### Students' Council Report

# President December 16, 2020

Greetings councilors,

Below is my report on my work as President between November 18th and December 10th, 2020.

#### **Dedicated Advocacy**

Canadian Alliance of Student Associations (CASA) Advocacy Meetings with Members of Parliament (MPs)

During CASA's advocacy month, I got to meet with several MPs and one senator. I had advocacy meetings with Liberal MP Iqra Khalid, NDP MP Heather McPherson, CPC MP Rachael Harder, and Independent (formerly Conservative) Senator Doug Black. All except Iqra Khalid are representatives for Alberta ridings. If you'd like to see CASA's advocacy document to read about what we discussed with these folks, feel free to ask me and I would be happy to provide it!

#### Council of Alberta University Students (CAUS) Advocacy week

I met with four members of the legislative assembly (MLAs), three of which were ministers, during CAUS advocacy week. One of the MLAs was from the NDP, Christina Gray, while the three ministers were, of course, from the governing UCP party; these were the Associate Minister of Red Tape Reduction, Grant Hunter, the Associate Minister of Natural Gas, Dale Nally, and the Minister of Infrastructure, Prasad Panda. If you'd like to see CAUS' advocacy document to read about what we discussed with these folks, feel free to ask me and I would be happy to provide it!

#### Minister of Advanced Education CAUS Roundtable

Our CAUS board was joined by Minister Nicolaides so that we could ask questions about the upcoming Alberta 2030 Post-Secondary Review. Questions focused on the sector-level boards idea and potential tuition deregulation, among other items. If you're interested in learning more about this, SAMU VP External (Ruan) and I are happy to explain more, but another great place to look is Alex Usher's blog, which has discussed sector-level boards and tuition deregulation.

#### Advocacy Meeting with AE Minister Demetrios Nicolaides

SAMU VP External Ruan Bouwer and I met with Minister Nicolaides in order to follow up on some of the items from our CAUS roundtable and to discuss other student priorities. Other than the parts directly associated with the Alberta 2030 review, which are mentioned in the previous section of my report, we also discussed work integrated learning (WIL) and performance-based funding (PBF), and the related investment management agreements (IMAs).

#### Advocacy Meeting with MLA David Eggen

SAMU VP External Ruan Bouwer and I met with the NDP's Advanced Education Critic, David Eggen. We discussed many of the prevailing issues-of-the-day including Alberta 2030, performance-based funding, cuts to post-secondary education, messaging/campaign ideas, etc.



#### Edmonton Student Alliance (ESA) Meeting

ESA met on November 30<sup>th</sup> and discussed the prospect of helping facilitate a student housing survey. In addition, we planned our input into the Edmonton City Council budget deliberations for the Council's public hearing, I gave an update on the strategic planning process, and I also gave an update on the 2021 municipal election advocacy plan.

#### Edmonton City Council Public Hearing Comments

I participated in City Council's public hearing on the municipal budget, to give a student & youth perspective on proposed budget cuts. It was a great opportunity to give students in Edmonton a voice, as Chair of ESA, and introduce some novel topics into the discussion, such as the potential difficulty of retaining youth in Edmonton (and Alberta, really) in the coming years.

#### MacEwan Executive Council Quarterly Meeting

Our executive team met with MacEwan's executive council in order to discuss the most pressing issues currently facing MacEwan and its students. Our discussion covered ongoing COVID impacts, the idea for a late start in winter term, MacEwan's upcoming strategic planning process, and Alberta 2030.

#### **Commitment to Sustainability**

#### Internal COVID-19 Meetings

Our senior leadership and executive teams at SAMU met a couple of times to respond to the fast-changing and ever-growing COVID crisis in the province. We took steps to comply with each new level of restrictions that were introduced over the last 30 days, in order to minimize risk of transmission at our workplace. At this stage, I am now working from home nearly every day.

#### SAMU Student Support Service Manual and Info Sheet Development

SAMU VP Academic Alycia Stewart and I have been working on documenting all of our knowledge and practices regarding supporting students with grievances and appeals. In order for staff and future VP Academics to have clear guidelines on how to deal with appeals, documenting this information is critical. It is especially important at this time, as SAMU is still the only place on campus that provides this service (since MacEwan laid off the ombudsperson in the spring), so we need to be offering student support in a sustainable and robust manner.

