Commander's Corner....

Dear Commander:

You will note on page 15 of this issue a rank insignia change. For the benefit of you who may have questions regarding why this change was made, I would like to make the following clarifications:

For quite some time the National Office has been bombarded with requests for perma-press uniforms instead of the cotton-twill type supplied by Gospel Publishing House. On the other hand, Gospel Publishing House stated that they could not find a source from which to purchase permapress uniforms with epaulets. (I also tried to find some for my per-sonal use without success.) We also discovered that all military uni-forms now have the epaulets removed from the shirts. We were also informed that in the future such shirts will be impossible to find unless specially made.

While traveling on the field, I observed many leaders wearing the rank insignia on the collar in military fashion because their shirt had no epaulets. I observed others wearing the insignia on the shoulder of the shirt without epaulets, which looked even worse.

It was my observation that the variations of shirts with or without epaulets would be less conspicuous if the rank insignias were all worn in the same place. One of the strengths of any program is uniformity. Obviously some decision had to be made to help create more uniformity in uniforms. We also discovered that Royal Rangers is the only organization of its type that wear rank insignia on the epaulets. All others wear insignia on the collar or elsewhere.

We realized that in making a decision, we would probably be caught in the crossfire of those wanting a change and those already with epaulets not wishing to change. However, after carefully studying all phases of the problem, and looking into the future, it was our sincere belief that the proposed change was best for the overall program. We therefore made a recommendation for this change to the National M. F. Committee. The subject was thoroughly discussed, and a unanimous decision was made for the change.

Except for the few hundred leaders wearing cloth insignia (about 400) it is a simple matter for the remaining 12,000 leaders to unpin their metal insignia and move it to the collar. A miniature rank insignia will be made available for shirt collars which will look much better than the large size insignia.

DEVOTIONAL GUIDE

A STAR TO FOLLOW

(Submitted by Joseph E. Jolley Anaheim, Calif.)

Equipment Needed: Four large paper stars (readable at fifteen feet):

First Star with photo of movie star printed on it.

Second Star with photo of some world ruler on it.

Third Star with photo of the richest man in the world on it.

Fourth Star larger than the rest with picture of Jesus on it.

Strong flashlight or spotlight.

Note: *In speaking about each star, give any personal anecdotes you wish. 1. Direct boys' attention to the stars overhead and talk about the North Star which is used as a direction finder or guide for people all over the earth. Emphasize that each person needs a guide or light to follow.

2. Shine light on the first star.

Point out that many people use movie stars as their guide. They pattern their lives after these people both in action and dress. The popularity these people gain does not satisfy. Many of the movie stars wreck their lives by the use of drugs and alcohol, and quite a few of them try to commit suicide. Entitle this "The Star of Personal Glory and Prestige." This is not a star to follow.

3. Shine light on the second star.

State that many people would like to be a great ruler. They try to gain prestige by achieving certain positions in life; they hope this will satisfy. But when these positions are gained, they still are unhappy. Read Matthew 20:20-23 and point out that "The Star of Personal Ambition" will not satisfy.

4. Shine light on the third star.

Explain that this is "The Star of Riches." Tell the story of the rich young ruler who came to Jesus in Luke 18:1824; also Luke 16:19-31. Emphasize that riches will never satisfy. Quote Matthew 16:26,

"For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall

a man give in exchange for his soul?" 5. Stress the point that the stars they have just seen are not the stars to follow; man needs a greater star to follow. He needs a light to guide his pathway. Revelation 22:16 tells us of One who is called the "Bright and Morning Star." That Star is Jesus. Shine the light on the fourth star. The brightest light in all the sky is the "Morning Star." and if we follow Jesus, our Morning Star, we will never lose our way.

6. Turn the light on the stars one by one and explain again that they will not satisfy, but when we follow Jesus there is satisfaction and eternal life.

Give each boy a chance to accept the Lord Jesus Christ or rededicate his life while the light remains on the picture of Jesus.

CANDLELIGHT MEDITATION

(Submitted by Gordon L. Benson San Diego, Calif.)

Materials Needed: Candles, 1 for each person present.

Setting: A campout area

Purpose: To teach the importance of private meditation.

What to Do: Introduce your plan with a few words about meditation. Point out the value of meditation and the difficulty of finding time to meditate each day. Tell the group that it is as important for us to be still and allow God to talk to us as it is for us to talk to God.

Then ask each boy to light his candle and walk away from the crowd to meditate for ten minutes.

The sight of lighted candles all across the campsite area will be beautiful; but most important, the service will make some of the young men discover, for the first time in their lives, the experience of private meditation.

Close the service according to the leading of the Holy Spirit.

ONE WAY

There is a story about a man who often got lost in the woods. It was necessary for his friends to go in search of him. Finally one man became tired of this procedure so he bought him a compass and showed him how to use it. The next time the man went into the woods, he carried the compass with him. Soon he lost his sense of direction and pulled out the compass. It pointed in only one direction. The man kept wandering around. Finally his friends went in search of him. When they found him, they asked, "Why didn't you use your compass?" "I did," he said, "but it wouldn't point in the right direction."

This is the problem with many people spiritually. They have the Word of God which is a sure guide, however many do as this man did. They try to get the Bible to point in the direction they want to go. The Word points however in only one way—God's way. So many are left in confusion because they will not follow God's directions. If a man goes to heaven, it will be because he follows the Word of God. The Bible states in John 14:6, "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the father, but by me."



