Below is my report detailing what has happened between March 15th and April 11th

Committees

Student Research Day Working Group

We finalized the plan for the day for student research day. It looks like over 200 students from various faculties applied to present (either a poster or verbal presentation)!

Distinguished Teaching Award

We adjudicated and chose out of 10 nominees for only 4 distinguished teaching awards. It was a tough decision, as all of the nomination packages spoke very highly of the nominees.

General Faculties Council (continued from verbal updates last month)

As you all know, the AGC has been replaced by a General Faculties Council as per the new legislation in the Post Secondary Learning Act. Due to this change, MacEwan has a 'once-in-a-lifetime' opportunity to re-think and re-work the way that they engage in collegial governance. What does this mean? Well...

The 2019/2020 year will be a year of change for Academic Governance at the university. At the last meeting, Deb Saucier presented the changes that will be made for the 19/20 'transition' year. During the transition year, the main changes are that they will be re-thinking the standing committees (establishing new ones, changing the mandate, or removing current ones all together), looking at changing the time slot in which MacEwan engages in governance.

How does this affect students? During this year, they will be operating GFC at a 'bare bones' level of membership – which only includes members who are legislated as per the PSLA.

The only two student members legislated are the 'Students' Association President and VP Academic'. So, if you are following me still, there will only be two student members for 2019/2020.

BUT ALAS – do not fret, as we are not the only group disadvantaged by this change for the 19/20 year – all non-academic staff, alumni, and librarians have ZERO seats for this year. There will be a 'committee on membership' for the upcoming year to determine who should be added as more members – it will be up to the incoming VP Academic to wedge themselves on THAT committee to advocate for more student seats.

Other Business

Associate Dean of Libraries Reappointment

I sat on the reappointment committee for the Associate Dean of the library, Sandy Sift. I cannot comment on the result, as I don't believe it is public yet.

Projects and Initiatives

Council of Alberta University Students (CAUS)

I am happy to announce that we have hired a new Executive Director at CAUS, Jon Mastel. Jon has worked extensively within the field of student and external advocacy and we are excited to have someone with his caliber of knowledge and experience at CAUS.

Jon's first day in office was April 1, so I have transitioning Jon into his role at CAUS throughout the past few weeks. We are planning for the upcoming CAUS Changeover Transition conference and stakeholder engagement after the provincial election.

SAMU

The President, Advocacy Coordinator, and I attended two political forums. One was at the UASU that was put on in conjunction with SAMU. Unfortunately, only one candidate attended, but nonetheless the event attendance was phenomenal. The second was at the Grace Lutheran Church that had 3 candidates from the Edmonton Centre constituency. We listened to Bob Philps, from the Alberta Party, David Shepherd, from the NDP, and Chris Alders, from the Green Party.

Since Advance Polls opened on April 9, 2019, our Get Out the Vote (GOTV) Campaign has contacted those students who have signed up. We have texted and emailed them information on how to register to vote, where to vote, and a link to Elections Alberta where students can find information on how to access party platforms. We have about a 50 percent open rate on our emails, and our texts have been an overwhelming success. If you have any questions feel free to contact me.

Canadian Alliance of Student Associations (CASA)

The President, Advocacy Coordinator, and I attended the CASA annual general meeting in Halifax. We reviewed the CASA work for the year, set dates and locations for upcoming CASA conferences, updated CASA policies, and started planning for the fall 2019 federal election and the corresponding Get Out The Vote Campaign.

Projects & Initiatives

SAMU Building

The outgoing Executive Committee was able to do one last site tour before leaving office. The interior is coming along nicely, with walls being framed and site works like mechanical and electrical systems are being run. Glass works have begun on the building to encapsulate the building and make it "weather tight". The west curtain wall will begin to be filled in and will look super cool from the outside.

At the monthly risk meeting we discussed overage costs relating to site work for the project. We budgeted a contingency amount to account for extra heating costs and lighting for the winter, which was expensed during the cold couple months we had. Thus far the overall schedule and budget remain intact.

