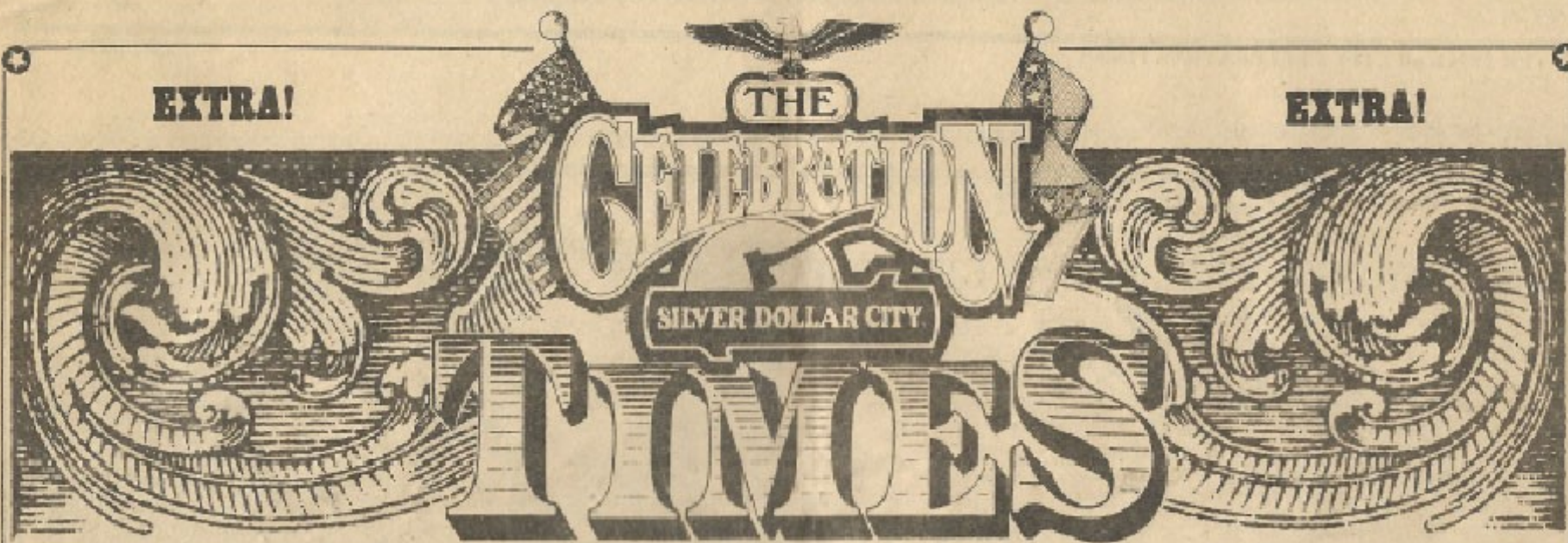

# SILVER DOLLAR CITY WELCOMES 1982 ROYAL RANGERS CAMPORAMA

## OVER 3000 EXPECTED TO ATTEND CAMPORAMA

The Royal Rangers National Camporama is being held the week of July 27-31, 1982, at Silver Dollar City in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee. More than 3,200 men and boys from across America are expected at the quadrennial event.

Activities during the Camporama will include a day at the World's Fair in Knoxville, the Frontier Village plus attractions at Silver Dollar City.

The entire camp is set out-of-doors with individuals sleeping in tents. Other events such as the

Advanced Awards Midway, Rifle and Archery Range, swimming and outdoor displays will round out the program. A special Friendship Patch will be issued to those campers who visit the other campsites plus a Camporama Patch to all Royal Rangers who attend.

Visits to the Camporama will be restricted to members of immediate families of those attending and members of the press corps.

Royal Rangers is the boys' program of the Assemblies of God and is celebrating its 20th anniversary this year. More than 360,000 boys and 80,000 men have been involved during this period.

Previous Camporamas have been conducted at the United States Air Force Academy (1974) and in Farragut, Idaho (1978).

