:1-9
- Wednesday – Ephesians 6:10-17
- Thursday – all of Ephesians 6

Any Ranger who can quote Ephesians chapter 6 word for word will earn points for their team. The sooner the chapter is quoted, the more points you earn! Scripture can be quoted at The Muse during activity hours.

Copa Rama Soccer: Join in on the most popular sport in the world with this year's Copa Rama Soccer Tournament. Teams should consist of 10 to 12 people with all members being on same "color" team for Team Competitions to earn points. Sign up for the tournament is required and will take place on Monday until 4:30 p.m. in the RecPlex. Open play will be available on Monday. The soccer tournament group stage will take place Tuesday and Wednesday followed by a double-elimination round based on the group stage results. The Copa Rama Championship Cup game will be played on Thursday afternoon. Times and teams will be announced and posted at the RecPlex.

Super Rama Bowl Flag Football: Do you have what it takes to win the Super Rama Bowl? Teams should consist of 10 to 12 people with all members being on same "color" team for Team Competitions to earn points. Sign up for the tournament is required and will take place on Monday until 4:30 p.m. in the RecPlex. Open Play will be Monday. The road to the Super Rama Bowl division play will take place on Tuesday and Wednesday. Double-elimination playoffs on Thursday based on regular season results. Super Rama Bowl championship game will be played on Thursday afternoon. Times and teams will be announced and posted at the RecPlex.

Archery Tag: You won't want to miss this exciting new game. Open play is Monday through Thursday during scheduled activities time. Bring your team (and get some additional points) or just get in line and get assigned to a team. All equipment is provided, and no separate release form or fee is required to play.

Laser Tag: Experience exciting team play Laser Tag with bunkers and lots of action. All equipment will be provided. Tickets are required and can be purchased at the Deaverton Snack Bar for \$3.00.

Paintball: Come play this customized course where all the equipment and 100 paintballs are provided for each session. Get your team of 10 to 12 together or just get in line and be assigned to a team. Tickets are required and can be purchased at the Deaverton Snack Bar for \$5.00. Special release form from Bill's Extreme Paintball must be signed by a parent or guardian to play.

Ranger Derby: Campers, start your engines! Registration in the Ranger Derby area will be next to the Camporama Store at the following times:

- Monday, July 18 from 2:00 – 5:00 p.m.
- Tuesday, July 19 from 9:15 – 11:30 a.m.
- Bring your form or get one at registration.

The race schedule will be posted at the Ranger Derby area, but you don't need to be present for your car to race. Check in for results and to pick up your awards on Thursday from 2:00 – 4:30 p.m. You must have your Camporama ID. Awards will not be mailed if they are not picked up.

Shooting Sports: Stop by one of the many ranges available at Camporama. From BB gun to archery to black powder, there's something for everyone at the Mathews Archery Range, Daisy Air Rifle Range, Brownells Trap Range, and the Brownells Rifle Range (small bore and black powder).





FRONTIERSMEN CAMPING FELLOWSHIP 50TH ANNIVERSARY

Welcome to the celebration of 50 years of the lore and color of the Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship! Several generations of servant leaders have been raised up through the inspired brotherhood of the FCF. Many lifetime friendships and a generation of leaders who have been mentored by the early members of this great fellowship are active today. Those same leaders contribute daily to seeing that the next generation of Christian warriors are ready to take up the mantle of leadership.

FCF is a special program of Royal Rangers that provides boys and men with additional opportunities to develop specialized outdoor skills based on the lore and traditions of the early American frontiersmen. Since 1966, FCF has inspired its members to "give and to serve" in support of Royal Rangers, missions efforts around the world, and the ministries of the local church.

In 1966, Johnnie Barnes, Royal Rangers National Commander announced the formation of the Frontiersmen Camping Fraternity (FCF) only 4 years after the start of Royal Rangers. The first FCF chapter was chartered in July of that year in Southern California with three more chapters being organized in the Northern California, Nevada, Southern Missouri, and Iowa districts later that year.



