To facilitate the retention of institutional knowledge and relations across successive Executive Committee members I've scheduled meetings with myself, the SAMU President, and the deans of each school on campus. It's been fantastic to build upon

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those relationships and move forward to support both their initiatives as well as gain their support for several of our initiatives. So far, we have met with the Dean of the School of Nursing, Dean of the School of Health & Community Studies, and the Dean of the School of Arts & Sciences. The remaining meetings will stretch over the summer and end in the fall.

## Student Engaged Research

The Office of Research Services is introducing a new lead, Dr. Hugh Mckenzie. To better support student research by identifying gaps, I prepared a report of student interviews took part in student research. After discussing the results with Dr. Mckenzie and Dr. Sand Jung, we have highlighted some areas of support, such as advertising and communications, for the next year. While consultations are ongoing, I'm excited to break ground and help generate more interest in student research at MacEwan.

One of my projects this year has been to create two OER workshops. These workshops will focus on guiding students to websites and library services that can save them textbook costs. I'm working with the Library and Center for Teaching & Learning to create programing for this project. In addition, I'll be presenting with Eva Rivett during the New Faculty Orientation to help new instructors and staff learn about the various OER resources available to them.

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## AIO Consultations

## Strat Bullet Point 3.1 & 3.3

Over the past 12 months I've worked with the Academic Integrity Office to develop stronger strategies to facilitate restorative practice for academic integrity violations. So far, our current strategy is experiencing a few gaps so the AIO officer and I have been reaching out to stakeholders and reading papers on the most effective strategies. This will include reaching out to our new connections with the School of Health & Community Studies to find the most effective route for restorative practice at MacEwan.

## AI 2 Working Group

#### Strat Bullet Point 3.1 & 3.3

The AI 2 working group has produced draft papers on AI at MacEwan. Our goal is to conclude research and consultations by the end of the summer and present the final draft to the Committee on Teaching & Learning. The key points of each draft were reciprocity in AI use, fair use, legal rules & privacy, revisiting learning outcomes, highlighting academic freedom for faculty, new modes of assessment, and accountability. Furthermore, we've highlighted citation guides in APA, MLA, & Chicago style for Generative AI models (like DALLE and ChatGPT) that are now available on the Library website.

## Calendar Advisory Group

At CAG we covered a variety of operational components of our information management systems. Besides that, we approved the course code for a new non-credit

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course for the School of Continuing Education titled 'Bookkeeping & Accounting'. This non-credit course will be available for the Fall of 2023-2024.

## Land Based Teaching – National Indigenous Peoples Day

 National Indigenous Peoples Day is a day to recognize and celebrate the history, heritage, resilience and diversity of First Nations, Inuit and Metis across Canada. This day has been celebrated for generations dating back to 1996. The Governor General of Canada, Roméo LeBlanc, proclaimed June 21<sup>st</sup> National Aboriginal

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Day! It's an opportunity for everyone to celebrate the cultural richness and contributions of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples.

 As part of growing the relationship with SAMU's most proximal neighbor, MacEwan, I joined the libraries external services team for a Land based Teaching about our location here in Beaver Hills (Edmonton). This teaching included discussion and speculation about some of the Indigenous artwork placed downtown during Alberta's Centennial project. As well, a discussion and presentation of the differing natural occurring plants in the area. Did you know: The Alberta Legislature has a "natural life" section which is tailored to specifically grow only what would be found present in each region across Canada. In a way one can "walk across Canada" in mere minutes.

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conference was an opportunity for the external advocacy teams from each member institution to have an open dialogue with one another with an end goal of deciding our provincial values and priorities. As an organization, CAUS's focus is on three main issues for the upcoming year, Affordability, Honoring Treaties & Mental Health.

- I had the opportunity to voice the values and concerns of MacEwan students along with CAUS delegates, while attending the Calgary Stampede government relations events. Meeting with a combined total of 80% of our provinces MLA's and a few key ministers, the trip was a success. Edmonton having voted completely orange in the most recent election made it imperative for SAMU as well as the UASU (University of Alberta's Student Union) to get in front of our newly elected government and show that we are non-partisan institutions.



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## Edmonton City Council: Urban Planning Committee

- I had the opportunity to voice the values and concerns of MacEwan students along with the Vice-President External from the University of Alberta Student's Union (UASU), at the City of Edmonton's Urban Planning Committee meeting where we spoke on the city's zoning bylaw change.
- Affordability and Housing have been highlighted by both MacEwan and U of A students as key issues right now. We spoke in favor of the zoning bylaw change as the bylaw would increase densification, which would in theory increase the amount of affordable housing options for students. I will continue to advocate at the municipal level on behalf of students.

## Restorative Justice Subcommittee

3.3 – Strengthen collaborations and partnerships with MacEwan University to expand supports and resources for students.

As a member of the Sexual Violence Prevention and Education Committee (SVPEC), I also sit on several subcommittees, including the Restorative Justice Approach to Sexual Violence Subcommittee. This subcommittee has been tasked with adding an option for processing complaints of sexual violence on campus through a restorative justice system. We met for the first time of my term June 23 and discussed the logistical framework of a restorative justice approach to reconciling sexual violence complaints. This included having readily available information on the restorative justice approach for students, faculty, and staff when sexual violence acts are disclosed, how this will look VPSL Report to Students' Council 07-19-2023 Page 1 of 3



for a complainant, what kinds of sexual violence complaints will be considered appropriate for restorative justice, and what the necessary supports for all involved parties will look like. We further discussed a timeline for the pilot project, and we hope to launch it in the upcoming winter 2024 semester. Next steps are legal consultation and fine tuning the investigation process which will occur in the fall.
