Below is my report on my work as President between May 1st to May 13th.

Dedicated Advocacy

CAUS Changeover (May 7th-10th)

Our first weekend into the role, our VP External and I attended the CAUS Changeover with the former President, former VP External, and Advocacy Coordinator. Sessions included an intro to CAUS, Partner Organizations, Robert's Rules of Orders, Media training (which was open to all executives), Wellness, Tuition and Fees, Student Financial Aid, and more. On the final day of the conference, our very own VP External was elected Vice chair of CAUS; he put together an incredible application and resume, and I'm incredibly glad that SAMU will have a prominent voice in provincial advocacy.

SAMU/UASU/NAITSA Meeting with Mayor Iveson (May 12th)

Along with our General Manager, Advocacy Coordinator, former President, former VP External, and current VP External, I attended a meeting with outgoing Mayor Don Iveson. Our General Manager was able to arrange a meeting and it was a great opportunity to learn the municipal issues facing students, such as affordable housing, transit, and more.

CASA Membership Check-in (May 13th)

Along with our VP External, I attended a coffee chat where I got to meet the Membership Officer and Executive Director of CASA. This was a more informal conversation to get to know one another before we jump into the CASA Foundations conference in a couple weeks.

Commitment to Sustainability

EC Morning Meetings

Starting on our first day in the role, EC has met every morning so far. We're using the time to get to know one another, talk about our experiences in the role, and discuss important matters when necessary. As we'll be continuing online for some time, it's crucial that we develop a team relationship so that in the year ahead we can maximize our efforts in advocating for students.

CRO Interview (May 10th)

AAC interviewed one candidate for the CRO role. The report on that interview will be presented in camera at the Students' Council Meeting.



Relations with our Community

President's Quarterly Meeting (May 4th)

On my second day in office, I had my first quarterly meeting with Dr. Trimbee. I had the opportunity to discuss my priorities for the next year and found that there was a lot of alignment and areas for collaboration in the year ahead.. Just to recap, my priorities for the year are: engaging our community, affordability & accessibility, and working towards inclusion. These are all derived from my campaign platform.

Alumni Advisory Council (May 6th)

Bright and early at 7AM, I attended my first Alumni meeting. Around the table were some former SAMU executives such as Danika McConnell and Amy Beard. It was their last meeting of the year, so it was mainly wrapping up and concluding on their initiatives but I'm looking forward to the meetings in the year ahead.

Closing Remarks

The past two weeks have been absolutely busy, but I'm glad for the running start in my year as President. One thing I've noticed among the executive is how different our sleeping schedule's are now, compared to the rather unstructured one of a full-time student online. Planning and looking to the year ahead, I'm excited for the opportunities and challenges will occur. Some worth mentioning are the Alberta 2030: Building Skills for Jobs report and our return to campus. Two weeks ago, the Ministry of Advanced Education presented the Alberta 2030 review of the post-secondary sector. Initially, student leaders were worried when ideas of tuition deregulation, university consolidation, and superboards were floated in consultation, but luckily the Alberta 2030 report was quite subdued. If you'd like to learn more about the AB 2030 report, you can find it on Advanced Education's website. Legislation implementing the changes highlighted in the report will likely occur in the fall. In our return to campus, there's also opportunities and challenges presented. We must balance the health and safety of our community with the desire for engagement and the true student experience, which has been sorely missing this past year in working from home. There are so many unknowns right now as it pertains to COVID-19, but with the rate of vaccinations I'm optimistic for the fall. I encourage you all to get vaccinated when possible, with any vaccine available to you.

Vice President Academic May 19th, 2021

Greetings Council,

It has been an exciting first two weeks in office filled with many Teams, Webex and Zoom meeting, keeping my fellow Execs and I plenty busy. Please find my report below detailing events that occurred between May 1st and May 14th.

Dedicated Advocacy

Committee Appointments

During our transition week, committee appointments were conducted to redistribute all the committees the EC will sit on or chair for both MacEwan and SAMU this year. In the VP Academic role, I will mainly be sitting on MacEwan committees.

General Faculties Council Meeting

In this open session, a number of reports were given by the various branches contained within GFC as a whole, all of which are committees and/or working groups I am also a part of. In this meeting, there was the appointment of a Professional Association representative to the Health and Community Studies Faculty Council and approval of the revised Final Assessments Policy

Commitment to Sustainability

Transition

During the virtual transition week, we had excellent sessions led by the past EC, the GM and Alan outlining goal setting and project planning for this upcoming year. We were also able to spend some time outside together (socially distanced and following COVID restrictions at the time) to meet each other and ease into the new roles.

I have also had a number of meetings and collaborated with the past SA VP Academic, Alycia Stewart, moving into this role and tying up any potential loose ends.