#### **Relations with our Community**

#### MacEwan Faculty Association (MFA) and SAMU Meeting

SAMU VP External Ruan Bouwer and I met with the president of the MFA, and were pleased to find many areas of alignment. I am very happy and proud to say that, though SAMU has never had close ties to MFA, we are now planning to have regular meetings with them. Considering how similar many of our advocacy goals are, this is a promising arrangement, in my view.

Meeting with SAMU VP External and U of A Graduate Students' Association (GSA) President The U of A GSA President, the SAMU VP External, and I met to discuss aspects of Alberta 2030 and other points of interest in post-secondary education advocacy.



Board of Governors (BoG) Strategy and Stakeholder Relations (SSR) Committee
I attended the BoG SSR committee, in which we approved MacEwan's 2019/20 Annual Report in the open session, and discussed many other items in the closed session.

#### "Next Step" Event with United Way

I had the pleasure of participating in a virtual event put on by United Way for students at the Next Step High School in Sherwood Park. Part of the session was "life after high-school" so I got to discuss my journey from high school to university, for the benefit of the students in attendance. My message was a hopeful one, and mainly focused on the following: post-secondary education isn't something to be frightened of, since in my experience, I actually performed better in university than I ever did in high school! With COVID impacting us, especially for young people, many aspects of the future are uncertain and scary, but post-secondary education doesn't have to be seen as a worrisome prospect.

#### Edmonton Chamber of Commerce - Premier Jason Kenney Event

SAMU VP External and I attended the Edmonton Chamber of Commerce event at which the Premier gave a live speech. Topics covered included the economy in general, diversification, COVID-19, and a question during the Q&A from our MacEwan President Dr. Annette Trimbee about the Alberta 2030 review.

#### Stewardship of Resources

#### Governance Remuneration Advisory Committee (GRAC)

I chaired the first GRAC meeting which went pretty well! We outlined and approved our workplan for the rest of the year, and discussed some preliminary considerations that will factor into our decisions on remuneration of elected officials.

#### Budget and Finance Committee (BFC)

I joined the first BFC meeting as a member and discussed the material with the committee. I am looking forward to future BFC meetings as the budget is obviously a central part of what we do at SAMU!

#### Connect to Students

#### Town Hall Event Planning

I met with members of EC and our general manager to plan some details of the upcoming SAMU Town Hall in the winter semester. The town hall will be virtual, since we have to hold it online. We have now basically established which "tables" (or categories) will be at the town hall, and which executive will be present at which "table."

#### Restorative Resolution

I continue to participate in restorative resolutions with MacEwan's Academic Integrity Office, which are always worthwhile.



#### **Enhance Student Experience**

Meeting with Sean Gallivan

I had a zoom call with Sean Gallivan from Gallivan, our insurance broker for SAMU's Health and Dental service, to get caught up on each other's work recently. A main highlight is that we discussed the upcoming referendums which will be introduced to council in January.

Student Refugee Program (SRP) Academic Enrollment

Along with our Community Assistant, I was able to help with enrolling our SRP Student in classes so that she can start school in the winter term, soon after she arrives in Canada!

#### **Closing Remarks**

Wow. It's December. Does it feel unreal to anyone else that 2020 is almost over? It surely does to me. I'm probably speaking for everyone when I say this, but 2020 has probably been the most difficult and unusual year of my life and I'm hoping for greener pastures in the new year. Though I am really proud of the work that I and our executive team has done this year, I can't imagine how much further we would be if not hamstrung by COVID and working remotely, so I hope next year is different.

Altogether, though, I think we made the most of it, and there are certainly lessons learned from this weird and strenuous year (at individual, organizational, and governmental levels) which we will carry forward into the future. Further, I am proud of the ways in which SAMU came through for students who needed it, ranging from supporting students with academic grievances, to advocating for an interim U-Pass alternative, to helping students with food support. The difficulties faced by students this year in some ways established SAMU's importance even more meaningfully than before, and I am grateful to be part of an organization that is doing its best to be of service.

I am eagerly looking forward to the holiday break, and so I won't be available for a couple weeks after the 18<sup>th</sup>, but please do feel free to reach out with questions or comments either before then or after we return for winter semester. ### Students' Council Report

# Vice President Academic December 16th, 2020

Hi everyone,

Please find my report below detailing events that occurred between November 16<sup>th</sup> and December 14th.

