

Building for boys

Construction has begun on facilities at the new 1,445-acre National Royal Rangers Training Center in Eagle Rock, Mo. A log house is being built near the main entrance of the center for a caretaker/manager. The house is scheduled for completion this fall, and the lodge should be ready by next spring.



lence.' To suggest that a moment-of-silence statute that includes the word *prayer* unconstitutionally endorses religion, while one that simply provides for a moment of silence does not, manifests not neutrality but hostility toward religion."


White said he thought the majority of the Court would approve of moment-of-silence laws that did not mention prayer. Yet, "if a student asked whether he could pray during that moment, it is difficult to believe that the teacher could not answer in the affirmative," White said. "If that is the case, I would not invalidate a statute that at the outset provided the legislative answer to the question, 'May I pray?'"

Though she provided the sixth vote against the Alabama law, Associate Justice Sandra Day O'Connor filed a separate concurring opinion. "Moment-of-silence laws in many states should pass Establishment Clause scrutiny because they do not favor the child who chooses to pray during a moment of silence over the child who chooses to med-

itate or reflect," Mrs. O'Connor wrote. "It is difficult to discern a serious threat to religious liberty from a room of silent, thoughtful schoolchildren."

Moment-of-silence laws mentioning prayer are on the books in these states: Arkansas, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Virginia.

The Alabama law was challenged by Ismael Jaffree, an agnostic, who objected to the religious observances which his children witnessed in the Mobile public schools.
