GOD'S GREAT OUTDOORSMEN

Take your Rangers on a stroll down Hebrews 11, the portrait gallery of the Bible. Point out these different heroes of the faith who experienced great victories for God in the out-of-doors—men like Abel, Enoch, Abraham, Moses, Gid-

eon, David, and others.

Conclude by reminding them that the Master Ranger, Jesus Christ, was an outdoorsman. Much of His ministry was connected with the mountains, the wilderness, the plains, the sea, and the countryside. Let your closing remarks present a challenge that each Ranger can do a work for God wherever he may be or whatever field of endeavor he may choose to enter.

MATCHES

Equipment: Two wooden matches, one waxed and one plain; water glass, % full of water.

Story: These two matches represent two lives—one without Christ (the plain match), and the other with Christ and filled with the Holy Spirit (the waxed match). Holding the two up together, they start out looking the same. Oh, if you look closely the one looks a little different from the other, but they are the same except for one small important thing, the Holy Spirit (covered with wax).

ANSWER YOUR CALL

Scripture Reading; Mark 3:13-19
Introduction and Story: There are many different kinds of calls. Maybe someone will call you long distance to wish you a happy birthday or to tell you some news, either good or bad. Businessmen make many calls in order to take care of their business. Hunters use game calls to lure animals to them by calling them in their own call.

When the house is on fire, the firemen are called. When there is sickness in the home, the doctor is called. When the plumbing doesn't work, the plumber is called. This key doesn't open the lock either. No, we cannot just read our Bible and expect to go to heaven, although this may help us and is a very good habit.

The next key is marked, "Prayer." Prayer is wonderful and we all should pray. Let's find out if prayer is the

GAME IDEAS

BEAN BAG RELAY

(Submitted by Sam Sciortino West Covina, California)

Select two teams (or more). Line them up in single file, space about five feet apart, all facing in same direction. The first boy is given a bean bag. He will start tossing the bag over his head to the boy directly behind him, who will catch it and do the same to the boy behind him until the bag gets to the last boy in the line. When the last boy receives the bean bag he will yell, "aboutface," then every boy in his row will also about-face, and the boy with the bean bag will start tossing it down the line again in the same manner until it gets to the original starter. The team finishing first is the winner!

This takes teamwork and coordination. The boys must stay in their position at all times, except when they fail to catch the bean bag. If a boy drops the bag he must pick it up immediately and take it back to the original starter, who will start the bean bag race all over again.

Rules: Stay at least five feet apart. You cannot turn around and look where you're tossing the bag. You must continually look straight ahead. At the command, "about-face," you must turn at the same time.

Suggestions: If bean bags are not available, substitute ping pong balls or paper cups. If the object is tossed high, the player behind can see it coming and play will proceed rapidly.

WHIRLING DERVISH

(Submitted by Don Franklin

Equipment needed: 1 rope, ¼ inch by 20
feet; 1 large gunnysack, approximately
20 newspapers (or many rags). Roll
sheets of paper into 4-inch balls, stuff
into sack. Tie neck of sack with one
end of rope.

How to play: Leader extends rope to full length, holding loose end with one hand. Boys form a circle around leader, approximately 20 feet away from him. Leader slowly rotates as he swings the semi-heavy bag toward the boys. As the bag approaches, each boy jumps out of it's way-if it doesn't hit him, he gets to stay in the circle. As the leader speeds up his rotation he shortens the rope and decreases the diameter of the circle. As the dizzying pace accelerates, the boys who are slowest to react lose out and must leave. The winner(s) is awarded the privilege of "slugging" the leader five (or as many as you dare) times. Note: This game will prove to be extremely popular. Plan to have a replacement ready after your first Whirling Dervish-you'll need time to recuperate!

Line up the patrols for a relay race. Have the first Ranger in each line run up to a given point, place one finger on the floor, revolve around his finger seven times, and then run back to tag the next Ranger in the line. Repeat this until all have had a turn. The first patrol who gets its last runner back first wins the race. Keep the runners away from the walls or other obstacles.

SOCK SOCK (Submitted by Gary McKee Staten Island, New York)

A long, heavy wool sock is stuffed with other socks until the toe and lower foot section of the sock is full. A member of the group is blindfolded and becomes "it." He then stands in center of room or play area and attempts to "sock" another player while keeping one foot stationary. Non-blindfolded players should from time to time attempt to touch the player who is "it" without being tagged. When a player becomes tagged, he becomes "it."

