National Indigenous Advocacy Committee (NIAC) x CASA x SAMU Meeting

2.3 Continue to build collaborative relationships with other Students' Associations and organizations to enhance the collective student voice with all government levels.



I, alongside the VPE, met with NIAC's leadership and CASA's Executive Director (ED) to discuss NIAC's framework for how CASA members should select Indigenous student representatives to serve as a delegate on NIAC. The meeting also served as an opportunity to strengthen SAMU's relationship with both NIAC and CASA.

SAMU and MacEwan: Executives Meeting

2.4 Foster positive relationships with MacEwan University to better serve students.

SAMU and MacEwan Presidents and Vice-Presidents, along with support staff, met to discuss the year ahead. Topics of discussion included: introductions, Teaching Greatness and a Vibrant Campus, update on Spring, Summer, and Fall terms, affordability, Sunday exams, collaboration with MacEwan and external communities, and joint advocacy opportunities. During the meeting, we received a \$15,000 Food Pantry donation from MacEwan. While we are of course thankful, we understand that affordability is a serious concern that requires continuous effort to address.

CASA Policy and Strategy Conference

2.3 Continue to build collaborative relationships with other Students' Associations and organizations to enhance the collective student voice with all government levels.

The VPE and I went to Fredericton to attend CASA's conference. The conference focused on setting CASA's direction for the year. Throughout the conference, members were consulted and debated on the Board Action Plan, CASA's Priorities, and workplans for committees. During the week, members were consulted by Government of Canada representatives regarding the Canada Student Financial Assistance Program (CSFAP). Prior to the conference, I was asked by the Athabasca University Students' Union (AUSU) to represent them during plenary. I accepted. On the last day of the conference, the revised Board Action Plan, CASA's Priority Themes, and the workplans for various committees were approved.

Student Experience & Engagement

Project BHG

The Beaver Hills Gathering is my first special project for the year, happening on August 22nd. The Beaver Hills Gathering is a gathering of 6 post-secondary institutions here in Edmonton. To include: MacEwan, UoA, NAIT, NORQUEST, Concordia and The Kings University, primarily their Indigenous / Aboriginal centers. The traditional name of Edmonton is Amiskwaciy Waskahikan, meaning Beaver Hills House. This place was the traditional meeting ground for many Indigenous communities, including the Cree, Saulteaux, Nakota Sioux, Blackfoot and the Metis Peoples.

I have created this gathering to rewrite the narrative of how the Indigenous people of Canada are viewed, and more importantly how they view themselves. There is a romanticism of Indigenous people in Canada that has deep colonial routes. In the media today, we see this romanticism portrayed in what are called "The Four D's". These Four D's are the only time you see the Indigenous people of Canada in the news. The four D's are as follows: Drumming, Dancing, Drinking or Dead. The Beaver Hills Gathering is a direct flip of this script. Bringing together Indigenous students from an expansive background to highlight and celebrate their diversity for a day of professional and personal development.

CASA UPDATE

SA President and I had the opportunity to attend CASA's Policy and Strategy conference this past month where we had to opportunity to vote and decide the action plan for our current year. The conversations and plenaries had at Policy and Strategy help determine CASA's statements and recommendations to the Federal government. Here is the latest released recommendation from CASA.

Students from coast to coast to coast have identified that "Ensuring Equitable Access to Post-Secondary Education" will help support these rapidly inflating post-secondary expenses. CASA's 2024 Pre-Budget recommendations direct the federal government in the best practices to work towards an equitable, accessible, and affordable post-secondary system for all post-secondary students across the country. In brief, these recommendations are as follows:

- 1. Invest \$813.6 million annually, indexed to the consumer price index, to permanently set Canada Student Grant maximums at \$4,200 per year and maintain weekly loan maximums at \$300/week.
- 2. Increase funding to the Post-Secondary Student Support Program and Métis and Inuit Post-Secondary Education Strategies to fund every eligible Indigenous student to attend post-secondary education.
- 3. Maintain a lower cost of textbooks and learning materials by preserving the fair dealing exception under the Copyright Act.
- 4. Invest \$500 million over 4 years to hire 1,200 new post-secondary counsellors across Canada to address the ongoing mental health crisis in Canada's post-secondary institutions.



- 5. Unlock housing supply by investing \$3.25 billion dollars to support the addition of 15,000 residence beds at Canadian post-secondary institutions to be completed within six years.
- 6. Permanently end the 20-hour work restriction on international students.
- 7. Protect Canadian talent creation by increasing the value of Canada Graduate Scholarships and Post-Doctoral Fellowships by 50%, and doubling the number of these competitive research awards.

With the release of this document, the Canadian Alliance of Student Associations is hopeful that the 2024 federal budget will reflect the needs that students across the country have identified as important and meaningful for the future of post-secondary education in Canada.

NIAC UPDATE

NIAC is apart of CASA. Part of CASA's reconciliation plans were the creation of the National Indigenous Advocacy Committee (NIAC). This group represents Indigenous students' advocacy interests within CASA and believes that access to post-secondary education is an inherent treaty right, guaranteed under the Numbered Treaties (1871-1921). NIAC's mission is to ensure Indigenous students are being given opportunities to enter and succeed in post-secondary, as well as to advocate for increased action to meet the Truth & Reconciliation Commission's 94 calls to action.

The executive team has recently voted to select MacEwan student Katrina Koe as SAMU's NIAC delegate for a term ending in April 2024. Katrina is currently attending NIAC's retreat. When she returns the VPE and NIAC delegate will work to creating a report for Student' Council.
