1999 National Council—The 1999 National Royal Rangers Council convened March 25-27, 1999. The main subjects of discussion were as follows:

Preparation for the 2000 National Rendezvous: An estimated 2000 Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship members are expected to attend. This will top the largest atten-

dance ever by 800 campers. Planning for the 2002 National Camporama: During the District Commanders' Breakaway, strategy was discussed on how to simplify

the registration process. **National Royal Rangers** Council President James Barger and Ken Hunt reported that a Strategic Planning Committee had been appointed to study ways to strengthen the Royal Rangers program and to improve its effectiveness in meeting the needs of smaller and larger

- churches as well as urban churches. The councilmen were informed that the Executive Committee presented a resolution to the Board of Administration, stating its desires to reach the goals noted above.
- The councilmen, during the business sessions, raised \$30,285 in pledges for Doug Marsh, Royal Rangers missionary to Latin America. The funds were designated to purchase a tractor for the Rangers training center in Costa Rica.
- During the Light for the Lost Junior Councilmen Banquet, the final activity of the National Council, district leaders pledged \$190,150 toward the two Junior Councilmen projects currently underway—Edward Elephant Says ... evangelistic comic book on AIDS (foreign missions project) and The Last Best Thing (home missions project).

GENERAL NEWS

Regarding Our Junior Councilmen Urban Bible: from Paul and Andrea Valerius, Home Missionaries to Newark, New Jersey—

During the spring and summer of 1998, Central Assembly of God in Newark, N. J., where we pastor, distributed 3,000 copies of the Royal Rangers urban Bible. Here is just one testimony of how this Bible has changed lives:

Qy-Deara Richardson, age 19, writes: "Do you ever feel lonely or hopeless? I don't know about you, but I have had some of these feelings. The Book of Hope has shed light on some of my problems, made my life more clear, and encouraged me to go to church. I was introduced to The Book of Hope by the church I attend, Central Assembly of God. I was coming home from school one day when I saw two bags hanging on my doorknob. I looked in the bags and saw some flyers and a book in each bag. When I picked up one of the books and started reading it, a piece of paper fell out that read, 'Free Bible.' It had a number on it to call. I called it, and that is what motivated me to go to church. I now have been attending Central Assembly of God for about 10 months, and I have been saved and water baptized. I'm thankful for The Book of Hope, which inspired me to do things that I did not think were possible for me."

Qy-Deara faithfully attends Central Assembly of God. She is a greeter at our church and constantly tells others about Jesus and encourages them to attend church. Those who are changed by the life-saving message in *The Book of Hope* are spreading the Good News and more lives are being changed ... to the glory of God!

Church-Related Child Molestation, Tax, Injury Acts

The following are excerpts from Church Law & Tax Report, prepared in part by Richard Hammar, legal counselor, The General Council of the Assemblies of God. Church-Related Child Molestation Acts—

- "An Alabama court ruled that a school was not liable for a teacher's acts of child molestation since it conducted a thorough background check before hiring him and did not violate its written policies."
- "A Wisconsin court ruled that a statute of limitations barred an adult from suing a church and diocese for injuries he allegedly sustained as a result of a priest's acts of child molestation."
- "A Kentucky court ruled that an adult who had been sexually molested as a minor by a teacher at a parochial school could sue the diocese that operated the school for negligent hiring, supervision, and retention."
- "A court in the District of Columbia ruled that three adults were barred by the statute of limitations from suing an archdiocese for injuries they suffered as a result of being molested by a priest when they were minors."
- "A federal court in Connecticut ruled that the statute of limitations did not necessarily prevent an adult from suing a diocese for injuries he allegedly suffered as a minor when he was molested by a priest."
- "A federal court in Rhode Island ruled that the First Amendment did not prevent it from resolving a lawsuit brought by victims of clergy sexual misconduct against church officials."

Church-Related Tax Act—

"An Indiana court ruled that a church-owned building was exempt from property taxation even though it was not currently being used for exempt purposes."

Church-Related Injury Act-

"The Indiana Supreme Court ruled that members of an unincorporated church can sue their church for injuries they suffer on church property or in the course of church activities.


