FIVE HABITS OF A CAMPUS MISSIONARY NATIONAL YOUTH MINISTRIES

You can join thousands of students across the United States who pray, live, tell, serve and give so their friends can follow Jesus. They are called Campus Missionaries. They are students who follow Jesus at school. A successful campus missionary is someone who becomes more like Jesus, accepts responsibility for the lost in their school and community, and grows in Christ by developing these five habits: pray, live tell, serve, and give.

PRAY

Pray daily for principals, teachers, staff, coaches, and the rest of your school. Talk to God conversationally about your Five-Friend Focus. These are the five people that are committed to seeing others become followers of Jesus. "The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective" (James 5:16, NIV).

LIVE

Be like Jesus. Live in the Spirit and in the Word. "Be careful how you live among your unbelieving neighbors. Even if they accuse you of doing wrong, they will see your honorable behavior, and they will believe and give honor to God when he comes to judge the world" (1 Peter 2:12, NLT).

TELL

Share your story of faith with friends who don't know Jesus. "But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect" (1 Peter 3:15, NIV).

SERVE

Start or join a campus club and look for ways to serve your school.

GIVE

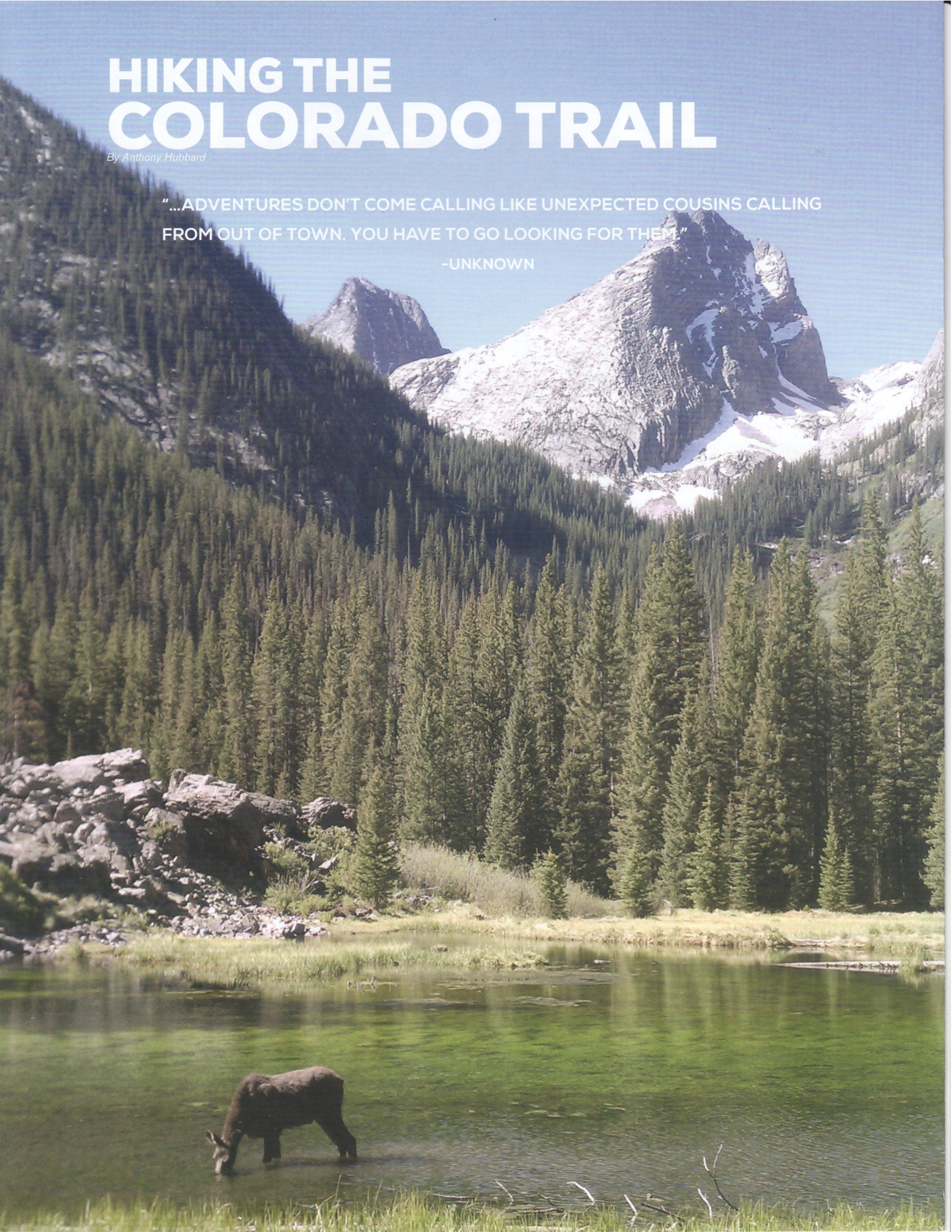

HIKING THE COLORADO TRAIL

In June of 2012, the Adventure and Expedition Rangers from Outpost 240 in Van Buren, Arkansas, set out on our first "Adventure Expedition" to a section of the Colorado Trail.

