MacEwan University is situated in the centre of what we call the city of Edmonton, which is called Amiskwaciy Waskahikan or Beaver Hill House in Nehiyawewin (Cree). This is the traditional home of the Nehiyaw (Cree) and Michif (Métis), and meeting place for many Indigenous peoples including the Nakawe (Saulteaux), Siksika (Blackfoot), Nakota Sioux (Stoney) and other nations. Thank you, Chair. The disagreement around the fall reading week is largely because it reduces the fall semester's lecture hours by three hours. So the person in particular who was worried about that proposed that potentially you could make up those hours at the end of the semester by crunching exam time. So they were considering having exams on Saturdays and Sundays, crunching that in. There was a lot of debate on that because it might make exams unfairly difficult.

The other option would be then to start earlier, but when you start earlier there's a lot of other concerns when it comes to contracts and when it comes to rent and the way that leases work. So they'll probably, very likely, they'll end up keeping it the same way as presented in GFC at that meeting, but they are worried about... A very small minority [unclear] is worried about those three hours that we're missing in the fall semester with the reading break being introduced. So you could see an earlier start. You could see a more crammed exam period. I doubt it. I think they'll settle with those 36 hours, but that was the feedback.

CSTE On that finance policy you [unclear] restructuring, and who it would be reporting to. I

just was wondering why this was taken out or what... It seems big on those areas

without that information.

CH Thank you, Councillor Stewart. Vice President?

VPO Thank you Chair. One part of the adjustment amendment is it will no longer be

finance and investment. It would be just finance, as there was a changeover in banks in the recent past, before I stepped into the position. We are now with the new bank, and there is no longer any investments. It's just finance. We were getting a better return at another bank by changing over. So the reason our policy has gone from such... Couple dozen pages, reduced to a much shorter amount with all the

appendices is because there is no longer any investments involved at present.

CH Thank you, Vice President. Councillor Stewart, anything further?

CSTE I don't think so. Thank you.

CH Thank you. Councillors? Is there any other debate? Councillor Strayer?

CST I've got some curiosity towards where the current monetary surpluses are going, and

how this is going to change with this current policy? I wasn't able to quite nail down

the specifics to it with the proposed policy. Thank you, Chair.

CH Thank you, Councillor Strayer. Vice President?

VPO Thank you, Chair. I would like to pass this on to our lovely expert at the back, Director

of Finance [unclear].

CH Perfect. Director of Finance?

DF So do you mind just pulling up those slides? I'll go at the front, so then no one has to

go back and forth with the slides. So this is currently how our restricted funds happen. We have a, on the side here, all the operating funds, so this is the funds that we use to keep operations going. Then there's these certain other funds that are

used for certain purposes.

So this building fund that we have here currently was used for, essentially, gathering up enough funds to pay for the bill. That one was before... The excess revenue, 80% of it, would go to this building fund. The health and dental is just on its stand alone. The health and dental fees pay for part of the health and dental funds going in there.

Then the operating contingency is essentially like a rainy-day fund. It's basically whereby if there was any extraneous expenses that are happening in that year that weren't being able to be covered by the yearly operating budget. So for example, let's say SAMU got sued for a large amount of money. There's a lot of legal fees, unless they lost and, let's say, there's half a million dollars we had to pay for. We don't have half a million dollars in our operating budget to be able to afford that, so that's where these rainy day funds would be used to pay for, for example, those legal fees.



For the safeguards within there, it's already staying in the policy as it stands and as it is going forward as for that part of it. To be able to use funds out of there, you have to have unanimous UC approval and it has to still go through Student Council to actually approve that spending. So there's still those safeguards that it's not some frivolous spending of some sort to actually take money out of that [unclear]. So that's what is currently happening.

There's a certain max to be filled up in that rainy day fund. It's what I'm mentioning in there. Currently it's full to what it's supposed to be, but say again that half a million dollars had to get torn out of there because of these legal fees and lawsuit settlements or whatever have you, then all these funds start getting pooled back in here to refill it. So that's how it currently and going forward would happen. That's what's happening now, and if we go to the next slide...

What's happening and what we're proposing here is that the building fund is removed because obviously we'll have a new building within the coming year. What's going to happen is that there's going to be two new funds that are being built here. One is this maintenance fund, which you can think of as any large issues or maintenance that we have to do. Let's say there's some furniture and equipment that we have to purchase, or let's say a boiler or some random things like that need to get replaced, that's where this is happening.

Within this one, it's specifically named this way, where it's saying SAMU and MacEwan fund in there is because it's a joint fund that's required by our lease agreement to be funded. That's why we're going to be creating this new fund in there, for that. Another side note is that there will probably be some excess funds coming in from this building fund even after the building's built and all the furniture and equipment and everything is all furnished in there. So any of that excess, essentially, what the policy is proposing is that building surplus goes into this maintenance fund. So essentially it's just keeping it for the exact type of purposes that the original fund was made for.

Then if we go to the next slide, this is that future state of what we're suggesting. Over in here we're saying we stay the same. And over in here we're talking about these three new areas that we're trying to have a focus on within the excess. So if you go to the next slide, that's where the distribution of that operating surplus is distributed out into these three sections. If you go back one more, again the whole thing of if we had to use money from that contingency fund, the mechanism is that essentially some of that excess pool of funds that we're seeing from that previous slide there will go back to fill that up. So that's still in place. I think that's it. Any other questions on that?

