LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

FELLOW STUDENTS,

Fall has arrived once again, and brought with it a sea of new and familiar faces in the hallways of MacEwan. As you gear up for another year of classes, extracurriculars, and assignments, I wanted to take a moment to welcome you to campus on behalf of SAMU. As your students' association, SAMU exists to make your experience at MacEwan better, from advocating to the university and government on your behalf, to fun and meaningful programs, services and events.

The past year has been a difficult one. The skyrocketing costs of living and education presents a major barrier to most students, if not all of us. Your challenges have not gone unnoticed by your elected representatives at SAMU, and we've been working hard to advocate on your behalf to government and university decision-makers. In order to ensure our advocacy is informed, we continued our commitment to being student-led by running a series of surveys throughout the year to gauge students' experiences and issues.

We heard from students that affordability continues to be a major barrier to mental well-being and academic performance, and we also heard the impacts that various global conflicts are having on the students of MacEwan. This is why we have recommitted to advocating for better financial supports for students from the provincial and federal governments, and focusing on access to affordable housing for students in our ongoing work with the city. We also increased our outreach with student groups affected by conflict, and our work there is ongoing as situations evolve and change.

On the MacEwan front, your Executive Committee is hard at work advocating for oncampus measures and resources to improve your student experience. Whether it's tackling the tuition and fees consultation process, attending the General Faculties Council, or working with the team at MacEwan Student Affairs, the students elected to represent you are championing and addressing the issues impacting us.

As you go into this new academic year, know that SAMU is with you every step of the way to help you navigate the complexities of post-secondary education while providing you with plenty of opportunities to have fun and meet new people. Community is at the heart of what makes MacEwan the warm and welcoming place it is. Without students, the very being of this university would not be possible.

It's true that university is what you make of it, so I invite you to be open, curious, and adventurous as you enter or return to the halls of MacEwan University. Community is not something you can often stumble into, but with a little bit of work, it's something you can build within your university and take with you for years to come.

STUDENT GOVERNANCE

STUDENT GOVERNANCE

Student governance at SAMU works like this: MacEwan students elect 14 of their peers to represent them as Councillors and five to serve as the Executive Committee. Together, they form **Students' Council**. The Students' Council is the highest governing body within the Students' Association. Along with student consultation, they set SAMU's direction through bylaws and policies.

The Executive Committee oversees the SAMU General Manager. In addition, each member of the Executive Committee is responsible for advising both Students' Council and other Executive Committee members on their portfolios.

It may sound complicated, but this system ensures that the needs of MacEwan students are met in a diplomatic manner and that everyone is held accountable to the MacEwan students who vote for them. That leads us to...

ELECTIONS

Eligible students are welcome to run for a Councillor or an Executive position. Elections for Councillors take place in the Fall and Executive Committee elections take place in the Winter. All Executives are responsible for their specific portfolios and other responsibilities as described in SAMU Policies.







STUDENT BENEFITS PLAN

HEALTH & DENTAL

The Student Benefits Plan covers supplementary health and dental services. Through this plan, students have access to prescription drugs, vision care, paramedical practitioners, psychologists and dental services. Additional coverage includes emergency travel assistance, virtual legal support, tuition and tutorial insurance, critical illness and accidental death and dismemberment.

ELIGIBILITY

Students taking a minimum of one university credit level course in an eligible program are automatically assessed the health and dental insurance fees on their student account.

HOW TO ACCESS YOUR BENEFITS

Present your Benefit Cards to the service providers who will submit your claims directly to the insurance carrier. Register in the new mystudentplan Benefits App on your web browser or mobile app. Click the profile icon and click "My Benefit Cards." There you will find your Drug, Health and Dental Cards. Save them on your mobile wallet or download them to your phone for future use.

Plan Options

The Balanced plan is the default plan, which provides both health and dental coverage. Additionally, there are three (3) FLEX plan options available to students for no additional charge to suit the students' needs. You can compare plan options by viewing the "benefits" tab at mystudentplan.ca/macewan.

