new technologies that we





We have some great news about some new things happening in your age group!


New Vests Color for All!

Cool New Utility Uniform Available!


There is a new uniform option available, called the utility uniform. The shirt is a tan, utility shirt that has vents in the back to keep you cool and



He's also illustrated several Christian comic book projects, such as *PowerMark* and *Welcome to Holsom®*, and some children's books with Bible story themes.

Steven says, "Many of the projects I work on these days have biblical lessons and truths as their core message. It's entertainment, for sure, but the main objective in doing these types of books is to get the message of the gospel out there in a new and different way. Most of my work is geared for kids, and since most kids love comics, it's a unique way of fulfilling the Great Commission to reach kids.

I feel incredibly blessed to be

able to share my gifts in this way, because I know without a doubt that this is what God wants me to do."

Steven has had the opportunity to work on some of the most popular comics in the country, but one of his favorite projects has

been the Welcome to Holsom® series, which is a comic series created specifically to share the gospel with kids in a way that is fun and interesting. The idea for Welcome to Holsom® was first thought of by Steven's friend, Craig Schutt.

"I got a call from my good friend, Craig Schutt, who works in the Design Services department of Gospel Publishing House," Steven says. "He told me about the project and asked if I was interested in illustrating it. I thought about it for about two seconds and said yes! Craig and I had previously worked together on the *PowerMark* comic book

series, and I was thrilled to be working with him again. I knew I was in for something special with this series. I still consider Welcome to Holsom to be the most rewarding series for me personally to have worked on because it has all the elements that make a truly entertaining

comic book story (drama, comedy, action, cliffhanger endings, and, last but not least, giant robots!), as well as having a core Christian



Give it a try! And if you think you did well, send it in to us, and we'll put it on our web site for the whole world to see. You'll be FAMOUS!!! How cool is that???



INSIGEI Fitness for Discovery Rangers

Keeping your body healthy and in good shape can make your daily life much more enjoyable in many different ways!

or many years, Royal Rangers have sought to grow in four different ways—mentally, physically, spiritually, and socially. These four areas of growth are represented by the four gold points in the Royal Rangers emblem. Although all four areas are important, physical growth can at times be an important factor that affects growth in the other areas. If our bodies are in good shape, we tend to feel better about ourselves and our abilities to accomplish other tasks. However, if our bodies are in poor shape, we often tend to avoid physical activity and don't get involved in things that could help us to make new friends, learn new things, or enjoy great times with others.

For these reasons, physical fitness is something every Discovery Ranger should strive for. Keeping your body healthy and in good shape can make your daily life much more enjoyable in many different ways. But staying fit doesn't have to be a costly, time consuming experience. In fact, growing a healthy body is something you can do at home with things you probably already have around the house.



Discovery Exercise Routine

For boys in Discovery Rangers, the goal of a good exercise routine should be to improve balance, general leg strength, and basic athletic stance. A good way to accomplish this is through a basic jump rope routine. Jumping rope is a great way to strengthen your legs and improve your balance. Although a good routine will be different for each athlete and should develop as his skill level increases, the following simple format can be a great way to start.

To begin, make sure your jump rope is the proper length. Stand on the rope with one foot on the center. If it's the right length, the handle should touch your arm pit. Once you've checked your rope size, begin with this simple routine:



Warm up - jump in place for one minute at slow speed



Ali Shuffle - jump while moving one foot forward and one foot back.

Then jump again switching your legs forward and backward for 30 seconds.



Speed rope - fast as you can go for 10 seconds



(4) Single leg jump - 20 seconds each leg



Double jump - advanced - 10 seconds




Speed rope - 10 seconds



Run in place - while jumping - 30 seconds, repeat twice



Cool down - same as warm up followed by a light stretch of the legs





"Why don't we baptize you in the fountain at Puerta del Sol?" missionary Bock joked.


Mau knew the police did not allow

people to get into the fountain, but he soon had another idea. With the help of his friends, he filled a children's swimming pool with jugs full of water. Time after time for about an hour, the team poured containers of water into the pool until it was full. While they worked, curious people gathered to see the strange site.

When the time came, missionary Bock announced that Mau had filled the swimming pool for a special purpose. Mau told the crowd about Jesus' love for him; then missionary Bock baptized him. Cameras clicked as people took pictures of the exciting event. Everyone cheered and clapped.

Everyone except one person, that is. One man, Pablo, sat on the ground, crying. Another missionary, Dan West, went to talk to him and discovered that he was very sad and depressed. He wanted the joy that Mau had.

God's love touched Pablo's heart. Soon he was helping the missionary at Puerta del Sol too. He is learning all he can about Jesus so he can work for God in ministry.



Bringing It All Together









Royal Rangers is a Bible-based program for boys, created for the central purpose of developing the total boy for Christ—mentally, physically, spiritually, and socially. The mission of Royal Rangers is to evangelize the world, equip the next generation of Christlike men, and empower them to be lifelong servant leaders. This mission is achieved through seven methods.

1. Friendship

Royal Rangers provides boys with the opportunity to develop lasting positive relationships with other boys and with dedicated leaders. These relationships can have a powerful effect in shaping boys' values and behavior during these important developmental years.

2. Activities

Activities form the core of the Royal Rangers program. Through a variety of age-appropriate activities, boys learn outdoor skills, cooperation, leadership, and self-confidence. Many activities also include opportunities to complete requirements for a variety of awards.

3. Patrol System

The patrol system is a method of outpost leadership in which boys lead the various activities of the outpost. Each patrol (a group of 5 to 8 boys) selects its own leader (known as a patrol guide) and assistant. Under their leadership in cooperation with the adult leaders, the patrol works together on different projects, assignments, and activities in class and while on outings.

4. Advancement System

Boys have many opportunities to grow and learn in Royal Rangers. As they develop new skills and knowledge through meetings and activities, their progress is rewarded through a system of advancements and awards.

5. Service & Ministry Projects

Learning to serve others and put their needs ahead of our own is an important part of being a Christian. Boys in Royal Rangers have many opportunities to work with their outpost on projects that will benefit their church and community, providing opportunities for others to hear the good news of God's love.

6. Interactive Learning

The best way for a boy to learn a new skill is to practice it. Royal Rangers meetings and activities are structured to maximize the amount of time boys spend in physical, interactive activity while learning.

7. Uniform


Boys need to experience the value of being part of an effort that transcends their individual needs or concerns. They need the opportunity to identify themselves with a winning team or an exciting experience. Boys in Royal Rangers identify with their outposts and the program as a whole by wearing uniforms. These uniforms are available in a variety of styles, enabling the local outpost to select a style that best suits their interests and budget.

By effectively employing these methods, the Royal Rangers program seeks to bring boys into a close personal relationship with Jesus Christ and to develop within them the principles of Christlike character that will serve as a firm foundation as they daily live out their faith.