The last FFE (Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment) meeting is upcoming, and we hope to have that signed off before the current EC leaves office.

The retailers for the building have been selected, and tenant agreements are being drafted for negotiation. Until we have those signed agreements in hand, we are unable to disclose the selected vendors. But I think we had a fruitful RFP process and a successful selection, and am happy with the choices!

We continue to have bi-weekly building meetings with our Project Manager to stay up to date on movement and arising issues.

For your information, there is an upcoming pedway closure May 6-26 inclusive. There will be another pedway closure scheduled during the summer, and again prior to the building opening to prepare it officially.

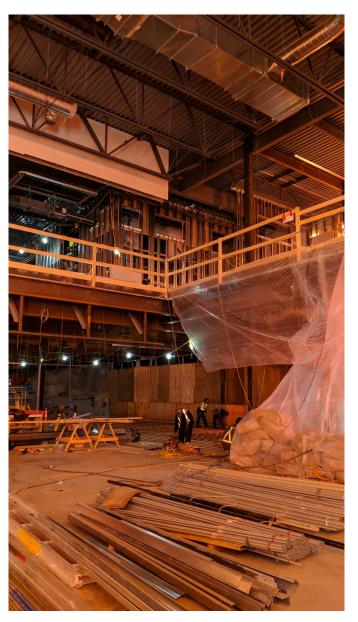

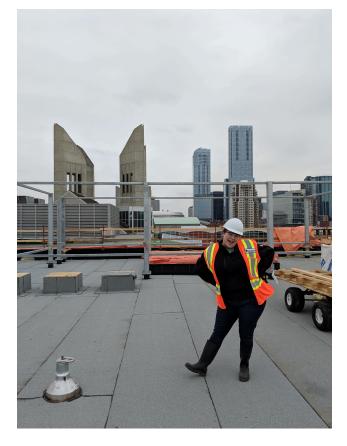
I look forward to a future SAMU with its own space, its own identity, and its expanded reach and scope to better its student members and surrounding university community. I think that's all our ultimate goal.

Prepared for the April 17, 2019 Students' Council Meeting

The Students' Association of MacEwan University elections for the 2019-2020 Executives took place between March 4, 2019 and March 14, 2019. After receiving no appeals, the results became official as of 4:00 PM March 18, 2019.

Here is the breakdown of votes for each candidate or 'yes' votes in the case of single candidate positions with an indication of each successful candidate. For the official election results, please see the SAMU website.

Facebook AMA

The AMA was held the afternoon of March 12, 2019. There was some technical difficulties with the execution of the group this year with the group going live on time but difficulties with postings until approximately 1 PM. With this delay, the RO and myself agreed to leave the AMA up until 4:15 PM to give as much time as possible for engagement, keeping in mind that everything was moderated and needed active attention while live. Although the group was shut down at 4:15 PM on March 12, 2019 the individual posts had to be locked manually which was not realized until afterwards and everything was fully shut down the morning of March 13, 2019. The page was kept public so that questions and responses could be viewed, but not added, through the voting period.

There were 24 requests for membership that were not approved as they could not be identified as students and 13 requests that came in after the group was closed. Two submitted questions were not approved for posting. The RO messaged both submitters

and provided them feedback on ways to reframe their question such that it would fall within the scope of allowed questions. One student resubmitted and their question was posted. The other student did not respond. Here is what engagement looked like on the AMA:

- 57 approved membership requests
- 54 active members
- 35 posts
- 203 comments
- 474 reactions (likes, etc)

Observations & Suggestions

This election, SAMU provided grommets to candidates and treated them as a universal material due to the last minute notification from MacEwan that grommets would need to be on all hanging banners. I would like to thank the RO and everyone who helped make the grommet situation as smooth for candidates as possible. I do not expect a similar situation to occur next year (where SAMU has to pay for election materials outside of candidate budgets) or in the foreseeable future unless changes in posting regulations at MacEwan change directly before an election cycle.

