

ADOPTED CHANGES (cont.)

ADOPTED CHANGES IN THE LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROGRAM
(effective May 1, 1979)

- I. That the Training Chief (bronze) program be phased out by 1982.
(Pins after that date may not be worn on the uniform, but may be worn on the award vest.)
- II. That the basic training of all proposed trained leaders be the Leadership Training Course I-IV and the Advanced Teaching & Communication course. (V).
- III. That the Training Chief program become a separate entity and not an ongoing process of the Leadership Training Course I-IV and the Advanced Teaching & Communication course.
- IV. That all Leadership Training Course Instructors wear the gold Certified Instructor Training Chief pins.
- V. That the qualifications of a Training Chief be as follows:
 - A. Non-Certified District
 1. Complete LTC I-IV and the Advanced Teaching & Communication.
 2. Attend and complete a National Training Camp.
 3. Receive permission from the district to take the Instructor Prerequisite Study course.
 4. Complete the Instructor Prerequisite Study course through an instructor or through correspondence.
 - B. Certified District
 1. Complete LTC I-IV and the Advanced Teaching & Communication.
 2. Attend and complete a National Training Camp.
 3. Complete the Instructor Prerequisite Study course through an Instructor Certification Seminar, in which the IPS is included.
- VI. That the term of certification be for a period of two years.
- VII. That a Training Chief who has taught a complete Leadership Training Course during his two year certification period may have his certification period extended, by permission of his district, to two more years as a Training Chief.
Stipulation: The National Office must be notified of all extensions.
- VIII. That after the two year extension period:
 - A. Non-Certified District---a Training Chief who's two year period is nearly up must be re-evaluated and recertified by the district staff.
 - B. Certified District---a Training Chief who's two year period is nearly up must be enrolled in and must complete an Instructor Certification Seminar in his district.
Stipulation: With permission of his District Training Coordinator, a man may take an Instructor Certification Seminar in another district, providing both districts are in agreement.

- IX. If certification is not completed, upon expiration of the certification status, a man may no longer wear the Training Chief pin upon his uniform.
- X. Certified Instructors who have completed the Advanced Teaching and Communication Course may teach the Leadership Training Course V (Advanced Teaching & Communication Course) effective January 1, 1980.

NOTES:

- V. That the qualifications of a Training Chief be as follows:
 - A. Non-Certified District
 - 1. Complete LTC I-IV and the Advanced Teaching & Communication.
 - 2. Attend and complete a National Training Camp.
 - 3. Receive permission from the district to take the Instructor Prerequisite Study course.
 - 4. Complete the Instructor Prerequisite Study course through an instructor or through correspondence.
 - B. Certified District
 - 1. Complete LTC I-IV and the Advanced Teaching & Communication.
 - 2. Attend and complete a National Training Camp.
 - 3. Complete the Instructor Prerequisite Study course through an instructor certification seminar, in which the 192 is included.
- VI. That the term of certification be for a period of two years.
- VII. That a Training Chief who has taught a complete Leadership Training Course during his two year certification period may have his certification period extended, by permission of his district, to two more years as a Training Chief.
Stipulation: The National Office must be notified of all extensions.
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 - B. Certified District--a Training Chief who's two year period is nearly up must be enrolled in and must complete an instructor certification seminar in his district.
Stipulation: With permission of his District Training Coordinator, a man may take an instructor certification seminar in another district, providing both districts are in agreement.