Relations with our Community

Media Training

Through CAUS (Council of Alberta University Students), SAMU EC participated in a two-hour training session on how to deal with the media in terms of answering questions, getting one's messaging across, and establishing necessary relations.

Stewardship of Resources

Committee on Standards, Curriculum and the Calendar

This open session had a number of additions and removals to the calendar, with a recommendation of grading policy and research conducted on using ELA 30-2 as part of the admission criteria for students in different faculties.

Academic Calendar Advisory Group

The agenda for this meeting was heftier, with the addition of SAMU fee information and correctional services into the academic calendar. A recommendation to include institutional learning outcomes in the calendar was approved, along with discussion on publishing the calendar earlier with a number of deadlines for the curriculum being formalized.

VPA Report to Students' Council

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Integration of the SAMU Building

The day it was announced by the provincial government that the SAMU Building would be temporarily closing down I got to go for an in-person tour. That is likely the last time I'll be seeing my office on the third floor for the next little while.

Connect to Students

Appeals

Peak season for appeals has arrived and I have increased my office hours to meet with students to go through the appeals process and support them to the best of my abilities until the Student Support Coordinator is settled in. With Alycia's support, I have attended several one-on-one student meetings and acted as the support person for Stage I-III appeals.

Enhance Student Experience

Moodle Implementation Steering Committee

With Blackboard being replaced by Moodle, this committee discussed the functionality of Moodle and features that would be beneficial to both students and faculty. Team lead reports, discussion on minor aesthetic aspects, overview of current timelines and results from the various student focus groups were also brought up.

Proctorio Guided Session

Proctorio, a virtual proctoring system looking to be implemented on Blackboard in a limited capacity for some examinations, was presented to a few relevant stakeholders. We were able to test Proctorio from both the student and instructor lenses.

Campus Supports For Open Education Resources

In speaking to individuals from the MacEwan library, the Bookstore and from the Office of Teaching and Learning, we discussed what OERs are going to look like for students at MacEwan, with a slower rollout to faculty. Representing SAMU, I have been tasked with taking lead for contacting the relevant individuals in identifying courses with low- or no-cost materials and listing them on the course calendar.

Closing Remarks

Ever gone through ~11 000 emails, receive your work computer 20 minutes before your first meeting, and have to sit through a 180-minute-long software update? That was the start of my term. A little chaotic, a lot of time put aside to get things organized and quite a few back-to-back meetings. It has been a great time so far and a huge kudos to Alycia, the past VP Academic, for allowing me to shadow so many meetings with students, working groups, and committees prior to my term to make the transition smoother.

I'm looking forward to starting to roll out some projects as part of my election campaign and to continue connecting to students. That of course includes all of you, so please reach out either by email (savpacademic@macewan.ca) or any other platform at any point this year.

Vice President External May 19th, 2021

Hello Councillors,

The following is a summary of the Vice President External (VPE) activities since the April 21st meeting. I will note that since my term officially began on May 1st, some of the things reported on before that date were handled by my predecessor Ruan Bouwer. I encourage any and all questions related to my report, as I will aim to keep it as concise as possible for the subsequent monthly reports as I realize this is a bit long.

Transition:

External Transition All-Day Bonanza (April 22nd)

The previous Executive Committee (EC) team, notably the former VP External and President (among other important efforts from the Advocacy Coordinator), did a great job transitioning me for the new role during a marathon of meetings and summaries of various aspects of my upcoming position.

Transition Week (April 26th-30th)

The last week of the terms of the previous EC was dedicated to transitioning all of the new EC team in a unique and flexible digital manner, which included various presentations, projects, and opportunities for us to ask questions. Usually this transition week occurs out of town, but for obvious reasons, it was changed to an online format this year. While it was very effective given the circumstances, nothing beats in-person communication and I sincerely hope we are able to do this “the old fashioned way” next year.

Advocacy:

Council of Alberta University Students (CAUS) Changeover (May 7th-10th)

I attended the yearly CAUS changeover conference where we do out with the old and in with the new (delegates, that is). Aside from general onboarding and information overload, I also was elected Vice Chair for the upcoming year. I am excited to be serving alongside our Chair, Rachel Timmermans of the Students' Association of Mount Royal University (SAMRU). I could not have

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done it without the help and support from the Advocacy Coordinator, the President, and our previous EC team. I am hopeful for what the position entails in the upcoming year. This role will occupy a sizeable chunk of my efforts for this term as Rachel and I plan the upcoming counterparts conference, form the priorities document, create the budget submission, and work on a response to the Alberta 2030 review.

