1995 National Royal Rangers Council: 🧓 Hopefully You were among the 220 commanders who attended the 4995

National Royal Rangers Council. If not, you will find this brief report refreshing. God's Spirit was among us in a mighty way. This was one of the most productive and spiritually charged National Councils.

me We met March 16-16 here in the future of Royal Rangers, the council theme 'Fan into Flame' (2 Timothy 1:6, NIV) came alive as councilmen pledged themselves to the Great Commission.

Let me share portions of the report that appears in the summer 1995 High Adventure Leader. "The challenge toward

revival was set into motion during the opening Silver Eagle Banquet, March 16, by Rev. Thomas E. Trask, general superintendent. Following his special message that evening, 41 district commanders received the Silver Eagle Award for their outstanding service to Royal Rangers in 1994.

"During the 2 days of business that followed, councilmen spontaneously pledged \$77,210 toward missions projects."

I challenged every councilman to give toward a national missions trip coming in September. Myself and about eight other individuals will be traveling to a remote Asian country. There the small group of hand-picked men will hike to high elevations to reach secluded villagers. Our goal is to distribute gospel literature and to pray for a move of God in that spiritually darkened region.

About \$4,750 was pledged toward this cause. Friend, I admonish you to pray fervently for this missions trip. We will be hiking to elevations of 18,000 feet. We will be combating the forces of Satan in this spiritually darkened region as we distribute gospel literature, fast, and pray. We need prayer for physical strength. We need God to go before us to prepare the spiritual soil for the seeds we will plant.

If you attended National Council, you will recall how we were moved by God to financially assist the development of Royal Rangers in Latin America. Missionary Doug Marsh challenged us to raise funds to help purchase 100 acres to establish a Royal Rangers training center in Costa Rica.

Pride swelled within as I witnessed what then occurred. For the next several minutes, councilmen stood to pledge their personal

Royal Rangers Training Department 1445 Boonville Ave. Springfield, MO 65802-1894 finances and the financial support of their regions, districts, and even outposts. We raised \$72,460 in pledges—sufficient to purchase 90.5 acres. Praise God!

During council I further challenged the councilmen toward Decade of Harvest goals, which I pray can be achieved by the year 2000. Please accept this challenge as you read the following:

- to place the Royal Rangers ministry in every stateside Assemblies of God church
- to place this ministry in every possible district approved non-Assemblies of God church
- to place Royal Rangers in every country around the world
- to increase the number of chartered churches by 10 percent per year
- that every FCF chapter endeavor to sponsor a Pathfinder trip each year
- to add 650 LFTL Junior Councilmen within the next year, then double the total each year thereafter—or have 10,400 Junior Councilmen by the year 2000
- that each district commander adopt/plant one new outpost every year
- that every FCF chapter president generate a one-to-one ratio: one leader to each boy in FCF
- that every district commander appoint a Harvest Task Force coordinator, whose portfolio is to strengthen the evangelistic endeavors of that district
- to promote the ministry in every Assemblies of God church each year, using the Royal Rangers 7-Minute Presentation.
 - that each district support its regional conference
 - that every national councilman increase training on all fronts
 - that each district commander look at fresh approaches to increase attendance at his district Pow Wows

During the *President's Report*, James Barger, president of the National Royal Rangers Council, shared the upcoming developments of the ministry:

- The Book of Hope: At the time of the report, \$102,709 has been generated through the LFTL Junior Councilmen program. The funds were used to produce 200,000 The Book of Hope urban Bibles, which were given to the Division of Home Missions for distribution in the 39 major cities targeted by DHM.
- LFTL Junior Councilmen: The national Royal Rangers Office is preparing to develop missions educational tools for the Light-for-the-Lost Junior Councilmen program. The materials will be made available to local outposts to teach Royal Rangers about missions and missions giving.
- Uniform Items: The current Royal Rangers uniform was reviewed by the National Royal Rangers Executive Committee, which recommended no change to the uniform. The khaki uniform will be

recognized as a dress uniform. The dress of the day for weekly meetings and district Pow Wows are the Royal Rangers T-shirts and caps.

 National Buckaroos/Straight Arrows Coordinator: The National Royal Rangers Council Constitution and Bylaws was amended to allow for the appointment of a national Buckaroos / Straight Arrows coordinator.

During another report to the council, it was noted that additional program options are being developed for boys grades 10-12 (ages 15-17). The national programs will be offered in 1996 to local outposts. See additional information below on this subject.

The council concluded March 18 with a LFTL Junior Councilmen evening banquet. Don Jacques, president of Light-for-the-Lost, and other LFTL councilmen barbecued ribs for the banquet. Servers at the banquet were Royal Rangers who were working to earn their Junior Councilmen requirements.