#### **Dedicated Advocacy**

#### **GFC Standing Committee Meetings**

The Academic planning and quality assurance committee discussed the work plan specifics and what would fall under the purview of this committee and what our priorities would be.

#### MacEwan Academic Advising Steering Committee(MAASC) Meeting

I attended a MAASC meeting where we discuss the critical paths for supporting students and the points which they require more assistance. We heard about some of the issues or experiences happening in the center along with the programs, how they are adapting to working from home again and influx of work after the open house and due to covid.

#### General Faculties Council Meeting (GFC)

GFC discussed the honorary doctorates policy, the annual report info and Alberta 2030 review updates. The winter break was brought up by some faculty to see if there were any plans to adjust it as other schools had but more discussion was still needed and more complications were brought up than benefits it seemed.

#### Faculty of Arts and Science (FAS) Council

At the council meeting the dean made it clear that instructors should be looking to accommodate students where possible, winter enrolment numbers so far and we talked about the upcoming self-study for the bachelor of science.

#### Student Systems Joint Operations Committee

This meeting had many updates from the registrar where we approved the enrollment dates/times and I encouraged the idea of earlier start times, depending on how a trial with nursing will work this year, so that enrollment times don't conflict with students who are in class in the future. They showcased an update they are planning for mystudentsystem as they wish to remove the shopping cart feature to reduce clicks/confusion however I cautioned this approach and encouraged better communication with students if they do make changes and to consider potential consequences.

#### **Provost Monthly Meeting**

In my meeting with Dr. Craig Monk I talked about some of the concerns Ponoka students have been facing and heard about a regular quality review they are going through which will hopefully address their concerns. We discussed the winter term plans and I mentioned the long-term planning/strategic advocacy approach SAMU is starting to look more towards.

#### Quarterly MacEwan EC Meeting

At this meeting with our MacEwan counterparts we talked about the potential of extending the winter term start date and received other updates. We advocated for the first week to be asynchronous which would effectively give students an extended break without changing our academic calendar and so I followed up with the Provost with a letter explaining our position and why so that it could be brought up with Deans council. We have since been told that although the

university is not going with our proposal they are looking to encourage instructors to get course outlines to students sooner than later, a reduced course load where possible for students, encouraging there to be no deadlines during the reading break and to accommodate students around the add/drop date.

#### **AVP Students Meeting**

We had our monthly meeting with the interim AVP Students to discuss updates with Student affairs and potential collaborative areas as well as how things are going with SAMU.

#### Relations with our Community

#### Council of Alberta University Students (CAUS) Counterparts

Counterparts had many session for all porfolios this time and was a much better experience. Besides getting us the info a bit late to plan around, there were many sessions for individual portfolios to meet and discuss related topics and informational sessions. We talked about OER's, eproctoring and the online learning experience among other things and put it into context of what CAUS could potentially do to support us which was encouraging. I am always so excited to talk with my counterparts and learn more about how their roles work and to learn from other institutions so I really appreciated the time I got to spend with my group.

#### eProctoring Panels

Dr. Paul Sopcak from our Academic Integrity office invited me to be one of the panelists for a talk by the International Center of Academic Integrity to give a student perspective on online proctoring software. I also participated in a follow up session where we had more time allocated for questions.

#### Revitalizing SAMU Research Event

I got to have a lovely meeting with Dr. Craig Kuziemsky AVP Research and Scholarly Activity to get some updates on Student Research Day plans, which has turned into April being a month celebrating scholarly activity. We also discussed the potential of the past project "Demystifying student Research initiative" that was organized last year that unfortunately had to be cancelled due to covid and how we could bring that back.

#### Stewardship of Resources

#### Information Technology Management Committee (ITMC) Meetings

At the last two ITMC meetings we discussed the cloud functionality and security precautions and the LMS process which is set to have Moodle in place for 2022. We also discussed the online classroom environment and the student's perspective on different meeting platforms and the work they are doing to try to improve the virtual or hybrid classroom experience.

#### Distinguished Teaching Award Committee Meeting

We met to discuss our timeline and set meeting schedule for this committee and discussed how the process will work this year.

#### Research Dissemination review

I had a short meeting going over a research dissemination grant application for an interesting music project proposal.

#### Commitment to sustainability

#### DiSC Assessment/Team Building

We got to have an informative session on our workplace personalities to have some team building and get to know how we can work together better and create an even stronger team.

# Vice President External December 16, 2020

Hello Councillors,

In this report I will detail my activities between November 14th and December 15th.