Thank you. I don't know if this is necessarily exactly what we are approving and discussing today, but because of the investment portion that was a part of that policy and is now being taken out, I just have a quick question. Again excuse me if this is out of place, but how come we're longer... I hear from the VPO that with the new banking situation and our new bank that that's going to be helping us save money by just having finances and stuff like that, but isn't investments another way to diversify our income, especially as SAMU, and then why is that being taken off the table or is it in a different form or am I mistaken? Thank you.

CH Thank you, Councillor. Vice President?

Thank you, Chair. Again, I stepped into the position with the realisation that there would no longer be investments as part of the... As there is none. That part is no longer involved in the policy. However [unclear] is to the first [unclear] revenues and of course return to having an investment in the future, it would no doubt be added to the policy. But as present, if there is none...But if we could go further in deeper for prior to my stepping into this term, we can return back to Director of Finance and our General Manager to speak more in depth on that.

CH Sure. Does the General Manager or the Director of Finance care to supplement that?

DF

Sure. I'll supplement first and then Gwen probably wants to make some comments afterwards. So just to clarify, so previously the investments that we had were GICs. That was making around roughly 1% a year, ball park, something like that, and we were able to negotiate for the... When we transferred new banks, that the bank accounts themselves, so the savings accounts, essentially, [unclear], were making more than what we could get for those GICs. So we're making more than double that amount of percentage, so that's why technically there's no investments because that's not considered an investment vehicle.

And with in regards to just expanding on that future side of things, diversification, yes, that is an item there. But previously what was the main goal for those investments was the preservation of that capital, so making sure that it wasn't losing money because all that money would be used for building a building and from the investment side of things you need a longer time [unclear] to be able to be putting it into things, for example like stocks and bonds and things like that that have that risk of losing money over the short term.

CH Thank you, Director. General Manager, do you care to say anything more? No? Thank you. Councillor Stewart, anything further?

CSTE

I just wanted to say thank you for that explanation. It definitely helps clear things up for myself. And just a quick follow up. Is there opportunity to look at different kinds of forms of investments or still opportunity to discuss other ways to diversify that income with this bank and other opportunities that could arise?

CH Thank you. Vice President?

VPO Absolutely. I look forward to taking on that challenge.



CH The answer is yes. Thank you. Councillor Stewart, anything further?

CSTE No, thank you very much, Chair.

CH Thank you. Any other debate? Councillor Dykes?

CD Just to very much rudimentally summarise it, essentially we aren't investing anymore

because our accounts, they have a higher interest than if we were investing, correct?

getting better... One aspect was getting better quality customer care, and we were getting a better return just on the accounts alone versus the investments, as Director of Finance had shared. But of course, again, yes, I would love to diversify [unclear]

future to long-term sustainability for this organisation long after I am gone.

on clarification for the VP Ops. From reading the report, what I understand is 100% of our operational surplus will be broken down to say 100% of different funding for the building. My question with that is if we're giving 100% in allocated funding spots, like stated the report, what about if we have any emergency [unclear] for other programs and services. I see it noted in the report, it says for the health and dental funding that in the case of an emergency, there will be sufficient funds for [unclear] students. I'm just wondering about any of our other programs and services that might need emergency funds, what we're going to do about those, if it's all allocated to the

building surplus. Thank you, Chair.

CH Thank you. Vice President?

VPO Thank you, Chair. I believe, and I can redirect that to our Director of Finance, that one

part of the contingency is if we ever require to dip into that contingency, which would have to be approved by both the UC and Student Council, that that would help towards any of those emergencies or where required. But I would like to pass that on, back to Director of Finance in case I am missing anything with that. Thank you,

Chair.

CH Director of Finance?

DF No, that's completely correct. If there was a need and there wasn't sufficient funds in the operating funding, then it would go to whether or not that was needed, and if it

was needed for that particular program or service, that it would be proposed to dip

into the contingency fund.

CDR I was just wondering if that was to be the case, do we know which part of the budget

allocation that we would be dipping into or would it be [unclear] to create smaller area for just emergency funds rather than trying to figure that out on the spot if it

does happen? Thank you, Chair.

surplus, any surplus went towards the building. Am I correct?

DF Yes, as long as, for example, again that big contingency fund is fully funded. So when

there's increases in the budget, the following year after that, the contingency fund has to be built up slightly more, so then that's where the funding would happen within there to get that there. Other than that, yes, it was that 100% of that would go

to the building fund.

CH Thank you, Director. Councillor Strayer, anything further?

CST So for the sake of clarity, I'm sorry if I'm beating a dead horse, 80% of surplus went

into the building, and then there was 20% that went to what have you, so far as the

contingency fund was full. I'm correct?

CH Thank you, Councillor Strayer. I guess we're directing that to the director?

VPO Thank you Chair. Yes.

Yes, so it would go to the contingency, and then how it was worded previously is that any excess that was not needed to refill or fill up the contingency fund would then go back into the building fund again. So anything of excess at all, once all these funds are filled, would go back into the building fund.
