

## Christian Broadcasting Network receives Dallas TV station as gift

DALLAS—A multi-million-dollar television station here has been given to Christian Broadcasting Network in what CBN President "Pat" Robertson termed "the largest donation the Christian Broadcasting Network has ever received."

Given to CBN by Doubleday Broadcasting Company are the ultra modern facilities and equip-

ment of Channel 39. These include a transmitter building, a 1,600-foot tower, four color cameras, engineering equipment, high band video tape recorders, a television van, office furnishings, and the leasehold on a large studio and office building.

The value of the items involved totals about \$2.3 million. The gift will enable CBN to create a major Christian TV production center.

CBN began transmitting from the improved facility Nov. 14, switching its operations and call letters KTX-TV directly over from its present Dallas facility on Channel 33. Nearly four million persons in Texas and surrounding states are within the station's range.

## Don't forget non-Jews were slain by Nazis

DAYTON, OHIO—Simon Wiesenthal, the man who tracked down Adolph Eichmann and other Nazis since World War II, said here that Jews have erred in presenting Nazi crimes against humanity as a Nazi-versus-Jew situation.

"We Jews are guilty of reducing the whole thing to a problem between the Nazis and the Jews," he told an audience of 750 at Beth Abraham Syn-

## Biblical work ethic seen balanced with rest ethic

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Preachers and politicians often push the Biblical "work ethic," but there is another side to the doctrine, UPI Religion Writer Louis Cassels points out.

Along with the admonition that people should be busy, productive and useful, earning their own keep and contributing to the needs of others, is the "rest ethic," Cassels writes, "an even more basic (teaching) of the Biblical message."

The latter, he says, holds that man's primary purpose is not to produce and consume, but to know God.

The columnist emphasizes the need for rest, and uses the words of Jesus to support his premise "The sabbath was made for man, not man for the sabbath."

agogue. "We need to say that 11 million non-military persons were exterminated by the Nazis."

In addition to the six million Jews, Mr. Wiesenthal noted, five million Czechs, Poles, Russians, Dutch, French, and other Europeans were killed by the Nazis, sometimes for helping the Jews.

The 64-year-old head of the Jewish Documentation Center in Vienna also criticized use of the term "war crimes" to describe Nazi atrocities.

"The crimes of the Nazis had nothing to do with the war," he declared, recalling that the concentration camps had been started six years before the war.