LESSON 15: THE BOOK OF FIRST KINGS (PART A)

This book records the last days of King David. One of his sons, Adonijah, took advantage of his father's weak condition and tried to declare himself to be the new king of Israel. But King David arose from his death - bed just in time to prevent it. King David then anointed (appointed) his son, Solomon, as the new King of Israel.

As the newly-appointed King, Solomon had every right to put to death his older brother for trying to steal the kingship of Israel. But, because King Solomon was a very godly man, his first official act as King was to show mercy - he forgave his brother! To forgive is to be Christlike.

LESSON 16: THE BOOK OF FIRST KINGS (PART B)

Our last lesson described the Temple and who built it. We learned that God's glory filled the Temple in the form of a cloud that was both seen and felt. First Kings 8:12-53 records Solomon's long prayer (sermon). After reading verse 54 of this chapter, describe Solomon's posture while praying at the holy Temple altar:

The final act of dedication was the sacrifice (peace offering) of many oxen and sheep. After reading 1 Kings 8:63, list the number of oxen and sheep offered in sacrifice: Oxen _____ Sheep _____.

As Samson was famous for his strengths and weaknesses, so also was Solomon famous for his wisdom and lack of wisdom (failure to keep God's laws). After being warned many times by God to "keep My statutes (laws) and my judgments...," Solomon allowed his "strange wives" to turn his heart away from God. He "backslid" ... turned back to the ways of sin. After reading 1 Kings 11:10-12, describe Solomon's punishment:

The 11th chapter of 1 Kings tells of Solomon's sins. After reading this chapter, complete the following:

(2) "Of the nations concerning which the Lord said unto the children of Israel, ..." (v.2)

God made it clear to Solomon that God's laws were to be obeyed continually ... from birth until death. Solomon paid a high price for disobedience. Because of his disobedience, part of his life was wasted. He "lost out with God." If we break God's laws, we, too, will pay a penalty. But YOU can determine in your heart to keep God's laws continually. By consistent, victorious Christian living every day, your life can have a happier ending than Solomon's -- it's UP TO YOU!

TIPS FOR POW WOW EXCELLENCE

Everyone enjoys receiving awards at Pow Wows! Boys stand tall when their outpost obtains recognition for excellence. Competition is keen as slim margins separate the winners. The little things count big!

First of all, the outpost leaders should plan for the Pow Wow well in advance. Weekly instruction on the procedures involved should begin several months ahead. This will prepare the boys psychologically and will also arouse their team spirit. During the weeks before the Pow Wow, each boy should be checked for uniform correctness. He should be urged to assemble his basic camping gear. Regular drill and formation periods will develop discipline and control.

Craft projects during this time should include planning for camp furniture to be constructed at the Pow Wow. Many awards and trophies have been won because an outpost was willing to put forth extra effort to employ lashing skills to produce rustic camp equipment. Encourage each patrol to select a name and a yell. Patrol songs and stunts for funtime will add much to the overall Pow Wow spirit.

Patrol flags can be both interesting and impressive. Some groups have designed their own outpost banners to display at the entrance of their area. Bolo ties can give a special identity to your group. Save a few extra ties to present to members of the Pow Wow staff. These are treasured by those receiving them.

Plan meals that are nourishing, easy to prepare, preserve and transport. Prepare enough so that guests may be invited from the Pow Wow staff. All tents should be pitched correctly with some specific pattern in mind. A taut canvas or a unique camp layout may gain just the point you need for first place. The interior arrangement of each tent is important since inspectors usually look inside. Bedrolls should be neat, with each boy's gear arranged in identical order near the tent door.

Attention should be given constantly to fire safety. Buckets of water and dirt should be nearby with fuel stacked at a safe distance. The fire area should be cleared, with a rock circle surrounding the camp and cooking fires. All fires should be secured before leaving the campsite for assembly or when bedding down. Camp cleanliness is important. All trash and garbage should be properly cared for. Cooking and eating utensils should be washed thoroughly. The latrine should be built properly at a specified distance away from camp.

The Pow Wow schedule should be posted along with a camp duty chart. Promptness in attending all functions can prevent you from losing precious points.

Finally, remember the devotions with the Commander. Some forget this, with all the rush of the day. Your group may not excel in all areas of camplife, but the spiritual impact you can have among your boys in the great outdoors will provide an eternal reward.