The first FCF membership initiation was conducted at Fort Pinecrest, in Twin Peaks, California, on July 8, 1966.

Since the start of the program, FCF has passed many significant milestones throughout its colorful 50-year history:

1970 – John Eller ("Strong Leader") is appointed as the first FCF national president.

1972 – The first National FCF Rendezvous is held at Fantastic Caverns near Springfield, Missouri, with over 200 members in attendance. National Rendezvous are held in 1976, 1980, 1984, 1988, 1992, 1996, 2000, 2004, 2008, and 2014.

1974 – Fred Deaver ("Hawkeye") is elected as the 2nd FCF national president at the National Camporama in Colorado.

1991 – The Frontiersmen Camping Fraternity name is changed to Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship to better describe the mission of FCF.

2002 – Rick Dostal ("Simon Tanner") is appointed the 3rd FCF national president.

2005 – Jim Rounsville ("Silver Wolf") is appointed the 4th FCF national president.

2009 – Paul Walters ("Grey Owl") is appointed the 5th FCF national president.

2014 – The tenth and largest National FCF Rendezvous was held at Camp Eagle Rock in Eagle Rock, Missouri.

The history of FCF continues today as men and boys from across the nation continue to represent the ideals of the program as they give and serve to build God's kingdom. This rich history will continue at our next National Rendezvous planned for July 16-20, 2018, at Eagle Rock, Missouri. Make plans now to be a part of this memorable event.

Together we will explore the adventure He created you to live an how you can live this adventure fully.


Each day we ask you to do 3 things:

NATIONAL CAMPORAMA 2016 MERIT

General Overview

National Camporama is a unique experience filled with a variety of fun things to do. But in order to enjoy the full experience, you'll want to make yourself fully aware of everything going on and participate in as many things as possible. The Camporama 2016 Merit is designed to help you get the most out of Camporama by introducing you to the variety of activities available to you at this event.

Note that this merit is classified as a silver skill merit and may be used to satisfy your regular advancement requirements.

Merit patches may be picked up by your adult leaders during Camporama at the Camporama Store on Thursday, July 21. As with all merits, your group leader will determine when you have satisfactorily met the requirements for this merit.

MERIT REQUIREMENTS

1. Attend Camporama 2016 as a registered camper.
2. Read your Camporama Notebook and answer the following questions. This this can be done on your own or as a group with the other guys from your outpost.
 - a. What are the five points of the Camporama Code?
 - b. What can you do to prevent dehydration, insect bites, and sunburn?
 - c. When do the gates open for the first evening rally?
3. Using the camp map in the back of your notebook, identify the location of each of the following:
 - a. Your district campsite
 - b. Your assigned meal pavilion
 - c. Your region's first aid station and the main first aid station
 - d. The amphitheater
 - e. The FCF village
4. Participate in each of the following activities.
 - a. Tour the FCF History Museum and participate in the historical timeline trail.
 - b. Visit The Muse and check out the displays and performances.
 - c. Participate in the team games on the Field of Champions as a player, cheer team member, or coach.

5. Earn a minimum of 25 points from any combination of the following activities:

- a. Earn 1 point for each activity you participate in other than those already listed above (max. 10 points).
- b. Earn 1 point for each “Stamp-O-Rama” stamp collected in your Camporama Notebook (max. 10 points).
- c. Earn 1 point for each hat pin collected and displayed on your Camporama hat (max. 10 points).
- d. Earn 1 point for each new person you meet, and write their personal information in your Camporama Notebook (max. 10 points).

6. Complete each of the personal daily devotions in the Camporama Notebook.

7. Assist in keeping Camp Eagle Rock clean by cleaning up around your meal pavilion after each meal, cleaning up around your district camping area, and picking up after yourself all day wherever you go.

8. Share with your parent, leader, group, or church what you enjoyed most about Camporama and what you learned from the morning devotionals and evening services.

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


