

The projects include:

- Construction of a new RV park with 20 sites complete with full utility hook-ups.
- A new 2,400 square foot Visitor's Center in the RV park. It will be a log building with showers, restrooms, laundry room, kitchen, and a meeting room for smaller camps.
- New well and septic system to supply both the RV park and RV Visitor's Center.
- Landscaping around the RV Center.
- Doubling the size of the existing campground shower facilities for Camporama 2002.
- New electrical power supply units for the food preparation and service locations.
- A new restroom and showerhouse facility to accommodate workers for the concessions and food preparation stands.
- Enlarging the amphitheater area to accommodate the estimated 6,500 attendance and updating the video and sound system.
