Mark Gentry gave a report on the formation of a curriculums committee, which will study and update the Royal Rangers curricula on hand and review and recommend new materials for future publishings. Ed White reported on the development of a Decade of Harvest Committee that will develop goals and methods for obtaining these objectives. And a report was shared on the implementation of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee.

SIT is being designed to develop a selective group of trained individuals who will one day staff the national training camps. It will be composed of three levels of training: Phase I--Curriculum Study, Phase II--Practicum, and Phase III--Staff in Training.

SIT will be offered to individuals by invitation only. Applicants must be recommended by their district commanders and must have LTC, NTC, and ICS training. Additional information about the SIT program will be later disclosed by the national office.
