Early Years Foundation Stage (Nursery and Reception)

DEAR PARENTS & CARERS.

Asalaam Alykoum, Dear Parents and carers.

We were very busy this term. We had our local library and supermarket visit. Children in nursery and reception baked biscuits and learnt about the ingredient's and measurements. Reception children went for mini beasts hunting linking with our topic the very Hungry caterpillar. Nursery children went to collect twigs from our local environment to build nests linking to our topic book Owl babies. Children learn best through first hand experience and going out into the local environment enables children to explore and experience the different features found locally to them. These experiences enable children to develop a deeper comprehension of the Understanding the world.







NURSERY

We did science experiment in the nursery observing how properties of water change from solid to liquid. Children observed ice melting into water and learned how water can change into ice and reverse. We linked our experiment with our topic book 'blue penguin".

Children made different sizes of nests by counting twigs linking to our topic book 'owl babies'.

Primary

Year 1 - RAF Museum:

Year 1 had a fun day at the RAF Museum. The focus of the day was 'Magnificent materials and their properties'.



Year 6 - Maritime Museum:

As part of their topic 'Frozen Kingdom' this halfterm, year 6 visited the National Maritime Museum, Greenwich and went on an epic adventure with Tom Crean, hero of three trips to Antarctica. Next, they explored the Museum's new Polar Worlds gallery to discover how famous explorers including Scott and Shackleton explored the Antarctic and battled to survive. The children were then given a unique opportunity to develop their imagination and historical enquiry skills with the aid of the museum's unique archives. Overall, year 6, staff and parent volunteers thoroughly enjoyed the trip!



Year 4 - British Library:

Year 4 visited 'The British Library' and took part in the workshop 'Marvellous and Mischievous' which featured over 50 books, manuscripts and original artwork. The children were able to see the original manuscript of Roald Dahl's and original illustration of Quentin Blake's for Matilda. The exhibitions also included characters such as Tracy Beaker, Pippi Long Stocking, Jane Eyre, Dirty Bertie, Billy from Billy and the Beast as well as Matilda. This workshop allowed children to discover and learn in depth about their favourite characters, as well as giving them the opportunity to meet new ones.

Alan Senitt Seminar 2: 22nd January 2020

Year 10 pupils visited Caterham High School to develop their Marketing and Publicity skills as part of their projects in Seminar 2 of the Alan Senitt Leadership programme.

School Council project: Sufra Food Collection—January 2020

BHA pupils participated in a food bank collection scheme, a School Council project, led by Ms Iffah. Food collection bins were located inside school gates from 15th-29th January to collect money for the Sufra Food bank in North London.

History trip: Holocaust Memorial Event — 24th January 2020

Year 9 & 11 pupils visited Hasmonean School to commemorate the Holocaust Memorial Day as part of the History curriculum. Pupils heard from keynote speaker Mr Derek Noiman—Grandfather of a SS Commander of a Concentration Camp and partook in workshops to raise awareness of life in Nazi Germany.

Citizenship trip: National Court of Justice — 30th January 2020

Year 7 & 8 Pupils visited the Royal Courts of Justice to gain an insight into their study of Crime Studies. Pupils played Prosecutor, judge and jury to a historic court case centred around Cyberbullying and harassment.

National Careers Assembly - 3rd February 2020

Year 9,10 & 11 pupils took part in the 'Big Assembly' a live interactive webinar on the 3rd February to celebrate National Apprenticeship week. Pupils were provided an insight into the variety of Apprenticeships available across UK industries from year 11 onward.

PE Trip: Alexandra Palace—4th January 2020

Year 10 & 11 pupils practiced their agility, balance and co-ordination during a trip to the celebrated ice-rink at Alexandra Palace. The trip, led by Ms Teodora, aimed to provide a taster of the strenuous skills rand abilities required in the International sport of Ice-Skating.

English trip: National Storytelling week trip—6th February 2020

Year 7 & 8 pupils visited the Apple shop—Westfield as part of the National celebration of creative storytelling. Pupils engaged in an Interactive Storytelling workshop, creating a perspective on a Shakespearean character through the use of digital tools. Pupils employed film-making and editing techniques to emphasise their stories which were screened in the trip Finale!