That evening James Barger, our special speaker, challenged councilmen to raise funds for the new Junior Councilmen project, Edward Elephant Says. Now we will have a stateside project, The Book of Hope, and a foreign project Edward Elephant Says. This comic book, with an evangelistic message, is being distributed by our foreign missionaries throughout Africa. Councilmen pledged to generate \$89,650 toward the Edward Elephant Says project.

The Harvest Task Force Seminar followed the banquet. Three workshops were presented: 1) Urban Evangelism, 2) Urban Leaders Training Course Program—a joint program offered by Royal Rangers and Teen Challenge, which trains Teen Challenge students about Royal Rangers leadership—and 3) Royal Rangers Turning Point and Insight Group.

Thank God for the vision God is giving us to reach our world for Christ. As we "fan into flame" a fresh burden to reach the lost for Him, we will witness the greatest days Royal Rangers has ever witnessed.

LFTL Junior Councilmen Education Program: Please remember our office in prayer as we seek God's direction to develop the educational materials for the LFTL Junior Councilmen.

We are laying the foundation of the educational program and will be calling on key individuals for their input. The concept is to provide the tools to outposts to involve boys of all ages in missions. Curricula for all grade/age groups will be developed to educate boys how to be actively involved in missions.

For example, we invasion developing central characters, such as a boy and his companion dog, that will travel through time in a spacecraft. The boy will learn of the spiritual needs in various areas of the world. We hope to develop a miniature spacecraft of some type that will hold the coins given by Rangers to the Junior Councilmen gospel literature projects.

Much work lies ahead this year in developing these educational tools, but we are excited of what results we will see as Royal Rangers actively participate in missions. Someday Rangers will becoming home and foreign missionaries because of what they learned in Royal Rangers!

Urban Leaders Training Course Program: We are already seeing great results with our joint program with Teen Challenge, training students to become future commanders. Two Teen Challenge centers in Cincinnati, Ohio, and in Colfax, Iowa, have implemented the program. Now district commanders report that the joint venture will soon begin in Tucson, Arizona; Minneapolis, Minnesota; and Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Don Brock, North Central Region coordinator, received these reports from the Teen Challenge of Midlands in Colfax, Iowa:

"Dear Don," writes Warren Husberger, executive director of Midland Teen Challenge, "I want to thank you for your assistance in getting the Royal Rangers training off the ground at our center. The

students and staff involved are excited about the possibilities. We believe this training will not only serve the overall purpose of training young boys, but also that specifically of discipling and preparing our students for the future.

"Our students have plugged into First Assembly's Royal Rangers outpost [in Des Moines], while the future plans of pioneering an urban outpost alongside Metro Assembly in Des Moines is still in the planning stages."

Writes Dr. Jim Dougherty, an LTC instructor at the center in Colfax: "Dear Don, I am writing to let you know how things are progressing with our [Urban Leaders Training Course Program] at the Teen Challenge of the Midlands. We currently have eight men enrolled in the course. We are holding classes on Tuesday mornings of each week from 9 a.m. till noon.

"The men taking this LTC have been carefully screened and selected by the staff.... Every Wednesday night these eight [students] work with the Royal Rangers outpost at First Assembly in Des Moines, getting hands-on practical experience. They are rotating through the various age groups, spending 2 weeks with each group....

"It is my firm conviction that the training these men are receiving—combined with the extensive and intensive discipleship ministry of Teen Challenge—will equip them to [one day] be an extremely valuable asset to any church, urban or otherwise. They will be some of the most highly trained and certified Royal Rangers leaders in our Fellowship—ready and eager to minister wherever the Lord leads them."

Challengers will be a combination of hands-on, vocational, and advocational programs that will enable Rangers to achieve maximum adventure while learning new skills.

The Air-Sea-Trail Rangers programs will come under the umbrella of the Challengers program, which will have a

common core advancement system. Similar to required subjects in high school, the Rangers will have topics they will learn of and apply in their Christian lives—such as Christian service, missions, dating relationships, discipleship, and witnessing.

A Challenger will be permitted to participate in the various national programs the outpost offers. The Advancement Trail for these programs will be merit driven. Rangers finishing up their GMA and/or aspiring to earn Ranger of the Year will be enabled to do so through the Trail Rangers program. The variety of exciting programs will be designed for boys of all types.

Ranger of the Year Program: We look forward to hosting the National Ranger of the Year winners July 15-22. Again this year the national winners will be escorted to various areas of the Ozarks, plus participate in the Eagle Rock Adventure, held at Camp Eagle Rock.
