ARE YOU BOUND?

(Submitted by Commander Bill Altman, Springfield, Missouri) We've been studying knots lately. How many ways can you fellows think of to bind a person?

Examples to add

(Strait Jacket, Chinese finger trap, Iron Maiden, etc.). Tell me some of the men that were bound in the Bible. (After they give a few, you say—"Yes, those are some of the *Physical Bonds* but there are other ways in which men are bound. *Mental Bonds*

Ignorance-Lack of Education

Self-made Bonds

These are perhaps the strongest of all bonds. Let me give you an example. Take a ball of string, ask a boy to put his hands together. Tie one strand of twine around his wrists. Ask him if he can break it. He will easily. Tell him let's try again. This time loop it about 10 or 15 times around his wrists. At least enough so you are sure he cannot break it. Give each loop a title as you circle his wrists. Example: (1) Today I said a bad word: (2) Yesterday I took a dime; (3) Last week I disobeyed dad; (4) Then I slipped off to see a show; (5) Then I looked at a dirty book; (6) Last Sunday I skipped church; etc.

Many men can escape from physical bonds (Houdini); but none can escape the bonds of sin. Jesus said He came to set the captive free. Free from the bonds of sin and death.

P. S. Be sure to release the bound boy.

DON'T WASTE YOUR LIFE

(Submitted by Commander Delmar Elliott, Guymon, Oklahoma) Purpose: To teach boys to accept Christ while they are young. *Objects*: A straight stick, a crooked stick burned at both ends, and a glass of ashes. *Story*: What is the matter with this stick? (Hold up the burned one.) Yes, it is burned at both ends. Have any of you been in danger from playing with fire? Many have played with fire without knowing it.

Can you guess what is in this glass? "It looks like ashes."

Yes, these are ashes. Sin does to boys what fire does to wood. It destroys usefulness. Do you see anything wrong with this clean, straight stick? No, and you could easily make something useful of it, if you had the proper tools, but you would find it very difficult to make anything useful of this burned and crooked stick.

Ceremony: Fellows, people are like sticks. Some people become Christians early and give their lives to the Lord to be used by Him. Others wait until sin has so marred their lives that there is nothing left to give God but the ashes of a wasted life.

This is the reason that God tells us in Eccl. 12:1; "Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth." God wants boys to accept Christ while they are young and then He can take their whole lives and really use them.

Fellows, as we pray, let us completely give our lives to Christ while we are still young, so Christ can completely use our lives.

below zero weather, the GI's could hear their enemy coming across the wide plain. Their horns and trumpets blasting and wildly crying like possessed men. In a short time the enemy was upon them. The GI's were outnumbered more than ten to one. With little hope of seeing the sunrise of the coming day, a GI BAR (Browning Automatic Rifle) man. though badly wounded, fought bravely and encouraged the other men, giving them faith to believe they could win. At dawn the hill was still held: soon replacements arrived to relieve the veterans of the nightmare that had taken place the previous night. Our GI hero when recognized for his deeds said, "I didn't do it alone, we had to do it together."

Ceremony: Fellows, these GI's fought to keep the freedoms we have in this country. As we sit around the campfire in the presence of the Master Ranger, let's think back to the beginning of our nation. Our leaders were men of God, they spent much time on their knees in prayer. Through history, we have seen God's hand in the leadership of our country. Our currency says, "In God We Trust." Do we? At the battle of New Orleans. General Andrew Jackson expected any hour an attack by the British army. He gave strict orders that morning no man should be far from his place, that there should be no unusual noise in the camp. One officer came to a tent where some godly men held a prayer meeting and ordered them to stop the prayer meeting. General A. Jackson, the defender of New Orleans, hearing this replied: "God forbid that a prayer meeting should be an unusual noise in my camp." The soldiers returned to the prayer meeting until they were called to the field of battle. We find in the Old Testament another great leader, Gideon. In Judges, the Seventh Chapter we read how Gideon with 300 "God chosen" men was able to defeat the Midianites. Their trust was in God! Fellows, at this time we will join hands around the campfire and pray to the Master Ranger that each one of us will learn to trust Him more each day.

STRONG, STURDY, AND STRAIGHT

Objects: A strong chain, a bolt, and a compass.

Story: I want to talk to you this evening about three "B's." This strong chain reminds me of the first "B." In 2 Timothy, we read, "be strong." The boy who wants to "make" the team at school must be strong. He will do the things the coach suggests in order that he may play and help win the game. Christ is looking for boys who will be strong for Him in the game of life.

This bolt suggests the second "B." It says to me, "Be sturdy." In 2 Tim. 2:3 Paul said: "Endure hardness as a good soldier of Jesus Christ." A soldier endures hardship for the sake of his country. The football player never complains about the scratches and bumps he receives in the game. If the soldier and the football player go through hard things without complaining, don't you think the Christian should do as much for Christ?

This compass reminds me of the third "B," which we find in 2 Tim. 2:4. Paul wanted Timothy to "be straight," that is separated from worldly, evil things, and he said: "No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please Him who hath chosen him to be a soldier." He wanted Timothy to go straight.

Ceremony: Fellows, in looking at the chain, bolt, and compass, I am reminded of Daniel. In Daniel 1:8 we read, "But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion

He refused to break or bend his resolution. He went straight.

