We then moved on to Memphis, TN to assist Craig McGee in the much successful effort of getting supplies to the Hurricane Katrina victims. Then to Paris, TN to finish their roof. After Paris we moved back to the hurricane recovery and helped coordinate the Gulf Region FCF'ers in their outreach to the coast. We had 75 volunteers working across Mississippi and Louisiana saving the residents over \$335,000 in repairs and clean up.

We are praying that many teams will spring off from this effort as the men go back to their churches with the reports of what they witnessed.
