CH It's six o'clock, so we'll call this meeting to order. Item 1, Treaty 6, Land Recognition. We would like to acknowledge that this meeting of the Students' Association at MacEwan University is taking place on the traditional territories of the people of the Treaty 6 region in Central Alberta.

The Students' Association of MacEwan University is situated in the centre of what we call the city of Edmonton, which is called Amiskwaciy Waskahikan or Beaver Hill House in Nehiyawewin (Cree). This is the traditional home of the Nehiyaw and Michif, and meeting place for many Indigenous peoples including the Nakawe, Siksika, Nakota Sioux and other nations.

Item 2, Approvals. 2.1, we have a motion. Can I have someone introduce that motion, please? Vice President Operations and Finance?

VPOF Thank you, Chair. I move to approve the agenda for November 18 2020.

Item 2.2. We have a motion. Can I have someone introduce that motion, please? Councillor Dykes?

- CD I move to approve the minutes of October 21 2020.
- CH Thank you, Councillor. And a second, please? Vice President External. It is moved and seconded to approve the minutes of October 21 2020. Is there any debate? Questions on the adoption of the motion to approve the minutes of October 21 2020? Is there anyone opposed? Please speak now. Motion carries.

Item 4, For Your Information. 4.1, Reports. 4.1.1. President, any oral supplements?

PR Yes, thank you, Chair. The one thing I should add is that yesterday, as part of the CAUS Counterparts and Advocacy Week, I was able to meet with several MLAs, most of which were ministers in the government, to discuss the Council of Alberta University Student's priorities.

- CH Thank you, President. 4.1.2. Vice President Academic, any oral supplements?
- VPA Hi. Yes. Thank you, Chair. I was able to also attend many CAUS Counterparts, the Council of Alberta University Students, meetings, which was very nice to collaborate and get to have some updates from my fellow VPAs. And then I also attended a ITM Community Link at the Faculty of Arts and Science, but I will leave those updates for next report. Thank you.
- CH Thank you, Vice President. 4.1.3. Vice President External, any oral supplements?
- VPE Yes. Thank you, Chair. In a similar vein to, actually, both the President and the VPA, I got to have a few advocacy meetings at the provincial level and an advocacy meeting at the federal level. I'll be putting more detail into those in my next report, but just I'll say that it went really well. I had the luck of the draw on the provincial front because we met with MLAs who were very friendly to our asks, and actually, the federal MP was very friendly to our asks, so it was a nice boxing with kid gloves on. Thank you, Chair.
- CH Thank you, Vice President. 4.1.4. Vice President Operations and Finance, any oral supplements?
- VPOF Yes. Thank you, Chair. I have a couple. So the first one was CAUS Counterparts. I did attend two of the meetings, but unfortunately, because I became ill again, I had to miss the rest of the Counterparts and the PAG meeting, so I'm just being accountable



to my actions there.

As well as I am pleased to announce, if you haven't seen it already, MacEwan's new Finance and Administration CFO, Sharilee Fossum. I was on the hiring committee for this and I am very confident in her ability to represent the students as well as be very knowledgeable in her area, so I'm very excited to welcome her.

As well as I forget to mention that I attended the Virtual Students' Council training. I figured it was basically sharing forward, so I didn't include it in there, and that's everything for me. Thank you, Chair.

- CH Thank you, Vice President. 4.1.5. Vice President Student Life, any oral supplements?
- VPSL As presented. Thank you, Chair.
- CH Thank you. 4.1.6. The Board of Governors' Student Representative, Councillor Dykes, any oral supplements?
- CD As presented. Thank you, Chair.
- CH Thank you. And 4.1.7, The Chief Returning Officer. I'm going to assume the Chief Returning Officer included everything in their report. Any oral supplements?

- CRO Actually, Chair, there was just a mistake that I'd like to correct, if that's okay?
- CH Go right ahead.
- CRO Just for Students' Council, if you refer to the last two pages of my report, under Confirmation of Candidates, regarding two potential candidates who weren't eligible to stand for the 2020 Students' Council Election, it says that they were not eligible due to failing to meet the criteria set in the standing bylaws.

While that is true for one of the candidates, the other one wasn't approved due to missing a deadline. Actually, submission of their nomination form was submitted a couple of minutes late, and we strictly enforce our deadlines with our elections, and so that candidate was not approved. There were other issues with that submission as well, but I just want to make that clear that it wasn't just due to a violation of the bylaws.

And the second issue with the report, Mr Chair, is just that, in my sign-off of my title, it says, Chief Returning Officer 2010 to 2021, so I'm sure Council is aware that I have not been serving for over 11 years, so that's just a mistake to correct. Thank you.