Daniel, like Paul, believed in being strong, sturdy, and separated from evil. Is it any wonder that God gave this young man à place of real leadership? Fellows, be strong, sturdy, and straight and God can use you as truly as He did Daniel and Timothy.

CAMPFIRES

Read: Battle Hymn of the Republic emphasize verse of campfires. What is the purpose of a campfire? (Light, heat, cooking, protection, etc.)

Have you ever noticed how enjoyable it is to sit around the campfire? How the fire cheers you and dispells the darkness? You remember how people used to gather around Jesus? How they used to gather close and listen to every word He said? He was sort of like the campfire. The Bible speaks of Him as being the Light of the World, and very often in Scripture you will find He is contrasted against the spirit or the prince of darkness. It seems whenever men sat around Him, their darkness was dispersed.

You've probably read how early men used to build fires at night to protect themselves and drive away the creatures of the night. Many an old trapper would throw another log on the fire when they heard the cry of the wolf. Can you imagine what it would be like to live in a world of darkness, to walk through the woods hearing sounds, not knowing what made them? It would be scary, wouldn't it? It seems like when a person is afraid of night, it is always such a relief to see the dawn of a new day. Can you imagine how it would be to live in this world without Christ, the Eternal Light? I think it would be frightening because you would have no hope of ever escaping from the darkness which the Bible refers to as sin. You know, when I was a sinner, I really hated to see the sun go down. It always used to leave me with an empty feeling to see the night come. Now, since I am a Christian, everything is different. You know why? Well, I guess it is because I carry my light with me now; you might say my own little campfire. Don't you remember in the Bible, Christ said to His disciples, "Ye are the lights of the world." When you have Christ in your heart, and the Holy Spirit living within you, they dispel all fear and darkness.

THANKS GIVING

Purpose: To help boys see the importance of thanking Christ.

Story: A number of years ago, when a ship was wrecked in a storm off Evanston Illinois, a group of students at Northwestern University endeavored to save the drowning passengers. One of the men, Edward Spencer, saved seventeen persons from the sinking ship. As he was being carried exhausted to his room, he asked, "Did I do my best? Do you think I did my best?"

Years afterwards, Dr. Torrey was recounting this incident in a meeting in Los Angeles when a man in the audience called out that Edward Spencer himself was present. Dr. Torrey paused and invited Spencer to the platform. Amid loud applause, an old man with white hair slowly climbed the steps. Dr. Torrey asked him if anything in particular stood out in his memory of the heroic rescue. Spencer replied, "Only this Sir. Of the seventeen people I saved, not one of them ever thanked me."

Ceremony: Fellows, we often ask for God's help but forget to thank Him for what He has done for us. Let's open our Bibles to Luke 17:11-19. We read the story of the ten lepers who asked the Lord to heal them, saving "Jesus, Master have mercy on us." The Lord cleansed their bodies and sent them on their way. Only one when he saw he was healed, turned back and glorified God, and fell down on his face giving Him thanks. Christ asked where the other nine were. They didn't return to give thanks. The Lord said, "Arise, go thy way, thy faith has made thee whole." Always remember to give thanks when something has been done for you or given to you.

When the names of two fruits have been called. the boys with these names must change places and in the process, the boy standing in the middle must try to get to a chair before one of these boys do, and the one left standing is it. Also, the boy standing in the middle may say. "fruitbasket turnover" and all the boys must change chairs, and the one left standing is it.


Complete Book on Camping by Leonard Miracle and Maurice Decker.



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ROYAL RANGER WEEK

June 20-27 is National Royal Ranger Week!

The decision to set aside a special week to give recognition to our Royal Rangers was made too late to give proper publicity to it this year. However, if you wish to utilize the opportunity of recognizing your Royal Rangers this year the following suggestions will be helpful:

FATHER-SON CAMP-OUT. Arrange an overnight camp-out for men and boys. Encourage fathers and sons to pitch their tents together, cook their food over a campfire together, play camp-type games together, hike the woods together and share a campfire service together. Some men may hesitate because they dread certain discomforts. Proper camping can be a pleasant experience and the benefits of a fatherson camp-out far outweigh any possible discomforts. Sharing camping activities together can build a bond of fellowship between a father and son that could last for years.

Urge all of the men to participate. If a man does not have a son encourage him to adopt a son for the event. **GROUP RECOGNITION.** Arrange with the pastor to have the Royal Rangers attend one of the church services during Royal Ranger week as a group in uniform. Arrange for them to sit in a special section of the church together. Recognize or have the pastor recognize the group during the service. Some pastors will probably want to slant their message toward men and boys on this occasion.

FATHER-SON BANQUETS. Men who do not have sons should be encouraged to "adopt a boy" for the banquet. Make this a big affair. Boys love to sit with Dad during the banquet. Climax with a special speaker.

FATHER-SON PICNICS. Arrange for appropriate activities for the occasions such as father-son ball game, fatherson sack race, father-son tug-of-war, etc. A wonderful atmosphere can be created when men and boys play together. It is a big day in a boy's life when he and Dad have pulled together as a team to win some event. Climax the event with a big picnic lunch, wiener roast or watermelon feed. It will be a day both men and boys will long remember.