For those who are not familiar with some of the advocacy-related acronyms:

- CASA is the Canadian Alliance of Student Associations, our federal advocacy umbrella organization with 23 total members.
- CAUS is the Council of Alberta University Students, our provincial advocacy umbrella organization with 6 total members.
- ESA is the Edmonton Student Alliance, our municipal advocacy umbrella organization with 8 total members.

#### Federal Advocacy

CASA Advocacy Meeting with Darrell Samson

I had the opportunity to meet with MP Darrell Samson, a Liberal from the riding of Sackville—Preston—Chezzetcook, to speak with him about CASA's advocacy priorities. We had a very promising discussion on the topic of community mental health funding for Indigenous communities, and its direct connection to post-secondary participation among Indigenous youth.

CASA Plenary (Nov. 25)

Sean and I attended CASA's digital plenary, which largely consisted of reviewing and voting on the various policies put forward by CASA committees, such as the Federal Policy Committee of which I am vice-chair.

#### **Provincial Advocacy**

CAUS Counterparts (Nov. 16-18)

Our EC team attended CAUS's digital Counterparts conference, which contained sessions dedicated to everything from crisis communication to brainstorming new policy papers and fundraising ideas. I was lucky enough to lead the Life After Being an Executive Q&A panel, which featured some prominent former executives from CAUS (including our very own Cole Baker!). All in all, a very successful conference.



CAUS Advocacy Meeting with Rakhi Pancholi (Nov. 16)

As part of CAUS advocacy week, I got the chance to meet with MLA Rakhi Pancholi, an NDP politician representing Edmonton-Whitemud, to speak with her about a number of CAUS's priorities. She seemed very receptive to our advocacy on making Edmonton a more desirable place for students to stay after their education.

CAUS Advocacy Meeting with David Shepherd (Nov. 18)

I also met with MLA David Shepherd, an NDP politician representing Edmonton-City Centre, to discuss many of the same priorities that came up in the previously mentioned advocacy meeting with Rakhi Panchioli. MLA Shepherd reiterated his support for a strong post-secondary education system and his

CAUS Fundraising Working Group Meeting (Nov. 30)

I met with a few CAUS delegates regarding our upcoming public interest campaign, to discuss fundraising and timelines.

Roundtable Meeting Between CAUS and Minister Nicolaides (Dec. 3)

Sean and I attended a roundtable discussion between CAUS and the Minister of Advanced Education, regarding the Alberta 2030 review. I am happy to recount the details of that meeting to anybody who is interested!

SAMU Advocacy Meeting with David Eggen (Dec. 4)

Sean and I met with MLA David Eggen, who is currently the NDP critic for advanced education, and had a very robust conversation about Alberta 2030 and the priorities of students in this process.

Jason Kenney's Address to the Edmonton Chamber of Commerce (Dec. 7)

I attended Premier Jason Kenney's address to the Edmonton Chamber of Commerce, which contained only a few references to post-secondary, but was an illuminating experience nonetheless.

SAMU Advocacy Meeting with Minister Nicolaides (Dec. 7)

Sean and I met with Minister Nicolaides to discuss some follow-up questions to the CAUS roundtable, and to gain additional information regarding Alberta 2030 (sick of reading about it in my reports yet?). The meeting was very successful for gathering information, and I'm happy to discuss it with anyone interested.

#### **Municipal Advocacy**

UPass Committee Meeting (Nov. 19)

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This meeting was primarily to discuss alternative solutions for the absence of a Winter term UPass, and ultimately resulted in all parties taking the same approach (Youth fare and Ride Transit) as we did in the Fall semester.

City of Edmonton Transit Discussion (Nov. 23)

This meeting was meant for the discussion of the Winter UPass alternative in surrounding municipalities, and the information from it has been posted in this addition to the SAMU statement on UPass: Surrounding Municipalities Transit Options.

ESA Meeting (Nov. 30)

The Edmonton Student Alliance held another successful meeting, where we discussed participation in a student housing survey, our municipal advocacy in local elections, and the continuing development of our strategic plan. Shout out to our SAMU President Sean Waddingham for his phenomenal work as ESA chair!

#### **University Relations**

Meetings with Director of Government Relations Theresa Vladicka (Nov. 17, 24, + Dec. 8)

I met three times with Theresa Vladicka to discuss Alberta 2030, and the ever-changing information that comes out of the process. The two-way information sharing between MacEwan and SAMU on Alberta 2030 continues to be a tremendous asset to student advocacy, so I fully plan on continuing this approach.