AWARD VESTS

An award vest is an ideal way for Royal Rangers to display a record of their achievements, ratings, pow-wows, and camporees. They may display advancement pins, chevrons, advanced awards, and guide bars which they have previously received in any age division. Camporee and pow-wow patches can also be displayed in this way.

These vests may be worn during any

Royal Rangers activity, except formal occasions, such as banquets and church services.

Make the vest from buckskin, suede cloth, or felt and lace it with leather or plastic lacing. Punch holes for lacing with a sharp leather chisel or make a chisel from a nail with a file. Use an old vest as a pattern or secure a vest pattern from a store. This would make a good outpost craft project.



GAME IDEAS BALLOON DUEL (Submitted by Warren Bebout San Luis Obispo, California)

Equipment Needed: A balloon and a piece of string for each boy.

Pair off your rangers or have them choose partners. Give each a balloon to blow up, tie it off, then tie it to his partner's wrist (right). At a given signal each ranger puts his left hand behind his back and tries to break his partner's balloon with his balloon. The one who breaks his partner's balloon wins the duel. He then has to challenge another ranger who also won his duel. This goes on until one boy is left, by process of elimination. The last ranger with the unbroken balloon is declared the "WINNAH."

"X" MARKS THE SPOT (Submitted by Warren Bebout San Luis Obispo, California)

Equipment Needed: A handmade large "treasure map" (a big piece of wrapping paper will be just the thing), a blindfold, a piece of crayon for each ranger (a different color for each boy).

Draw a circle where the treasure is located. Hang the "treasure map" on the wall. Each ranger is blindfolded, one at a time, turned around 3 times, and given a crayon with which to mark a big "X" where he thinks the "Treasure" is located. Be sure to give each ranger a different color to use so he will know which "X" is his.

The ranger who draws his "X" in the center of the circle, or nearest to it, is the "WINNAH."

Equipment Needed: A volley ball or large ball.

The players sit in a large circle and the leader stands in the middle, with the ball. He tells the players that when he throws the ball to them that he will call out either Old or New Testament, and that they are to answer by saying a Book of either of these.

The boy is to throw the ball back before the count of ten, and is not to repeat any name said before. If the leader says "Fire" the boy then returns the ball immediately without saying anything. The boy who cannot answer within the given time is given a point; also the boy who repeats a given name is given a point. The boy with the least points at the end of the game is the winner. This game may be varied by using names in the Bible, or by naming countries or states, etc.

SUBJECT: THE BIBLE AND NATURE STUDY

LESSON 54: TREES

A tree needs an adequate supply of water. To gather this water, a tremendous root system is developed. In their search for water, roots grow into almost every crack and crevasse. They make their way between small stones and into cracks of larger stones. They buckle sidewalks and pavements and clogg sewers. The tips of the roots are guided by specks of moisture which attract them like magnets. When the root reaches a drop of moisture, root hairs reach out and absorb it. The roots are continually searching for and absorbing the water which the tree needs.

Water is so important to the tree that if there isn't a sufficient supply, the growth of the tree will be stunted and the tree will become fruitless. A lack of water will cause the tree to die. On the other hand, a plentious supply of water will permit a tree to grow and become fruitful.

Did you know that God likens a person who studies His word to a tree with a good supply of water? Turn to Psalms 1:2,3 and read what He said. "But his _______ is in the _______ of the ______; and in ______ law doth he ______ day and night. And he shall be like a ______ planted by the rivers of ______, that bringeth forth his _______ in his season..."

Just as it is important for a tree to have a continual supply of water, it is important for a Christian to read and study the Bible regularly. Let us see what some of the great men of the Bible said about Bible study.

SUBJECT: THE BIBLE AND NATURE STUDY

LESSON 55: TREES

In this lesson we will study the palm tree. There are over 4,000 species of palm trees. Most of these grow in warm and tropical regions. Some palm trees grow over 100 feet tall. Palm leaves vary in size, but the more common leaf measures 20 feet long and 4 feet wide. The leaves of the Raffia palm are the largest measuring up to 65 feet in length.

The palm tree mentioned in the Bible is the date palm. Psalm 92:12, "The righteous shall flourish like the he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon." This palm has a single straight trunk and grows to a height of 75 to 100 feet. The roots of the date palm grow down until they reach water which is often 20 or more feet deep. These roots do not only gather water, but they also serve as a firm anchor in the time of storms. Thus the palm tree is able to flourish in the desert in which it grows.

Just as the palm tree needs to be firmly rooted in order to withstand the storms, so must a Christian be firmly established in God's Word in order to withstand temptations and spiritual storms.

LESSON 56: TREES

Trees have a special clock which tells them when to prepare for winter and when to start growing again. This clock is governed by the number of daylight hours in a day. In the spring, when the time between sunrise and sunset reaches a precise number of hours and minutes, the clock signals the tree to start growing again. Sap starts to flow, buds burst forth, blossoms appear and new shoots and leaves grow. So dependable is the clock of a tree that when we see the buds and blossoms, we know that spring has arrived and summer is not far off.



REVISED INSIGNIA PLACEMENT SHEET



Due to the difficulty in securing shirts with epaulets (shoulder straps), the decision has been made by the National Committee to change the leader's rank insignia from the epaulets to the collar of the shirt in the same style as used by the military. The insignia is worn on the collar of shirts, whether they have epaulets or not. This does not apply to coats. The insignia on the coats remain the same.

Leaders will no longer wear the R R Collar ornaments; these will be for boys only.

If a khaki shirt is worn with a dress uniform coat, rank insignia should not be worn on the shirt.

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The official Royal Rangers uniform is now available to both men and boys in a wide range of sizes.
