January Pathfinder Trip: Myself and 12 other commanders just completed a January 14-21 missions trip to Nauta, Peru. Paul Etheridge, FCF field advisor, coordinated the trip. There we met with Missionaries Steve Ford and David Wagner. Our Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship Pathfinder trip resulted in a 30- by 55-foot church there in Nauta, where 200 people attended the opening service January 19.

What a marvelous site, seeing 200 excited Peruvians who now had their own church building. The pastor noted he could not adequately express his gratitude. What a humbling experience to be used by God in such a manner!

Myself and Gerald Jackson (foreign construction representative, MAPS Office, Division of Foreign Missions) attended as national representative.

Encourage the FCF chapters in your district to schedule a Pathfinder trip. The church construction trip will provide a church for a group of needy people; it will also place within each who participate in the MAPS trip a stronger zeal for missions.

Presentation to A/G Black Caucus: Our efforts to move Royal Rangers into the inner cities of America are progressing well. On December 14, at the invitation of DHM, our office gave a 30-minute presentation to the Assemblies of God Black Caucus, here at Headquarters.

General Information

A reminder from the National Royal Rangers Constitution and Bylaws:
Article III-Membership, Section 1.
Membership Prerequisites, Item 2 states: to qualify for National Council membership, an individual must be "a registered member of a currently chartered Royal Rangers outpost."

Phase-in of New Advancement Trail: We are anticipating the arrival of the Pioneers and Trailblazers handbooks by May. With this arrival comes an exciting and new Advancement Trail.

Soon I will be forwarding you a draft copy of the new Advancement Trail, along with charts that will be illustrated in the Pioneers and Trailblazers handbooks.

Below are guidelines, which you should become aware of, that will be appearing in the new handbooks.

"Welcome to the new Advancement Trail. Since you have been participating in the now old Advancement Trail, carefully read the following guidelines:

- Initially, the Advancement Trail of choice—either the old Advancement Trail or the new Trail listed below—should be decided jointly between you and your outpost group commander.
- If continuing with the old Trail, you must automatically begin the new Trail when promoted to the Trailblazers program.
- If beginning the new Trail below, the advancements you have completed in the old Trail can be transferred to the new Trail. However, to maintain your current rating when transferring to the new Trail, you must first complete all new requirements for that rating plus all new requirements for previous ratings.
 - 4. Phase Out of Old Trail: If continuing with the old Trail, you may compete in the Royal Ranger of the Year competition or complete the Gold Medal of Achievement requirements, using the old Trail, until January 1, 1998. In short, a dual Advancement Trail will exist during this time period."

Royal Rangers Turning Point & Insight Group: During the final night of the National Council in March, you will be learning more about how the Royal Rangers Turning Point Seminars and Insight Group curricula apply to the Royal Rangers program. Let me list here our objective and goals for the training and curricula application:

Objective:

To help boys prevent or overcome lifecontrolling problems. A life-controlling problem is anything that masters one's life.

Goals:

1. To train a select group of regional and district commanders to become certified Royal Rangers Turning Point instructors.

- 2. For those certified Turning Point instructors who are national, regional, or district representatives to conduct Royal Rangers Turning Point Seminars. These seminars are to be conducted at a) local outposts, b) district and regional conferences.
- 3. To train all commanders how to help Rangers avoid and/or overcome life-controlling problems. This will be accomplished through the following approaches:
 - Educate outpost commanders: Certified instructors will schedule seminars in cities and towns where outpost commanders from several churches can attend Royal Rangers Turning Point Seminars.
 - Educate regional, district, divisional, sectional, and area commanders and all Royal Rangers certified instructors about the role of Turning Point and Insight Group curricula by conducting Royal Rangers Turning Point Seminars at regional and district conferences.

Leader's Name Tab: The leaders name tab, worn on the left pocket of the uniform, should be worded to indicate the commander's name and position. example: "JOHN SMITH" (name, which appears in 14 point caps on the first line) "COMMANDER" and (or SENIOR COMMANDER, OUTPOST CHAPLAIN, LIEUTENANT COMMANDER, etc.—title appearing in 12 point caps on second line). The outpost group commander should not place on his name tab the words "OUTPOST COMMANDER."

In case you may have forgotten: The commander of an outpost group is called "outpost group commander," and no longer "outpost commander." The word outpost is used only to denote the inclusive—all groups, which make up the outpost—and the term outpost group to indicate a singe group within the outpost. Difficult to explain, but simple to apply!

Urban Bibles: We are receiving exciting testimonies from urban missionaries who report of people who have committed their lives to Christ after having received The Book of Hope. You may recall that 100,000 urban Bibles, called The Book of Hope, was developed and purchased through the funds generated by the LFTL Junior Councilmen program. This was our first literature project, which is proving highly effective in leading the lost to Christ.

Here is one among several testimonies we have received:

Missionary Richard A. Smith, from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, writes: "A 15-

year-old black male says his life had been changed [as a result of reading *The Book of Hope*]. He tried to sell drugs and to live the fast street life. But he now understands how God loves him and has a purpose for him."

Praise the Lord! And we have just begun. Within a matter of days now we will receive our second order of 100,000 urban Bibles, which will also be given to the Division of Home Missions for distribution among the 39 major metropolitan areas targeted by DHM. This will total 200,000 Bibles donated to DHM—all because of the Junior Councilmen program. The national office is planning to hold back a small portion of the Bibles, which will be used for a future national Royal Rangers Prayer Task Force Trip, yet to be announced.

I cannot express how thrilled I am that our vision for missions is expanding through the Junior Councilmen program. This year we hope to tool out a second missions focus that will affect all grade/age groups—from Straight Arrows to the Air-Sea-Trail. Our office will be calling on key leaders to help develop the concepts. Already the foundation being laid shows great possibilities in teaching Rangers about and involving them in the Great Commission.

A Note From Church Ministries Director, Rev. Terry Raburn: God is in the process of restarting and recreating this ministry [Men's Ministries]. He is leading and guiding to His perfect will in a leader, a renewed ministry, and an expanded influence.

I am looking for a new beginning this year. I challenge you to do the same. God is doing what He planned all along. Not just to keep the 'same old thing' struggling along, but to receive a new and powerful victory from the foundations already in place. New beginnings and new victories are ours in 1995!