Monthly Meeting with Vice President University Relations Myrna Khan (Nov. 23)

I met with Myrna Khan to discuss Alberta 2030, the tuition consultation process with SAMU, and a number of other developments related to a SAMU-MacEwan consultation framework.

MacEwan-SAMU Presidents and Vice Presidents Meeting (Dec. 3)

SAMU's EC met with MacEwan's executives to discuss a number of issues that pertain to student interests, including the potential extension of winter break, Alberta 2030, and COVID-19.

#### Other

GMUFA-SAMU Meeting (Nov. 20)

After reaching out to Dr. Rafat Alam, president of the Grant MacEwan Faculty Association, I was able to schedule a meeting between him, myself, Sean, and our GM Collin Steffes. The meeting was very productive and opened up many frontiers of potential cooperation and information sharing between GMUFA and SAMU. I look forward to more in the future!

Leadership and Review Committee Meetings (Dec. 1 + 8)
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The new lineup for Leadership and Review Committee is up and running! I could not be more excited to work with Councillor Williams and Councillor Tran, as well as our students-at-large, Mohammad and Tirth. All of them have shown an early eagerness to make Students' Council more engaging and effective body, and no work plan could possibly capture all the ideas that we threw back and forth (although that will be submitted alongside this report anyway, lol).

#### **Closing Remarks**

WOW, what a month it has been. I hope you are all surviving this darkest of winters and thriving in spite of exam season!

My report originally contained many more items than it currently does, but given how long it has taken me to complete, I decided to cut out some of the less relevant ones. # Vice President Operations & Finance December 16, 2020

Hello council, I apologize for the delay in my report and for the reduced effort. With exam and flu season, and Covid taking a toll on my lungs I have not been doing very well, but I am getting my work done and done well. I have just had precedent matters to attend to over writing my report and I apologize for that. This report will be a little different then usual.

#### **Projects & Initiatives**

#### Building

Unfortunately, there has been some theft again and we are working on minimizing the risk of theft for the future. Locking the doors on the weekends has helped reduce the theft. Our director of building operations is also discussing with MacEwan security the options available and if increased services is an option.

Galivan's monitor got stolen, there was a hole in the wall and a door hadle got broken. There was also an incident of a homeless individual almost getting stuck under the stairwell as they were trying to hide from security, but also stay warm. We have temporarily blocked off that area. This is unfortunately normal during the winter months in Edmonton. All we can do is implement measures to help mitigate the vandalism and thefts.

I have a building operations meeting coming up, so I will have more to update after that.

#### **MacEwan Facilities**

MacEwan has 2 International Organization for stantdardization (ISO) certificates: ISO 50001 - only post-secondary in Canada what has this. This is a certificate for energy management.

ISO 9001 - quality management systems. Organizations use the standard to demonstrate the ability to consistently provide products and services that meet customer and regulatory requirements.

Installing Merv-14 air filters - same as used in hospitals, top of the game. Will be put in s+w when filters need replacement. S+W pushing to get done sooner. Merv-14 are filters that can help with the filtration of the Corona virus.

Grounds-Planted the big black pots and replacing some equipment. They are looking for suggestions on how to make the grounds a secure and good place for students to hang out.

FIMS (funding information management system) - always looking for feedback

We used to only get one payment per term and we had a 15% holdback of fees that MacEwan kept just in case. With this new agreement, we will be receiving multiple payments and no hold backs.

#### Update from our GM to SC on high level operations:

#### Strategic Planning

- SAMU strategic plan update will begin January 2021 completion May 2021
- SAMU evaluating current strategic framework as part of project and will be evaluating the integration of strategic planning into:
  - o long term corporate planning (may result in multi-year corporate plan),
  - o operation budgeting (more linkage between budget and strategic goals ),
  - capital planning & budgeting (establishing a multi-year capital plan with budget that will address both asset management & life cycle costs and longer term plans for building enhancements), and
  - advocacy planning (establishing an annual plan that identifies advocacy priorities tied to strategic objectives)

#### Revenue Diversification

 Workshop discussions have begun considering opportunities to leverage new SAMU building to enhance and diversify revenue opportunities that provide direct benefit in service to students



- Comparative analysis of University of Calgary MacEwan Hall looking at the success U
  of C SA has had at generating diversified income, while providing enhanced and
  consolidated services to students at Mac Hall.
- Initial look at SAMU base building cost per sqft, and identified large volume of 'unprofitable' space. Looking at balance between student prioritization, while finding new avenues to generate revenue within building to help subsidize student services and keep student fees affordable in the future.
- Findings will inform longer term opportunities to be identified in future corporate and capital plans (eg. possible building improvements to add tenancy).