CH Thank you, Jed. 4.2, Executive Committee Minutes of October 7th, 14th, 21st, 28th of 2020 are provided in your package for your information.

Move on to Item 5, Question Period. 5.1, Written Questions, in your package. 5.2, Oral Questions. So we'll take oral questions now. If you have a question, please type in Question in the chat and I will recognise you in the order in which you appear in the chat. So give you some time to type that out. Councillor Dykes?

- CD Yes. Thank you, Chair. I have a few questions directed to the President. So the first one is on the standing COVID bursary. I was wondering if there was anything further on this?
- CH Thank you, Councillor. President?
- PR Thank you so much. I believe there is. So one of the ideas that was thrown around to create a SAMU COVID bursary was basically repurposing or almost rebranding SAMU Cares in part to address that, so I think if there's any logistical pathway for a COVID-related bursary, it would probably be through SAMU Cares.

But as far as the details, I don't know exactly where it ended up. I know it's in progress. I know someone's looking into it, and I believe it would be the VP Academic who would have those further details. I'm not entirely sure, but that seems likely, so for any follow-ups, I think VP Academic should know, but I believe we are looking at using SAMU Cares for that.

CH Thank you. Councillor Dykes, next question?

- CD So my next one, also for the President, is regarding long-term revenue generation. I was just curious if there was anything further on this. I think it's a really exciting opportunity we have as the Students' Association. Thank you, Chair.
- CH Thank you, Councillor. President?
- PR I'm so happy you asked. Thank you, Chair. I'm happy you asked because I didn't get a chance to elaborate much on this in my report. It was a shorter part of the report, so if I can speak to it a bit, I think it's in the germination stage, so this is an idea that's very early on. We don't really have anything concrete.

But the general vision or direction of this initiative is I think we need to, as much as possible, rely on things other than student fees. And there are a couple other Students' Associations who are in the same boat as us, where it's vast majority reliant on student fees. I think, for us, it's probably above 90%, so it's a project that's going to be years in the making.

We're starting with this current executive team. I think our general manager is going to be a good asset in getting it started and continuing on to the next executive team, who can carry it further, but it's an exciting opportunity. And if I could give the gist of what we're thinking, it would be mostly using things like that building, like event space, things that are more possible in future years when COVID is more manageable to generate revenue for events and that kind of thing, among other ideas. So thank you.

- CH Thank you, President. Councillor Dykes, next question?
- CD That's all. Thank you, Chair.

- CH They set the bar now. Councillor Tesfay?



- CTE Thank you, Chair. I had a question for the Vice President External. I saw on the report that the U-Pass negotiation went well, which is good news. However, I had a question regarding the Ride Access Programme. So my question is, do students from other municipalities have access to the Ride Access Programme like we have here in Edmonton? For example, students from St Albert or Sherwood Park, are they able to apply for the low-income bus passes like we do here? Thank you, Chair.
- CH Thank you, Councillor. Vice President?
- VPE Unfortunately, the Ride Transit Programme is exclusively offered by ETS. This is actually one of the huge advantages of the U-Pass versus a lot of the other transit and fare products, is that the U-Pass is a collective agreement between all of the municipalities and everything. The Ride Transit Programme and the low-income passes and the two tiers and everything are offered exclusively through ETS.

We've really been pushing behind the scenes to get them to try and negotiate some kind of temporary pan-municipal pass, but it doesn't sound like that is moving forward. I can't remember which municipality it was, but one of the municipalities did actually offer free transit for a given amount of time.

And one thing I will say is that if you refer to our U-Pass page on the SAMU website, we are keeping it up to date with all of the options that we become aware of from the other municipalities. So as soon as those things pop up, they will be on that page. And I was just reminded that it was Leduc was the municipality that offered free transit, and I do sympathise. It's quite a tricky issue, but hopefully that answers the question. Thank you, Chair.

- CH Thank you, Vice President. The Vice President Operations and Finance, I think you had something to add to that?
- VPOF Yes. Vice President External covered it mostly really well. I just wanted to add, so if you do live in St Albert or anything like that, you can still apply for the ride transit pass, but it is only effective in Edmonton for ETS services, so that does not include transfer to StAts or any other services, so just to clarify that. Thank you.
- CH Thank you, Vice President. Councillor Tesfay, any other questions?
- CTE No, thank you.
- CH Thank you. Councillor Tran?
- CTR My question's also for the VP External just in regards to the U-Pass negotiation as well. Do you know when students will be notified if there will be or will not be a U-Pass for next semester? I'm just curious myself as a student, but I'm sure other students are curious too.