Johnnie Barnes, founder and National Commander, assisted by other members of the National Staff, regional and district officers is in charge of the event.

## CAMPORAMA EVENTS

There will be many exciting events this year at the National Royal Rangers Camporama. This quadrennial event will feature a Friendship Tour, during which each boy will receive a souvenir at each stop and a special patch at the conclusion of the tour.

There will be an Advanced Awards Midway, Rifle-BB-Archery Range, Hot Air Balloon, Obstacle course, plus displays from the Forest Service, wildlife, the National Parks Service, and the Department of Agriculture.

The FCF Village and Tradin' Post will be special features of the event.

Morning rallies will feature Rev. Silas Gaither, National Director of Church Ministries, who is also serving as Camporama Chaplain.

Pre-evening rallies will have special pageants related to the Camporama, American history, and patriotism.

The evening rallies will feature such outstanding speakers as: Johnnie Barnes, National Commander; Fred Deaver, National FCF President; and

## HISTORY OF DANIEL BOONE CHAPTER



1. The first FCF initiation was held at the 1967 District Pow-Wow at the Lake of the Ozarks.
2. The organization meeting was held on Friday, November 3, 1967, at Fantastic Caverns. Johnnie Barnes and James Griggs was in charge.
3. The first slate of officers were as follows:  
 President . . . . . John Eller  
 Vice-President . Ed Duddy Jr.  
 Scribe . . . . . Bill Altman  
 Scout . . . . . David Barnes  
 Assistant Scout . Ed Duddy III
4. First issue of the Powder Horn came out in November 1967. There were 16 members in 1967. This included the National office personnel residing in Springfield.
5. In 1968 the membership had grown to 36. A combination Outing and Initiation was held at the Fantastic Caverns.
6. In 1969 the membership had grown to 50. The outing was held at the Daniel Boone Home near Defiance, Mo. with 25 present. Elections were held at this outing and the following officers were elected:  
 President . . . . . John Eller  
 Vice-President . . Virg Palmer
7. 1970 - The outing that year was at Ft. Osage in Kansas City; an initiation was held in conjunction with the outing. (I remember there was lots of rain). That year the President of the Daniel Boone Chapter which was John Eller was elected as National President.
8. 1971 - The outing was held at Silver Dollar City. John Eller declined another year term as President of the Daniel Boone Chapter and Don Ray was elected President.
9. 1972 - The outing was held on Pea Ridge near Sullivan, Mo. with Virg Palmer conducting a Wilderness Vigil in conjunction with the outing. By now the Daniel Boone Chapter had grown to over 200 in members.

The above facts were given to me by Rev. John Eller.

