

MAGAZINE PUBLISHED TO CELEBRATE 40 YEARS OF SPEED-THE-LIGHT

SPRINGFIELD, MO.—The national Youth Department has published a special 20-page, full-color magazine commemorating Speed-the-Light's 40th anniversary in 1984.

Included in the commemorative periodical are feature articles such as: a brief history of the first 40 years; how pioneer missionaries got around before Speed-the-Light; how Speed-the-Light helps spread the gospel in Communist nations; how Speed-the-Light has assisted missionary Mark Buntain in Calcutta, India.

Colorful photos illustrate Speed-the-Light's success in speeding the good news. Also there are statements from Thos. F. Zimmerman, leaders in the

Division of Foreign Missions, and many missionaries demonstrating the importance of Speed-the-Light to Assemblies of God missions endeavors.
