


Introducing the RR-MK Assist Program



ith the intent of supporting AGWM personnel worldwide, the national USA Royal Rangers Ministries office has introduced the RR-MK Assist Program. This program allows missionary families to seamlessly enjoy the benefits of the Royal Ranger ministry for their boys as they move back and forth to and from the mission field.

The RR-MK Assist Program was the brainchild of Doug Marsh, an AGWM missionary and former "Missionary Kid" (MK). Doug remembers growing up in Peru and one day opening up a special package from Springfield, MO that had the material to get he and his brother started in Royal Rangers. Doug's father was their outpost commander and Doug and his brother were the only two Rangers. From the humble beginning of a family outpost, Doug has been active in Royal Rangers ever since. He went on to earn the Gold Medal of Achievement and now serves as the director of Royal Rangers International (RRI).
