The Commanders Purpose: To instill in each Royal Ranger the importance of working together as a team.

Equipment Needed: Pieces of string Have each Ranger take a piece of string and make a loop and tie. Let each Ranger add his link and put them together like a chain.

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 3:9 "For we are labourers together with God."

I would like to give you some examples of teamwork and the importance that it plays in our Royal Rangers outpost. In a football game it takes all eleven players on the field working together as a team to win. In a basketball game it takes the

cooperation of all five players on the court working together as a unit to win. On a baseball diamond it takes all nine players giving their best and playing together as a team to win the game. In the church, the pastor cannot do it by himself, but it takes all the church members doing their share and working together as a team in order to win souls for Christ.

In Royal Rangers, we must have the same teamwork they have on a football field, basketball court, baseball diamond or in a great church. We cannot expect the commander to do all of the work. He must have the teamwork and cooperation of the lt. commander, senior guide, guides, assistant guides, members and recruits. Each ranger must do his share and carry his weight if we are to win. You must complete your Bible study course, pass your requirements, attend your meeting regularly, be faithful in attending Sunday school and church, clean up your meeting area, obey your leaders and those in authority, etc. When you do not carry out your duties or responsibilities, you break the link or chain and your team (Royal Rangers) will suffer or be defeated. (Have the boys pull the chain and break the link.)

I would challenge each of our Royal Rangers to purpose in his heart to be a better Royal Ranger by promoting more teamwork in his outpost. Remember we are all laborers (Royal Rangers) together with God.

GAME IDEAS

"EARTH, AIR, FIRE, WATER"

Have everyone form a circle with one man in the center. The man in the center tosses a soft ball to any player he chooses and calls out one of the words: "Earth," "Air," "Fire," or "Water." Before the center man counts to ten, the player to whom he has tossed the ball must give an appropriate response:

for earth—name an animal that walks
for air—name an animal that flies

for water—name an animal that swims
for fire—he must remain absolutely silent.

No animal may be used more than once. The player who makes an incorrect response trades places with the center man and starts a new round.

"HOT POTATO"

Equipment needed: One potato and one blindfold.

Game: Call the boys together and form a circle with about fifteen or twenty boys at one time. Hand a raw potato to the leader who stands in the center of the circle, blindfolded. The leader gives the potato to a boy who passes it on. While the potato is being passed around the leader sings a song or hymn, stopping at intervals to call out "Hot Potato." When the leader calls out "Hot Potato," the boy holding the potato at that time must drop out of the circle. This continues until only one boy is left, and he is declared winner.

ROOSTER FIGHT

Equipment needed: One 20-inch length of broomstick or other round stick for each contestant.

Game: Contestants squat with the stick placed crosswise behind the bend of the leg at the knee. The hands are then grasped in front of the legs below the knees so that the stick rests in the bend of the arms at the elbow. The contestant hops on his toes and tries to jostle his opponent in such a way as to knock him off balance. As soon as a contestant loses his balance and falls over he is out of the game.

This game can be played by two persons at a time, by choosing sides, or as a free-for-all. It can be played either inside or outside.

EGG CARTON BOUNCE BALL

Procure an ordinary egg carton. Fold the halves back so they will lie flat on the table and label each compartment with a number (score). Attempt to bounce Ping Pong balls so they will come to a stop in some division of the carton. Score according to values indicated.

ROYAL RANGERS BIBLE STUDY COURSE INSTRUCTIONS

USING THE ROYAL RANGERS BIBLE STUDY COURSES IN YOUR OUTPOST

1. Have copies of the lessons run off by ditto or mimeograph reproductions.
2. Make extra copies to have a supply for new Rangers when they join your outpost.
3. Each Commander must complete the courses in advance. There are no answer sheets.
4. Explain the purpose of the Bible Study Courses to your outpost. Be enthusiastic!
5. Hand out the first lesson to everyone in the outpost, explaining they should take the lesson home and work on it by themselves. (Young Pioneers may need help from Mom or Dad.)
6. Have the boys return the lessons at the very next meeting. Give recognition to those returning lessons each week. Keep interest high by making weekly reports to the outpost on those doing good work.
7. Distribute the next lesson just before the boys leave for home. This keeps the lesson from getting lost, torn, or wrinkled. Repeat each week.

