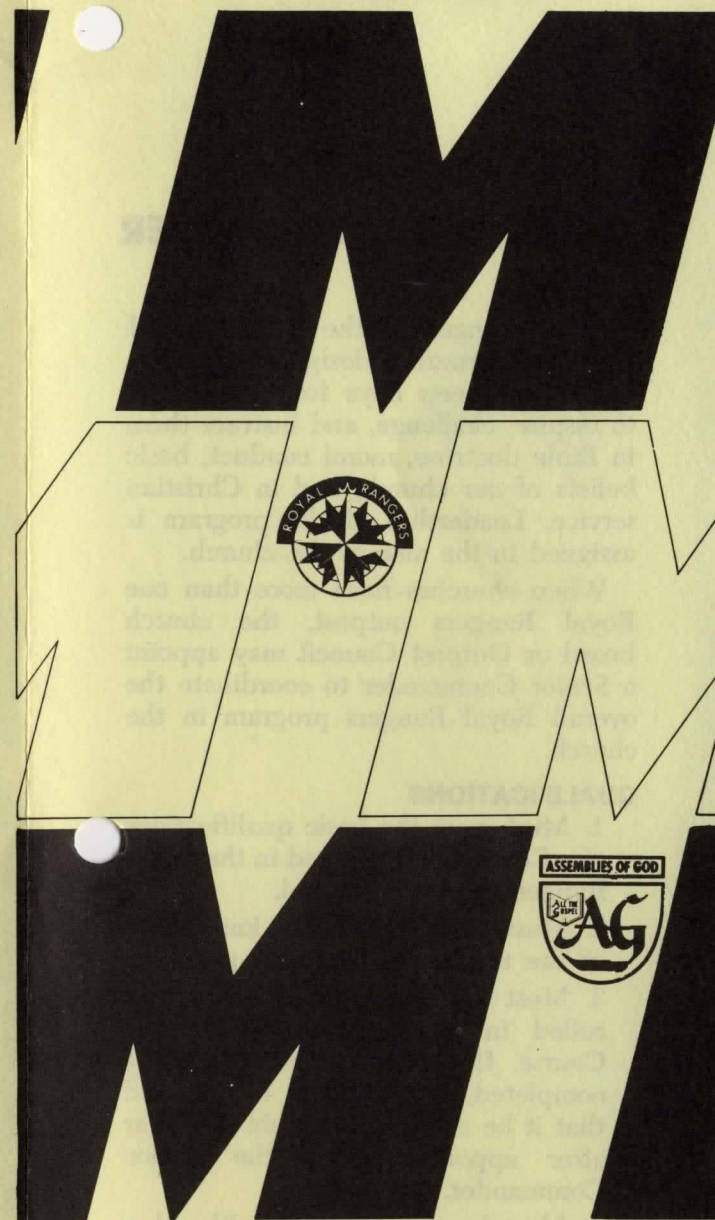

Key man to a successful Royal Rangers program in the local church.

Royal Rangers

SENIOR COMMANDER

Royal Rangers is the Assemblies of God boys program designed to reach, teach, and keep boys for Christ; and to inspire, challenge, and instruct them in Bible doctrine, moral conduct, basic beliefs of our church, and in Christian service. Leadership of the program is assigned to the men of the church.

When churches have more than one Royal Rangers outpost, the church board or Outpost Council may appoint a Senior Commander to coordinate the overall Royal Rangers program in the church.

QUALIFICATIONS

1. Must meet the basic qualifications of a Commander as listed in the Royal Rangers Leader's Manual.
2. Must have a general knowledge of the total Royal Rangers program.
3. Must have completed or be enrolled in the Leadership Training Course. If the course is not already completed, we strongly recommend that it be completed within one year after appointment as the Senior Commander.
4. Must be able to work with other men.
5. Must be willing to spend time in behalf of Royal Rangers.
6. Must be willing to attend additional training experiences, if at all

possible, such as the National Training Camps, etc.

DUTIES

1. Coordinates the overall Royal Rangers programs within his church. This does not mean that he attempts to assume any of the responsibilities of the Outpost Commanders or to personally supervise the Commanders in their performance of duty. Instead, the Senior Commander encourages the Outpost Commanders to carry out their responsibilities and serves in the role of adviser.
2. In conference with the Outpost Commanders, he analyzes the needs of the outpost to be sure they have adequate equipment and supplies to effectively carry on their programs.
3. Double checks with the Outpost Council to be sure that sufficient "Councils of Achievement" are conducted to give boys proper recognition for their advancement.
4. Serves as a member of the Outpost Council.
5. Supervises church outings and activities that involve all of the outpost, such as District Pow Wows, Father-Son banquets, Royal Rangers Week activities, and other special events that include all the Royal Rangers.
6. In the event that any of the Outpost Commanders need help, he may voluntarily assist in such areas as counseling boys and reviewing advancement requirements.
7. When there is a shortage of qualified leaders, he may serve in the dual

role as a Commander of one of the outposts, and as Senior Commander. However, this should be done only when there is not adequate leadership.

8. Serves as a member of the Ministries of Men Committee within the local church.

9. Makes sure that each outpost has an up-to-date charter with the national office.

10. Encourages all the Outpost Commanders under his supervision to qualify for the "Outpost Commander's Award."

11. Keep informed on the latest information from the district and national offices so he may pass it on to the leaders serving under him.

12. Confers frequently with his pastor and other church leaders to establish a good liaison and to avoid conflict in scheduled activities.

INSIGNIA

A special insignia has been designed for the Senior Commander. It consists of two white bars worn on the uniform. This insignia (Order number 15-MD-0382) and the additional supplies listed below are available from the Gospel Publishing House, 1445 Boonville Avenue, Springfield, Missouri 65802.