#### Covid Response

- SAMU COVID manual has been amended as needed to keep up to date with AHS guidelines and policies
- Building operations has obtained more plexiglass barriers to allowed for continued joint table seating
- 1st floor study space and student groups meeting rooms have been closed to prevent close proximity meetings between students
- SAMU office has been closed to walk in traffic, and signage erected to advise students where they can access any SAMU services during the current round of covid restrictions
- SLT has directed all non-essential staff to work from home in alignment with the provincial direction provided Dec 8.
- Essential services such a Pantry continue to provide in person pick up of food hampers
- Administration has initiated positive recognition program where small tokens are given to students who are practicing safe Covid protocols (safe distancing and wearing masks) to reinforce safe behavior. There are still some students that resist having to wear masks or maintain proper distance, requiring monitoring and feedback from administration. Security was called in to deal with one student who became more difficult in refusing to where a mask.
- MacEwan security remains a last resort to reinforce Covid safety protocols.

#### **SAMU Building**

- Graham construction has completed all base building work, and has only one seal test (verification of building seal on 109st pedway) to complete to be considered fully completed.
- Some necessary additional work that was not completed as part the original base building construction is being undertaken:
  - Additional heating in loading dock and stairwell areas to prevent water lines freezing,
  - Completion of Council Chambers desk with 4 corner pieces,
  - Ordering remaining chairs for full occupancy opportunities in Event Space,
  - o Complete installation of remaining white boards in various meeting rooms, and
  - Window privacy frosting to be installed on various sensitive meeting spaces and offices (finance), where additional privacy is required.
- Event Center is now lockable to prevent unauthorized use.
- Building will remain open for common area usage in alignment with MacEwan University.
- First floor west exterior doors are now locked on weekends to prevent non-student traffic from entering the building in areas that are poorly monitored over the weekend.

#### **Student Communications**

- SAMU continues to advocate to MacEwan to gain access to student email to enhance communication and engagement regarding student services
- Negotiations are still underway and progressing positively, but too early to presume access will be granted



 Continue to see challenges connecting with students regarding key initiatives or communications (SAMU 12 days of giving, Covid adjustments, etc.)

#### Staffing Changes

- Have seen a number of key staffing changes:
  - Programs Director will be resigning in 2021, as she has returned home to Ontario. GM has offered a part time contract to maintain her services until Jan 31, 2021 to allow for evaluation of Director of Programs and Services scope, and to maintain supervisory role for current Programs and Services Managers
  - Student Programs Manager resigned November, and interviews taking place this week to fill the role
  - New Events assistant has been hired -> Andrea Shipka
  - New Community Assistant has been hired -> Karman Ngan
  - New ACC Office Assistant has been hired -> Ipsha Sarker
  - Advocacy Coordinator -> employment change
    - Position focus is being divided into Student Grievances Coordinator (support for Ombudsperson role that was terminated by MacEwan University) & External Student Advocacy -> both positions will be posed shortly to be filled early in January 2021
  - GM/SLT is using staff vacancies as opportunity to partially review org structure to ensure it is still best suited to the association's needs in providing services to students

#### Finance

- 2021 budget preparation process has started, with Managers and Directors beginning to look at anticipated adjustments for draft 2021 budget.
- 2021 budget will proceed on basis of current strategic plan and corporate planning framework.
- All work to update strategic plan and corporate planning framework, happening in parallel, will result in changes to 2022 budget priorities and processes.
- Fees:
  - Finance is looking at possibility of graduated fees to be assessed at different rates to students in different circumstances:
    - Full time vs part time
    - City Center vs Ponoka
    - School of continuing education
  - SAMU will evaluate merit of introducing a 'fee schedule' that will identify all SAMU fees, including other fee for services, or transactional costs (tickets). In theory the fee schedule would be adjusted annually (if necessary) and brought forward as part of the formal budget approval process in conjunction with the draft budget. It would also be used as formal documentation to advise MacEwan of fees to be assessed to students (eliminating future admin errors or discrepancies).