HOW TO GRADE THE ROYAL RANGERS BIBLE STUDY COURSES

1. During the Bible Study period review each question and give the correct answer. Let the boys grade their own lessons. This will give the fellows a chance to review each lesson, and will also save the Commander a lot of valuable time.
2. Collect the lessons and record grades in the Outpost Record Book. After recording grades, return the lessons to the boys.

In our last lesson we learned that the dove is a symbol of peace and gentleness. When an artist wants to represent peace, all he needs to do is draw a picture of a dove with an olive branch in it's mouth. A picture like this reminds us of Noah and the flood. At the end of the flood, Noah let a dove out of the window of the ark. The last time the dove returned, it carried an _____ (Gen. 8:11) in it's mouth. Thus Noah knew the flood was almost over and peace had returned to the earth.

To the Christian the dove has also become a symbol of the Holy Spirit. The reason for this is found in Matthew 3:16, "...and, lo, the heavens were opened unto him, and he saw the _____ descending _____, and lighting upon him:" When early Christians saw a dove they were reminded of their helper, the Holy Spirit. Let us see how the Holy Spirit can help us.

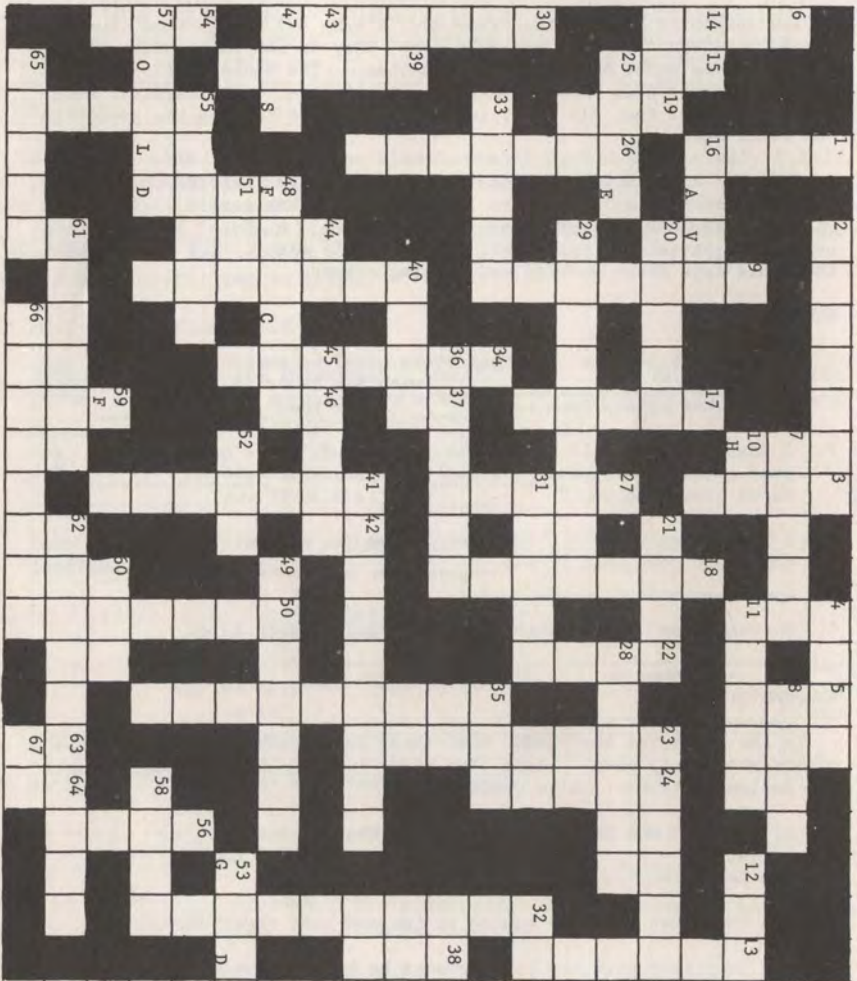
MAGAZINE BOOK RACK