Alberta 2030 Review (released April 28th)

I was present for the recent and long-awaited unveiling of the Alberta 2030: Building Skills for Jobs review. In summary: the Minister of Advanced Education unveiled the approach that the Alberta government will take to make changes to post-secondary education (PSE) to move it towards a goal in 2030. AB2030 would have been far worse for students if not for the efforts of CAUS and various students' unions and associations to make the student voice heard and minimize many of the things recommended by McKinsey (a consultation firm that was paid 3.5 million to produce recommendations for AB2030), as tuition deregulation or "Super Boards" would make PSE in Alberta more expensive and less efficient. To quote Alex Usher on the AB 2030: "...as a strategy, it's a) not all that scary, b) not especially well-resourced, and c) absolutely never going to happen as envisaged unless someone starts extending timelines." The report does have some good things in it (such as the notion that tuition could be tied to inflation), but many of the "good things" are planned to come into effect later than the "bad things". The next year will involve trying to delay the bad and fast-track the good.

Mayor Iveson meeting (May 12th)

The President and I attended a meeting with the Mayor alongside SAMU's outgoing VPX, President, and General Manager. The meeting was an informal advocacy-esque meeting with representatives from NAITSA and UASU present. The three organizations were asked to share our thoughts on housing, transit, and other municipal issues, and have the Mayor respond with what the city is doing/has done to address these issues.

Bilateral meetings:

Ryan Lindblad, University of Lethbridge Students' Union (ULSU) VPE (May 7th)

Meetings with my counterparts at other students' unions (SUs) and students' associations (SAs) is very important to how I plan to operate over the remaining 11 or so months of my term. There are many advocacy points that are key to my priorities (such as increasing student aid, integrating an indigenous voice to my advocacy, and creating better work-integrated (WIL) opportunities for

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students) that are shared by other SUs and SAs, and getting input from Ryan and other counterparts of mine provides me with feedback that is crucial to my effectiveness in my role. Ryan informed me of his priorities, and we outlines areas of collaboration for the upcoming year, notably on a better approach to pressuring the government on sexual violence prevention.

Christian Fotang, University of Alberta Students' Union (UASU) VPE (May 13th)

Christian and I met for the aforementioned reasons regarding sharing approaches and strategies to tackle similar issues. He and I plan on being active members of the Edmonton Student Alliance (ESA) for this year, championing fresh ideas surrounding WIL and anti-racism efforts on campus. He also provided insight on how his SC/EC dynamic unfolds, and gave me interesting ideas for how to engage with our Councillors at SAMU. He and I both only ran for our respective positions because of then-current members of EC reaching out and empowering us as Councillors. Additionally, we are very interested in involving Edmonton students in a forum with the upcoming municipal candidates.

Rachel Timmermans, SAMRU VPE (May 13th)

Rachel and I had our first of what will be many meetings related to our roles at CAUS as Chair and Vice Chair. We discussed priorities for the role in the upcoming year, as well as our approaches to advocacy in relation to other provincial student organizations. Rachel and I strongly believe in the power of a unified message for Albertan students.

Other:

Committee appointments (May 5th)

In our first EC meeting of the term, I was appointed chair of Leadership and Review Committee (LRC) at SAMU, as well as a member of these MacEwan bodies: Information and Technology Management Committee, Book of the Year Committee, and Indigenous Advisory Council.

GovWeek planning with VP Operations and Finance (VPO) (May 10th)

The VPO reached out to me to discuss the various ways she wishes to increase engagement and effectiveness of the various resources for connecting students with SAMU governance. Considering I am the chair of LRC, there will be significant overlap in the overall goals and strategy of the VPO's initiatives and what LRC can make progress on.



Monthly Meeting with MacEwan's Director of Government Relations, Theresa Vladicka (May 10th)

Theresa and I decided we would continue the monthly meetings initiated by my predecessor in the previous term. We discussed issues associated with transferring credits to MacEwan, and the impending performance-based funding (PBF) implementation.

Closing Remarks:

I must thank the outgoing EC (and the remaining SAMU staff) for doing a phenomenal job being resources and providing support to my transition into this role. Additionally, I must thank our Advocacy Coordinator Parvin Sedighi in particular for her invaluable support that enabled me to be selected as CAUS Vice Chair. I look forward to productively challenging the notion from the Government of Alberta that "skills for jobs" is the supreme reason one ought to obtain an education, and making clear how such an approach puts too much of the onus on individual institutions to solve a problem that barely exists to begin with.

I hope you all found my report informative, and I sincerely encourage anyone to reach out should they wish to discuss anything related to my portfolio. We no longer have the informal consultation, the random hallway chats, the pre-meeting root beer with Tim, or the post-meeting political monologues/soliloquies among fellow members of SC. In speaking to some other VPEs about horror stories relating to antagonistic and inefficient governance, it really makes me grateful for the relationship our EC has to the rest of SC, and I look forward to cultivating that dynamic. I want to empower every Councillor to feel as if they have the tools and abilities to make the most of their governance obligations, and I have full confidence we can fill the open spaces on SC with energetic and capable people. The onus is on all of us to restore SC to its full capacity.