- CH Thank you, Councillor. Vice President?
- VPE Thank you, Chair. Actually, in my report, I've been mentioning that in the Winter Semester, we will maintain the force majeure, so the U-Pass will not be offered in the Winter Semester, just given that we're still operating at the same reduced capacity. All



of the same reasoning that it was in place before is still in effect.

We are currently updating our statement on the U-Pass, so that'll be circulated very, very soon, and hopefully, that's covers it, but if there's any additional clarification I can offer, I'll definitely do so. Thank you, Chair.

- CH Thank you, Vice President. Councillor Tran, anything further? No? Councillor Williams?
- CW My question is for the Vice President Academic. In your report, you talked about the Proctorio demonstration that you got to witness. You said that it could be further explored or tested. Do you know if that is an option that MacEwan is looking to explore further?
- CH Thank you, Councillor Williams. Vice President?

- VPA Thank you, Chair. Thank you for the question as well, Councillor Williams. This has been a hot topic this last while amongst many universities and SAs and SUs. So currently, from what I gather out of MacEwan, it is being explored a bit more because it does have a wide range of usages and features that could be helpful, but there is still questions at the university whether it will actually ever be enforced or allowed to be in use, so that is still up in the air.

I don't believe anyone at MacEwan has used eProctoring, which is good news. Some institutions went full force into using eProctoring without, you could say, proper consultation around the issue.

So currently, it is still being explored because academic integrity cases have increased or academic misconduct is still a very serious matter at MacEwan, and it can be a preventative measure, but if it's the best one is still to be determined. And there could be uses for and against it, but overall, we are being very careful in how we address such a topic as eProctoring. So hopefully, that answers your question.

- CH Thank you, Vice President. Councillor Williams, anything further?
- CW No further questions. Thank you, Chair.
- CH Thank you. Other questions? Last call for questions.

We'll move on to the next item in the agenda, 6, in camera period. Nothing there.

Item 7, Motions in Business Orders of the Day. So for this section, we have a number of committee appointments, and so I'll just spend a little bit of time to let you know what the process is. Sorry, and I'm reading the chat at the same time. Nothing that I need to be aware of there.

So the process for committee appointments. So you'll see in your package that we have a number of individuals who have declared their nomination for a particular committee, so for instance, if you look at Item 7.1, we have two nominations already, so that would be Councillor Williams and Councillor Tran. For those where we do not have any nominations, don't despair because we have a process for nominations from the floor.



And so the way that this will work is I will ask if there are any nominations from the floor for each motion, so each committee, as we proceed down the list. And I will just have you type in Nomination in the chat, and I will recognise you in the order in which you appear in the chat, and then you can either nominate yourself or nominate one of your colleagues.

If you nominate yourself, I'm assuming that you'll accept the nomination, so we'll add you to the list. If you nominate one of your colleagues, I will ask your colleague whether or not they accept the nomination and, of course, they have the option to accept or not. So then we will have a list of nominees, and I will recognise individuals in the order in which they were nominated.

And each individual that is nominated will receive 30 seconds in order to deliver a short speech on why they are worthy of sitting on that committee or why they're more worthy than others of sitting on that committee. And then once we've proceeded through the list of speeches of all the nominees, Alan will populate an online ballot and you will mark your selections in the ballot.

Some committees have one individual, some committees have two, and some have three. For example, in 7.1, we have two spots on that committee that are open. If we have two individuals who are have been nominated, the ballot will be a yes or no vote, and so you will mark in the ballot either yes or no beside each candidate as to whether or not you think they should be on the committee. Yes being yes, they should be on the committee. No being no, they should not be on the committee.

If we have more individuals nominated than we have positions, then you will mark an X beside. I don't know how the ballot actually works. You'll figure it out, but you'll select the same number of individuals as we have positions or fewer. So for example, in 7.1, if we have three individuals who have been nominated, you will select two of them or one, but I would recommend two because, frankly, we should fill both spots, and the individuals with the greatest number of votes will be successful in filling those committee spots.

That was a lot, but I'm going to pause here, and if you have any questions, I don't think you need to type in Question in the chat, but feel free to just ask any questions and let's clarify this before we get started here with a number of... Vice President Academic?

VPA Thank you, Chair. I'm just curious, if there is no one up for a particular committee because there are only, I believe, eight Councillors, and we would like to keep some empty in case, as we appoint, hopefully, more individuals to Council to have the opportunity to sit on committees, what would the process look like then? Could we postpone indefinitely to next meeting for those appointments or how would you recommend us to go forward with that?
