




Camporama Is Coming Fast!

raveling around the U.S. this past year, it has been exciting to hear of all the outposts planning to attend the 2006 National Camporama. David Moore, commander of International Pentecostal Holiness Church, is also promoting and encouraging his outposts to attend. It will be the **BEST Camporama ever!**

Here are a few updates on Camp Eagle Rock improvements!

Daisy Outdoor Products sponsored the new rifle range. This range will be a state

of the art facility. We have just completed the two covered shooting pavilions (24'x120' each). They will be able to host forty-eight (48) shooters on the line at one time, or each pavilion can operate independently. Daisy Outdoor Products will sponsor the air rifle event at Camporama.

Eagle Rock Archery Range: We are currently looking for a sponsor for the archery range; however, we have been completing the site work and the two covered pavilions (24'x70' each). Brennan Industries (suppliers



of Genesis bows) will sponsor the archery event at Camporama.



Food Service and Commercial Kitchen:

After the 2002 Camporama, we recognized the need to upgrade the food service. In order to do so, we needed a person with the skills and background to accomplish the goal. We were fortune to meet Ian Robinson, a Royal Ranger leader with the NPLAD district who is employed by the largest food service company in the U.S. Ian has put together a professional food preparation crew, and with the assistance of MAPS RVers and other volunteers, we will be able to provide superior food service for the 2006 Camporama. Because of Ian's volunteer service, we are able to build a professional full-service kitchen. The kitchen is currently in the framing stage and will be enclosed by October 30th. Tom Trump, a Royal Ranger leader and contractor from N. Missouri, is currently framing this project for us.

Recreation Storage Building and Internet Tower: With the purchase of new recreational equipment for use at Camp Eagle Rock, it was necessary to build a stor-

age facility. It was determined that the best location would be next to the new 96' tower for Internet service, donated by the South Central Region and Ronnie Franklin. This building is framed and awaiting the windows; it should be completed by October 30th. Our goal is to have high-speed Internet service available for the Camporama and to transmit the evening services live on our Royal Rangers website.

Amphitheater Improvements: We are working with a church from Sacramento to redesign all of our electrical needs for the amphitheater. A new large video screen and video building will be built, including lighting and sound towers for maximizing the


amphitheater area. Construction will begin soon on the building; video screen construction and electrical improvements will begin in March of 2006.

Deaverton Old West Town: It currently has eight cabins available for outpost campouts. Phase II has been started and will include a new kitchen and outdoor pavilion (24'x60') and two additional cabins, which all have complete d foundations. The large Phase III building, which would be able to hold another fifty campers, will be completed if we secure the finances.

Within an hour after placing the form on the site, we were receiving volunteers from many different areas of the country.

Through constant contact with the Convoy of Hope coordinator in the disaster area, we quickly match the needs of COH with the volunteers. We provide the volunteers with up-to-date information to help them prepare for their assignments as well. Knowing the location and the contact person to report to in the disaster area is extremely important.

RRA has sent many teams and individuals to COH and other district or local Assembly of God relief efforts, and several other teams and individuals are scheduled to depart to the disaster area in the next few weeks. Many volunteers are scheduling vacation time and will leave

LTA Training CDs Available in Bulk

ince the 2002 implementation of the new Leadership Training Academy (LTA) in place of the Leadership TrainingCourse(LTC),RoyalRangers leadership training has centered on trainees earning the Leader's Medal of Achievement (LMA) by completing a specific number of training modules. Certified LTA instructors have provided this training in their districts using PowerPoint presentations and training manuals provided by National Royal Rangers Ministries through training CDs sent to district commanders and district training coordinators each year. The district offices copied the CDs and distributed them to the instructors in their districts as needed. In March 2004, many districts requested that National Royal Rangers Ministries make multiple copies of the CDs available for purchase. Since many lacked the time and ability to duplicate these CDs, this option allowed the districts to obtain as many copies as needed without the time and expense of making numerous copies. Though some have been aware of this option, we are now releasing news of this option for the benefit of all districts.

Presently, National Royal Rangers Ministries has copies of the 2005-2006 LTA Training CD (released May 2005) in stock. This latest release of training materials for the LTA includes these valuable resources:

- All LTA modules required for the LMA,
- All elective LTA modules currently available,
- Training Class Report forms in multiple formats,
- LTA certificate and brochure,
- Certified Instructor's Notebook.
- and Viewer software for Adobe Reader, PowerPoint, and Microsoft Word.

This CD also contains PowerPoint presentations for non-LTA topics including:

- How to Use the New Curriculum (separate presentations for Ranger Kids, Discovery, Adventure, and Expedition Rangers),
- Ranger of the Year Updates for 2005-2006,
- and Church Legal Updates for 2005.

Any districts still in need of training CDs should contact National Royal Rangers Ministries. (Please note that the sale of these CDs is restricted to district commanders district training coordinators All CDs are available from the National Royal RangersMinistriesfor\$3.00eachinanyquantity while supplies last. Once our current stock is depleted, no additional copies will be available until the next projected release date in March 2007.

PLEASE NOTE: Due to fact that no new LTA modules or module updates are planned for release in 2006, the training CD for 2005-2006 will continue to serve as the most current LTA training resource until January 2007. This CD should be distributed to all new Certified Instructors as well as any instructors who have not vet received this latest

version to insure that all LTA training is conducted using the latest teaching materials. It is recommended that districts distribute these CDs regularly as part of their ongoing ICS process.



New Resources Available on National Website

The National Royal Rangers Ministries website has been improved with the addition of a new page entitled "Updates & Additions." This page provides a quick and easy way to access new information posted to the site. A link prominently displayed on the home page takes visitors to the new page, which in turn provides links to other parts of the site where information was recently updated.

In addition to the convenience of the page itself, the page also provides information by two new methods: National Update Bulletins and Leaders Resource Documents.

National Update Bulletins highlight changes or corrections to existing Royal Rangers materials. They are intended to be downloaded, printed, and inserted in existing manuals and publications at specific locations as defined by the subject matter. Bulletins currently on the web include:

■ Changes to the LFTL merits (red and gold) following the release of new LFTL videos

■ Changes in pledge protocols (announced in the Fall 2005 issue of High Adventure Leader)

Leaders Resource Documents are designed to provide ideas and information relating to various areas of the Royal Rangers ministry. Many documents on the site contain material previously published in High Adventure Leader or other Assemblies of God publications, or are included for information of a general nature. Whatever the source, these materials will serve as valuable tools for outpost leaders in conducting the operations of their outpost. Resource documents currently on the site include:

- Changing the World–One Boy at a Time
- How to Use the New Curriculum

By providing these resources in one easy-tofind location and formatted for downloading, it is our hope that they will serve as valuable tools for leaders in their ongoing efforts to reach, teach, and keep boys for Christ!