The election was relatively quiet from the perspective of the CRO. Only one question and zero appeals were presented throughout the election period. The question was in regards to decisions that were made in separate elections and the perceived inequity at how they were handled. The way that election policy and procedure are written, there are some very clear rules around elections that leave no room for interpretation, such as missing submission deadlines. I do not see these black and white rules as an issue and believe that there is enough guidance and room for interpretation in the policy as it stands. Governance Review Project

Background Information:

As presented in the attached Governance Review brief, SAMU is hoping to work on streamlining and improving our governance structure to better address some concerns brought forward by administration.

In this consultation, I wish to hear from SC about what they see as priorities for this project, potential issues or concerns they have, and what kind of reporting they hope to receive throughout (what will help you be informed and therefore be effective in your role).

SAMU Governance project will continue, on the consultation and information received from SC.

SAMU Governance Review Project Prepared for Students' Council

Hello Council,

As the Chair of Bylaws and Policy Committee (BPC), and as the VP who oversees SAMU governance as a part of my portfolio, I am submitting this report on behalf of the governance office, the General Manager, and BPC. I hope to provide information regarding a new project that SAMU, specifically the governance office and high-level leadership, have engaged in.

Project History

This project began some months ago, when the GM noted some governance avenues we have that made it difficult for her to navigate to do her job most effectively. Since then, we have been reviewing and working on how we can make those systems more efficient or better so SAMU can continue to function at an increased level.

The GM, along with the Governance advisor and myself had been working with a facilitator for a few months, trying to wrap our heads around what our governance structure could/should look like, potential gaps, and an environment scan of other board structures to see how we compare.

Recently, we decided to pursue the governance 'audit' more aggressively, and brought in a dedicated consultation to help review and facilitate any necessary changes or discussion.

Consultation

As a prime function of the governance structure, and the ones responsible for any policy changes as a result of our findings, I felt it most appropriate for BPC to receive a presentation from our consultant, Linda. We met a few weeks ago where we had an introduction into Linda's proposed changes and adjustments, those of which I will outline here.

Identified Concerns/Issues

Some of the collective concerns that were expressed through Linda's investigation and interview process include:

- Unclear delegation of authority
 - Who has authority and responsibility for certain functions
- Unmatched or absent procedures/policies
 - Meaning there are parent policies without associated procedures, and standalone procedures without an accompanying governing policy.
- No HR policies
- No official risk management consideration
- Inefficient committee structures

SAMU Governance Review Project Prepared for Students' Council

Principles and Goals

While working with Linda, the messaging was clear that student involvement wherever possible should be protected and enhanced – committee work is an avenue for students serving on council or at large can participate in the association's action and direction. The overall goal is to hopefully alleviate confusion/frustration by the affected parties, and work to streamline current processes.

Proposed Changes

Linda has provided us with some proposed pieces to work on, and we have begun engaging in those activities. She has identified some key areas and drafted some solutions, which we are working to evaluate.

The first is to evaluate the 'Approvals' procedure, and get to the root of our delegations of authority to find the pinch points for how operations works within that procedure.

The second is to evaluate committee function and makeup, looking for operational structures that should be removed from committees and put into operations, redundancies, etc.

The third is HR policy development, which is outside of SC scope at this time.

Next Steps and Reporting

Lots of the work over the next few months will be mostly internal in nature. Any major changes will be brought to the appropriate stakeholder group when needed. We will also commit to providing regular reports on activities, proposals, and changes. The VPOF will take on this responsibility moving forward. Changes to any SC structures will be done in consultation and approval of SC.

The project team is currently working on the delegation of authority and committee structures, and will be working with BPC in any amendments or tidying of current policies.

Conclusion

This project may come as a surprise to some, but I want to emphasize that these discussions do not come out of a place of desperation or severe need. We are lucky that we have the structure that we do, and that we are able to do so much good work. This project is about taking something good and making it better, protecting the longevity of our governance structure.

Again, we commit to regular reporting and consultation as we wrap our heads around what this means for us and how it affects how SAMU works.