Online Claims

If you incur an eligible expense and are asked to pay out of pocket, the easiest and quickest way to get reimbursed is to submit an online claim via the new mystudentplan Benefits App.

Register today and start managing your benefit plans. To learn how to register, visit the "claim" tab at mystudentplan.ca/macewan.

Opting Out

Students who wish to opt out of the health and dental insurance must have comparable coverage and must submit an online opt-out form before the applicable deadline. Deadlines are firm, and you must pay the associated fees for the entire year if you miss the deadline—no exceptions will be made. To find opt out eligibility criteria and deadlines, click on the Applications tab at mystudentplan.ca/macewan

Re-enroll

If you previously opted out of the student plan and wish to re-enroll, you must submit an online application at the start of your academic year before the applicable deadline OR within 30 days of losing your alternate coverage. Visit mystudentplan.ca/macewan and click on the Applications tab. Please email the Benefit Plan Office at macewanplan@mystudentplan.ca if you are within 30 days of losing your alternate coverage.

Adding Family

Extend your student benefits to your dependents by purchasing coverage to provide them with the same health and dental benefits. To find out about eligibility and pricing, click on the Applications tab at mystudentplan.ca/macewan.

MYWELLNESSPLAN

All MacEwan students have access to the mywellnessplan which provides support and resources for students experiencing mental health issues. We provide free, anonymous mental health assessments, online video counselling and tools that help strengthen your Mental Health and live with more balance. MYLEGALPLAN


SAMU MARKETS

CENTURY PARK

U-PASS

The Universal Transit Pass (U-Pass) provides students with affordable transit options for the school term and gives students unlimited regular transit access to Edmonton, St. Albert, Strathcona County, Spruce Grove, Fort Saskatchewan, Leduc and Beaumont Transit systems. To access the U-Pass, a student must be enrolled in an on-campus program, taking at least one on-campus class and assessed the U-Pass fee of \$180/term.

To use the U-pass:

- 1. REGISTER an ARC Card* on your myStudentSystem. Registration is located in the "fees" tile.
- 2. ADD the current term U-pass onto the card **
- 3. TAP on and off when riding transit
- 4. REUSE the ARC card by adding your U-Pass each term
- ARC Cards are available at SAMU Office SA-301 and other retail locations
- ** Click on the card number to open a U-Pass assessed window. Move the toggle next to the current term to say "yes", accept Terms and Conditions and SAVE.

There are three different Term U-passes with the valid dates as follows:

- Fall Term August 25 to December 31
- · Winter Term January 1 to April 30
- · Spring/Summer Term April 20 to August 31

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

To protect the value of your education, it's important that you uphold the values of academic integrity. These values are understood through five core pillars:

- Honesty
- Trust
- Fairness
- Respect
- Responsibility

REASSESSMENT OF MARKS

If you believe an assignment or exam you completed was not graded fairly, you can request a reassessment of your mark. Here's how:

- Contact your instructor. Email them within four business days of receiving the mark.
- Await your instructor's response. They must respond within four business days of your request. If you cannot reach an agreement, proceed to step three.
- 3. Submit a request of mark reassessment to your Department Chair. In an email, submit the following: the Reassessment of Mark Request Form*, copies of your correspondence with your instructor, a specific explanation of why you think you need reassessment and rationale for how the reassessment will impact your final course grade.
- 4. The Department Chair makes a decision. If they approve your request, your original mark is re-evaluated within eight business days. If they deny your request, your original mark stands. In both cases, all decisions are final and you may not resubmit or appeal.

ACADEMIC RECORDS

The Office of the University Registrar (OUR) maintains your official academic record. The OUR can prepare your official transcript and arrange for documentation confirming your enrolment and status as a student. All records are confidential and cannot be released to anyone else without your consent.

As a student, you will also have 24/7 access to print off documents related to your Academic Records through self-service on your myStudentSystem portal.

Aside from being able to print off your unofficial transcript at any time, you can print off your Enrolment Verification. This document is a comprehensive summary of your academic status with MacEwan. A very common use for Enrolment Verification is for your bank or your RESP provider.

Please ensure your popup blocker is turned off before generating the letter.