### GET TO KNOW THE CRAFTSMEN AT SILVER DOLLAR CITY

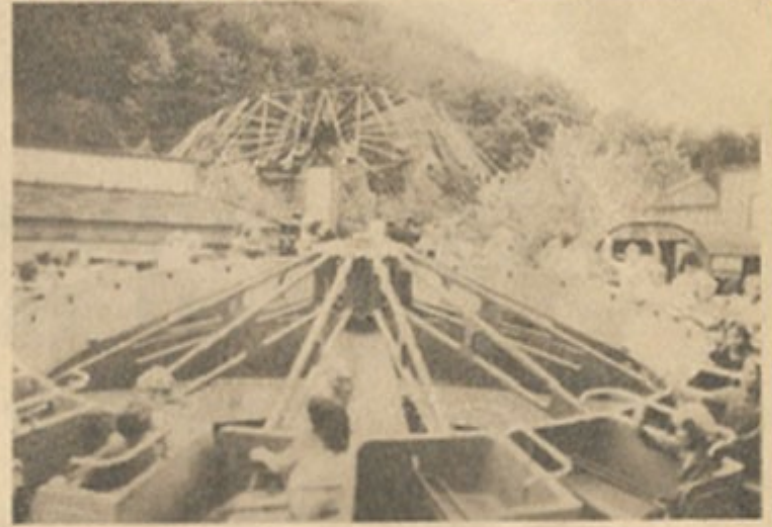
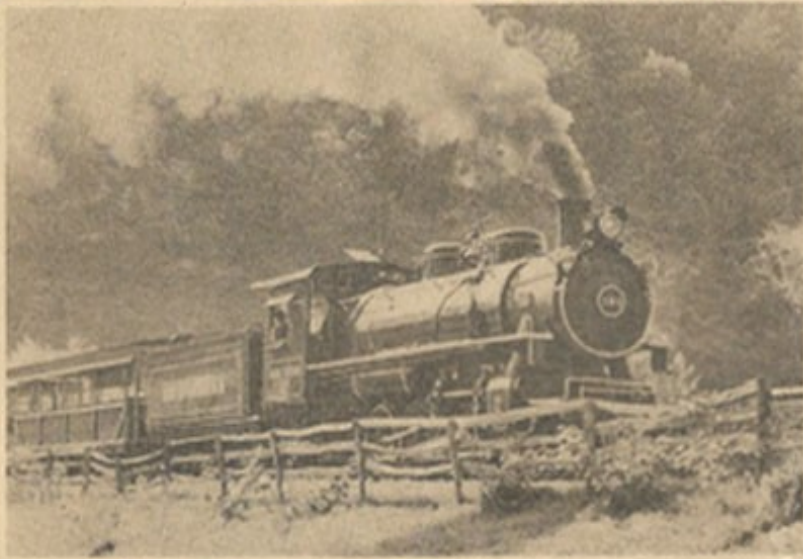

## ABOUT JOHNNIE BARNES - FOUNDER OF ROYAL RANGERS



Johnnie Barnes

In 1962, founded and launched a Christian boys program entitled, "Royal Rangers." This program has grown to encompass 40 countries of the world with a world-wide membership of around 200,000.

Author of 14 youth and outdoor related books. Most have exceeded 100,000 circulation.

In 1971, he launched High Adventure magazine. This magazine now has a circulation of over 55,000.

In 1963, he wrote and implemented a Leadership Training Course for men. This course is designed to assist leaders in: understanding, counseling and working with boys now has 24,000 men enrolled to provide additional professional training for leaders.

He also founded and implemented Royal Rangers Training Camps, National Training Trails, Winter Training Camps, National Canoe Expeditions, and National Aquatic Camps. Thousands of leaders have been involved in these on-the-spot training events.

To encourage youth to appreciate and preserve the skills and lore of our forefathers, in 1966 he founded a black powder club entitled, the "Frontiersmen Camping Fraternity." There are now 50 active chapters throughout the United States.

He has prepared numerous promotional and instructional

member of the National Church Commission for Civic Youth manuals, and many articles for various magazines.

Has served for 14 years as a Agency, formerly known as the National Church Commission on Scouting. This commission is responsible for the God and Country series for Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Campfire Girls, and etc.

The four cardinal doctrines are: Salvation, Holy Spirit, Divine Healing and Rapture of the Church.

The National Training Coordinators have been: Bob Reid, Paul Feller, Don Franklin and Paul Stanek.

Camporamas have been held at the U. S. Airforce Academy (1974) and Farragut, Idaho (1978).

HIGH ADVENTURE for boys was officially launched in 1971.

DISPATCH for leaders was officially launched in 1966.

Frontiersmen Camping Fraternity was founded in 1966.

The first National FCF President was John Eller, 1970-74.

The first National FCF Scout was David Barnes, 1970-72.

The first FCF initiation was held in California in 1966.

The five logs of the FCF fire symbolize: courage, achievement, friendship, woodsmanship and leadership.

The three steps in FCF are: frontiersman, buckskin and wilderness.

The three steps in the Trapper's Brigade are: Company Trapper, Bourgeois, and Free Trapper.

The first National Training Camp was held at Marshfield, Mo., in 1968.

The first District-wide Pow Wows were held in 1964.