Training for the trip began months before the actual trip took place. We purchased gear, became comfortable with using stoves, water purification pumps, making our own meals, and packing gear, and then planned several backpacking trips close to home. By June, the group was ready for the trip to the mountains.

Our adventure began in New Mexico. We visited Aztec Ruins, a National Park and World Heritage Site. The Pueblo ruins were built 900 years ago along the Animas River. We walked on the steps and moved through the ancient ruins that were built by the Pueblo Indians. There are places in the mud bricks where you can still see fingerprints from the time they were built!

In order to acclimate to the high altitude, we spent a day in the city of Silverton, Colorado, which is just over 9,000 feet in elevation. On the third day, we started down the Colorado Trail. Even though it was June, there was still quite a bit of snow on the mountain peaks. The first part of the trail was easy walking and led to the switchbacks that descended to Elk Park. How exciting to stand on the edge of a 1,000 foot mountain and look out over the valley! The next leg of the trail took us to within just a mile of the Continental Divide. The site we chose was near a beaver pond where a female moose and her calf had taken up residence. You don't realize how big a moose is until you see it in nature, without a fence between you and the moose!

After six days, our exciting journey had come to an end, but the experiences and friendships that were shared on our adventure will last a lifetime!

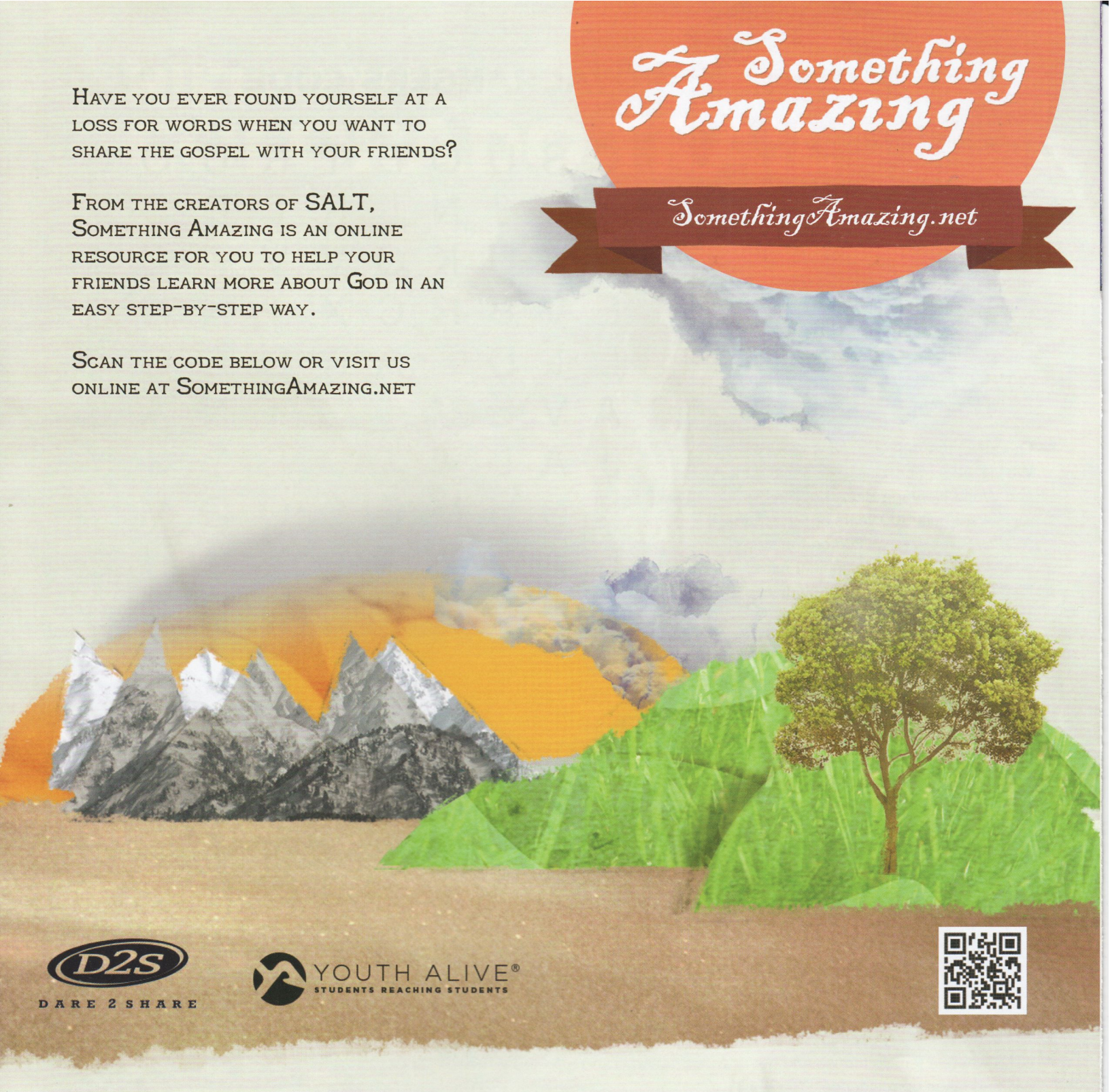