I hope you're all carrying on as well as possible right now – cheers to the end of the semester! Please see below for my report detailing events that occurred between November 13<sup>th</sup> and December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020:

#### **Dedicated Advocacy**

#### Draft Sexual Violence Advocacy Policy and Student Advisory Group Terms of Reference

One of my biggest accomplishments of the month was finishing my work on the creation of a draft sexual violence advocacy policy for SAMU and some terms of reference for a SAMU-run sexual violence student advocacy group. We created this group as an ad-hoc subcommittee under EC so that I can get started on recruitment and training while still having the opportunity to wordsmith the terms of reference if needed before sending it through Students' Council. If you'd like to see either of these documents or if you have any questions related to this project, please don't hesitate to reach out.

#### MacEwan Student Life & EC Meeting

There were two meetings with Cassie Prochnau and Brett Farquharson from Student Affairs over the course of the reporting period. Topics of discussion included the Student of Concern program, SAMU needs, and meeting scheduling.

#### Sexual and Gender Minority Working Group (SGMWG)

There was one meeting of the SGMWG during the reporting period. There is a formal advisory committee in the works for MacEwan's Centre for Sexual and Gender Diversity, and the SGMWG has been dissolved in the meantime.

#### Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Committee

There was one meeting of MacEwan's Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Committee in November. Topics of discussion included MacEwan's equity and diversity inventory project and a terms of reference review.

#### Alberta-wide Campus Sexual Violence Discussion

Following some difficulty with getting all VPSLs/VPSAs in the same virtual space during CAUS Counterparts, it was agreed that we needed a separate meeting to discuss issues around campus sexual violence prevention that all our institutions have been experiencing. This was a very fruitful conversation. While it's disheartening to hear that a lot of the issues around funding and prioritization are also happening at other institutions, it's positive in that it provides a real basis for some collaborative advocacy work in the months to come.

#### SVPEC - Restorative Justice Subcommittee

There was one meeting of the SVPEC Restorative Justice Subcommittee over the reporting period. We discussed reading materials assigned in the previous meeting and their possible relevance to the development of restorative justice solutions for sexual violence at MacEwan.

#### **Commitment to Sustainability**

#### Faculty of Fine Arts and Communications Dean Appointment

I was also heavily involved with the reappointment process for the Dean of the Faculty of Fine Arts and Communications over the past month. Congratulations to Dr. Gilliland on his success in seeking reappointment!

#### Appointment Advisory Committee

AAC had a very busy month! We've recommended multiple students-at-large for committee appointments and we've also been busily trying to fill Council vacancies. The work won't be slowing down in the coming semester, but I'm grateful for the things that we've been able to accomplish.

#### Leadership Workshop

Myself and the rest of EC took part in an Everything DISC assessment and sessions with Keldar Leadership. I found this to be interesting and beneficial for our team dynamic. I learned a lot about how the other folks on our team think and operate, and I look forward to learning more about employing this knowledge as we continue to work together for the remainder of our terms.

#### Student Refugee Program

Dates have been confirmed for the arrival of the sponsored refugee student! We are very excited to welcome her to Edmonton and to the MacEwan community.

#### Grants Allocation Subcommittee (GASC)

We also decided that, considering COVID-19-related challenges, we will be eliminating the 10% fundraising requirement on Student Group events for the foreseeable future.

#### Pride Week Planning



Over the course of the reporting period, I attended several meetings related to the planning of MacEwan Pride Week 2021. All events are currently being planned for an online format. I'm very excited that we're still able to bring Pride Week to students during this challenging time.

#### Pride Event Planning

As part of the subcommittee that's planning Pride Week 2021, I've been in the early stages of planning an event around LGBTQ2S+ experiences and community building during the pandemic. Stay tuned for more on this!

#### MacEwan Book of the Year Committee

MacEwan's Book of the Year Committee has kept me busy this month as we move to choose next year's Book of the Year. I've really enjoyed the extra work I've gotten to do with this Committee this year. It's also been great to see some more diverse works in the selection pool!

#### Wellness and Psychological Services Check-in

On December 7th, I met with Tory Pino from Wellness and Psychological Services to discuss program updates, student concerns, and student interest in a potential series of events that WPS and the MacEwan University Health Clinic are looking to host in the new year. While I won't give too much away, I think this project will do a lot for engaging students virtually and promoting some degree of healthy living, especially for those living alone right now. ### Students' Council Report

# Board of Governors Student Representative December 16, 2020

Dear Council,

Below is my report from November 12 to December 10, 2020.