SVOVE Update

SVOVE's first session has been scheduled for May 22nd (Yay)! The Student Voice on Sexual Violence Committee has been in the works for a long time, and it will be great to see the hard work put into forming it pay off at this first training session. Aubrianna Snow was responsible for the conceptualization and creation of this committee, and I'm excited to continue her great work by chairing it this year. SVPEC

I attended my first Sexual Violence Prevention & Education Committee meeting on May 7th. At this meeting, we examined the Office of Sexual Violence Prevention and Education's proposed 2021-2022 budget, as well as review strategic goals and milestones SVPEC hopes to achieve this year. We're exploring ways to increase the number of people at MacEwan (staff and students) who receive sexual violence prevention training so they can educate and disseminate this training to their colleagues and peers.

Restorative Justice

I attended a Restorative Justice meeting on May 7th, held in collaboration between MacEwan and NAIT. Speakers from NAIT described how they used restorative justice practices for cases of sexual violence at the polytechnic institute, and our MacEwan counterparts took note to see if similar practices could be effectively implemented here at MacEwan. A follow up Restorative Justice meeting was held May 13th to debrief the NAIT approach.

Commitment to Sustainability

SAMU Building

We are hoping we will be able to fully realize the building's potential this upcoming academic year, however it's a bit touch and go right now until we see concrete evidence that Covid is on the decline.

Mandate

1 Audit Committee assists Students' Council in fulfilling its financial oversight responsibilities.

Roles of Committee

2 Audit Committee monitors, evaluates, advises, and makes recommendations on:

- 2.1** matters affecting external, internal, or special audits;
- 2.2** policies and practices related to internal controls; and
- 2.3** compliance with legal, statutory, and regulatory requirements.

Authority

3 Audit Committee is granted unrestricted access to SAMU information relating to its mandate or to the roles of the committee.

Composition

4 The voting members of Audit Committee are three Councilors and two students-at-large.

4.1 If voting positions of the Audit Committee cannot be populated by Councillors, students-at-large will fill the remaining positions.

4.2 Preference will be given to students-at-large with financial experience.

5 The resource officials of Audit Committee are a public member with professional accounting experience and a full-time staff member of the Finance Department.

6 No SAMU official with signing authority may serve on Audit Committee.

7 Any Councillor is entitled to attend a committee meeting in a non-voting capacity.

Committee Operations

8 Audit Committee selects a Chair from among the Councillors on the committee.

9 Regular quarterly meetings of Audit Committee are held once per fiscal quarter, on dates determined at the first meeting following the initial appointment of Councillors to committees.

9.1 Voting members who fail to attend a regular quarterly meeting are automatically removed from the committee.

10 The Committee Chair may call additional meetings as required.

11 SAMU's auditors may advise and present to Audit Committee when required and as part of the audit process.

Standing Orders

12 Audit Committee reviews Executive spending and work, vacation, and sick hours quarterly.

13 Audit Committee reviews budget variances quarterly.

14 Audit Committee reviews out-of-budget and exceptional authorizations or expenses.

15 Audit Committee reviews compliance with recommendations made by SAMU's auditors.

16 Audit Committee reviews the performance of the auditors and may, at its discretion, recommend to Students' Council a change in auditors.

17 Audit committee may add to its work plan any item of concern relating to its mandate or roles which has been brought to its attention by committee members, Councillors, Executives, SAMU staff, SAMU members, or SAMU's auditors.

17.1 The identity of any individual who brings a concern before Audit Committee is kept confidential and is not disclosed during Audit Committee investigations, in minutes or in reports.

3 Leadership and Review Committee reviews Students' Council's decisions in relation to their adherence to SAMU Bylaws and Policies.

3.1 Leadership and Review Committee may call a re-vote on a decision where it deems the decision was a violation of Bylaws or Policies.

3.2 Members of Students' Council may request a review of a decision in relation to its adherence to Bylaws and Policies.

3.2.1 Requests must be made in writing to the Chair of Leadership and Review Committee within 10 days of the disputed decision.

3.2.2 Leadership and Review Committee will have 30 days to respond in writing to Students' Council with its decision.

4 Leadership and Review Committee creates opportunities for members of Students' Council to develop leadership skills by:

4.1 researching and implementing applicable professional development opportunities for members of council; and

4.2 developing team building opportunities for Students' Council.

5 Leadership and Review Committee develops a plan for Student Council to engage with SAMU members.

6 Leadership and Review Committee reports on the effectiveness and progress of Students' Council.

Composition

7 The voting members of Leadership and Review Committee are one Executive, two Councillors, and two students-at-large.

8 The resource official of Students' Council Review Committee is the Governance Advisor.

8.1 Any member of Students' Council is entitled to attend a committee meeting in a non-voting capacity.



Committee Operations

9 Meetings of Leadership and Review Committee are held at least twice per quarter.

10 The Committee Chair may call additional meetings as required.