Steps:

- 1. Log in to myportal.macewan.ca.
- 2. Launch myStudentSystem.
- 3. In the Academic Records tile of the Student Homepage, click Enrolment Verification.
- 4. Select Term Enrolment Status.
- Click on the magnifying glass icon to select the term or range of terms you would like to verify.
- Click Submit. A PDF will open & you can print it out and/or save your Verification of Enrolment.

ACADEMIC STANDING

Academic standings are applicable to satisfactory and unsatisfactory academic performance. They include: Dean's List, First Class Standing, Good Standing, Academic Probation and Required to Withdraw. Detailed information regarding these standings can be found in the Academic Standing Policy under macewan.ca/policies.

Academic Standing Grade Point Average (ASGPA) is calculated at the end of each term, while applicable academic standings are assigned at the end of each Winter term. At the end of the Winter term, students with unsatisfactory academic performance will be notified of academic standing actions such as Academic Probation or Required to Withdraw.

Find your calculated ASGPA on myStudentSystem:

- 1. Log in to myportal.macewan.ca.
- 2. Launch mvStudentSvstem.
- 3. In the Academic Records tile of the Student Homepage, click View Grades.
- 4. Select the applicable term.
- At the top of the page, under View Grades your Academic Standing GPA (ASGPA) will be listed.

If you have concerns regarding your ASGPA, we encourage you to contact an Advisor in your Faculty or School. Visit your program's website for your advisor's contact information.

COURSE WITHDRAWAL

If you're planning on dropping a course, it must be before the published Add/Drop deadline of that course's semester. You may be eligible for a fee adjustment and the course will not appear on your academic record.

After the last day to Add/Drop, it is considered a Course Withdrawal:

- The course will appear on your transcript with a "W" grade.
- You will not be eligible for any fee adjustment and will be responsible for tuition/fees associated with the course.
- A "W" grade will not negatively impact your Grade Point Average (GPA).
- You are responsible for making changes to your enrolment on myStudentSystem.

Consulting your program advisors is strongly recommended as well as checking the Academic Schedule, myStudentSystem or the Office of the University Registrar for important deadlines.

If you decide to withdraw from the university, you must formally withdraw from your courses on myStudentSystem. Non-attendance does not constitute a withdrawal and can result in failing grades and financial debt.





LOCKER REGISTRATION

Each student has the option to rent a locker through the online system while registered at MacEwan. The cost is \$40 for September-April, or \$20 if just attending one term. Locks must be supplied by the student, and can be purchased on-campus at the MacEwan Bookstore.

How to get a locker:

- · Lockers marked reserved are not available.
- · Find an empty locker and put your lock on it.
- Snap a photo of your locker # with your lock on it.
- Immediately following you need to register & pay for the locker online.
- Follow the steps that are outlined on the poster affixed to the inside door of every locker on campus:

Go online: myPortal.macewan.ca

- 1. Click Quick Link: Locker Registration
- 2. Complete all fields for your specific locker number
- Make the payment with a credit card for the duration of time you are enrolled in classes

Important tips:

- Do not leave your registered locker without a lock at any time. If you remove your lock, the locker is considered vacated & it will immediately become available for another student to register.
- Without full payment, a locker is not considered registered. Therefore, locks
 may be cut without notice and items are in jeopardy of being disposed of.
- Items left in unregistered or expired lockers will be discarded after 14 days.
- MacEwan University is not responsible for items stored in lockers.

MACEWAN UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE

While enrolled at MacEwan University, you have access to coordinated, comprehensive, team-based health care at the MacEwan University Health Centre. Services at this facility include, but are not limited to, disease prevention, health promotion, mental health services, acute and chronic care needs.

This clinic is based on the innovative "Medical Home" model, which gives our student and staff community one-stop access to a spectrum of healthcare professionals. This includes doctors, primary care nurses, mental health professionals, dieticians and kinesiologists. The clinic does not routinely accept walk-ins, so a scheduled appointment is required. Still, all reasonable efforts are made to accommodate urgent concerns on a same-day basis with one of the physicians or allied health staff.