#### Finance, Property, and Investment Committee

On November 25th, the FPI Committee had its regularly scheduled meeting. This meeting turned out to be mildly contentious, with committee members posing legitimate questions and concerns regarding MacEwan's budgeting process. Another contentious discussion was surrounding an increase in tuition and mandatory non-instruction fees (MNIFs). The motion was for an average 6.95% increase in tuition, an 8% increase of the Sports & Wellness fee, and a 3% increase the Registrarial and Medical Clinic fees. I spoke against this motion because of the increased vulnerability of students. The tuition and MNIF increase motion was defeated, however, more because of a lack of clarity surrounding the costs of MNIFs. Tonight's Board meeting (December 10) will see a second discussion surrounding tuition and MNIFs.

#### Meeting with SAMU President & VP External

In preparation for the December 10th meeting, the President, VP External, and I met to discuss strategy for the Board meeting on December 1st and December 10th. We drafted remarks for the Board meeting as well as discussed the financials of it. As well, I solicited testimonials and stories from students to share with the Board to show the vulnerability of students. I plan on using these testimonials at the December 10th Board meeting when voting against the tuition and MNIFs increase.

#### **Board Education Sessions**

The Board of Governors recently named a new Governance & Human Resources chair, and since then the GHR committee created an updated Board Development Plan. On December 1st, we had our first Board education session. It was a panel consisting of the CEO of Chandos, CEO and President of Williams Engineering, and the Counsel of Dentons Canada. The topic was "Strategy in Times of Disruption" and the panel shared their relevant experiences with Board governance and flexible strategy in uncertain times.

The Board was also invited to attend a webinar with former federal minister the Hon. Amarjeet Sohi on December 7th. I attended and found the topic, "Compassionate, Collaborative, and Inclusive Leadership" fascinating. I've had the opportunity to listen to Mr. Sohi a couple times now and I've loved every single time. With this, I want to share with you all 4 aspects of compassionate and collaborative leadership that we can all aspire to.

- 1. Fostering leadership based on shared values and commitments
- 2. Building a culture of belonging by understanding and celebrating differences
- 3. Being accessible and open to diverse perspectives
- 4. Becoming comfortable with being wrong.

#### **Accessibility**

As I'm now at the half-way mark into my term and elections are only a couple months away now, I'm thinking about the role of the Board of Governors' Student Representative in the context of succession and accessibility. To be straightforward, this position is not accessible for many students. Currently it is an unpaid, volunteer position and is a great way to be more involved in

the university community, however, it requires a considerable amount of time and a flexible schedule. I worry that because of this, there will be limited or no candidates for this position come the next Executive election. In the coming months, I will reach out to the chair of the Governance Remuneration Advisory Committee to discuss compensation for the next person that holds this role.

#### Closing

I hope that you're all taking the time to take care of yourselves right now, as I know that so many of us are in stressful situations with COVID-19, finals, and the holiday season. My last report I mentioned that I was hoping that more restrictions would be put in place, however, my hope was misplaced. A month later, I'm glad we have restrictions now in place but I worry that it's too little too late. I hope that you're all safe and healthy, and that your loved ones are as well. Happy holidays!

Webcams for SC

### **Background Information:**

Leadership and Review Committee has been discussing a number of ways to improve the functioning of Students' Council, particularly in the context of online meetings. LRC believes that an important aspect of accountability in digital SC meetings is Councillors having their webcams on, but this expectation may not be fair to impose on Councillors without access to working webcams. We therefore want to explore the idea of acquiring 2-4 webcams for free rental to any Councillors who need them, for the duration of their term on Council. As chair of LRC, I have spoken with SAMU's general manager, Collin Steffes, and other SAMU staff about the idea, and the cost would be fairly minimal (probably about \$30 or so per camera). In order to move forward with this project in a meaningful way, LRC wanted to consult Councillors to see if there is currently a need for working webcams.

### **Implications:**

If Council expresses a need for these rental cameras, SAMU will acquire them. LRC will revisit the idea of recommending mandatory camera use (barring exceptional circumstances and short breaks) either through its Best Practices document or by bringing the idea to Bylaws and Policy Committee.
